Subject: Redistricting

The Census is conducted every ten years and that information is used in redrawing the legislative districts from Congressional to Aldermanic districts. According to the census, the City's population is 25,666 which is a decrease in population. Previously, Census data was released in March; however, with the Covid pandemic, the data was not released until August 16, 2021. This does not allow the committee a lot of time to complete redistricting of the City Aldermanic Districts. The city currently has 11 Aldermanic districts.

The state redistricting requirements for creating wards are equal population as possible and minority protection. Ward population ranges between 600 to 2,100

Traditional redistricting principles are compact as possible, be as contiguous as possible, preservation of communities of interest, preservation of the unity of political subdivisions and make good faith effort to accommodate the tentative county supervisory district plan; however, these are not required.

When adjusting the lines, they must reflect the change in population, changes in minority population, changes in municipal boundaries and aldermanic districts populations need to be as close as possible.
