

**CITY OF STEVENS POINT
POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION MINUTES
MEETING OF MARCH 1, 2022**

1. **Roll Call:** Commissioners Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski and Taylor
Commissioner Kirschling, excused

Also Present: Fire Chief Finn, Police Chief Zenner, Alderperson Mary Kneebone, AC Moody, AC Gemza, Lt. Joe Johnson

2. **Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Taylor to approve the February 1, 2022 minutes.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

3. **Confirmation of bills**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to approve the confirmation of the February 2022 bills.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

4. **Presentation by Lt. Joe Johnson on Use of Force**

Lt. Joe Johnson briefed the commission on use of force reporting within the police department, as follows:

As law enforcement officers we often encounter people in a wide variety of situations. Many of the encounters are basic, ordinary contacts. Other contacts require law enforcement to exert control over people by giving verbal orders, directing their movements or taking them into custody.

Even some of the best, most skilled officers do not always get voluntary compliance. There are times when officers have to use physical force to achieve control and accomplish their legitimate law enforcement objective.

In Wisconsin most law enforcement agencies train Defense and Arrest Tactics, also known as DAAT, which is a "system of verbalization skills coupled with physical alternatives."

A Use of force by definition, "amount of effort required by police to compel compliance by an unwilling subject."

Limitations on use of force:

- The U.S. Constitution
- Wisconsin Law
- Agency Policy
- Officer training

When can officers use force?

- To achieve and maintain control of resistive subjects
- To detain a person reasonably suspect of criminal behavior
- To make a lawful arrest
- To defend themselves or others
- To prevent escape

Law enforcement officers cannot use force to punish, to retaliate against someone who has angered or offended the officer, to teach them a lesson or to show someone who is boss. The purpose of law enforcement officers use of force is to control.

How do we report?

- Officers complete a use of force form which is accompanied by a detailed officer's report.

Reviews are completed by use of force lead (Lt. Joe Johnson)

- Use of force with injury for officer or subject
- Excessive use of force
- Citizen complaints
- Property damage in some cases

5. Approval of Cody Stankowski to regular police officer status

Commissioner Taylor moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to approve Cody Stankowski to regular police officer status.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

6. Police Chiefs Report

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Note of Interest:

- Officer Stacy Morton has completed Step 2 of the field training process. She is currently in Step 3 assigned to Officer Kristi Ahrens. Officer Morton is progressing to expectations.
- Officer Radsek, along with Salvation Army representatives, conducted a check of homeless people in the downtown area. No one located.
- Several interviews conducted by Administrative Lt Joe Johnson. Interviews entailed mental health, crime prevention, National Missing Person's Day, and drug testing strips.
- Department squad changeover has now been completed after lengthy delays.
- Department has received another resignation from a crossing guard. We are currently exploring different options in effort to maintain coverage. An ongoing recruitment has not been successful.
- The Department held the Recognition Banquet on February 2nd. The Banquet honors the hard work of our Auxiliary Officers and citizens who were issued a recognition coin during

the past year. The Banquet was a success and Auxiliary Officer Fred Strasser again won the award for most hours volunteered. Congratulations Fred!

Calls of Interest:

- **02/05/2022 – Suspicious Vehicle – Fleet Farm Gas Mart** – Suspicious vehicle reported driving around the gas station for approximately twenty minutes. Vehicle left while officers were in route but they forgot to turn their headlights on. Traffic stop conducted and odor of marijuana smelled by officers. Officers conducted search of vehicle that resulted in the seizure of 289.98 grams of marijuana, scales, cash and a handgun. Suspects in jail.
- **02/05/2022 – Agency Assist – Plover PD Pursuit** – Plover attempted stop on a truck which fled from officer. During pursuit, the truck stopped and occupants all fled on foot in different directions. Plover K9 tracked the driver to an address on Fawn Lane. K9 Barry tracked passengers and male suspect gave himself up when he heard Barry bark, concerned that he would be bit. All suspects located and it was determined they had been breaking into storage units all day.
- **02/06/2022 – Traffic Stop – Pursuit** – Officer attempted a traffic stop on vehicle failing to stop for a stop sign. Vehicle fled, no pursuit as vehicle sped off and turned off lights. Area searched and vehicle located where it again fled. Again pursuit was terminated. Area continued to be checked and vehicle was again located behind Kent's towing. Officer exited his squad to approach and the suspect again fled, striking officer, who received minor injuries. Pursuit was initiated. Officer used the PIT technique and vehicle went into snowbank. 17 year old male driver was arrested for OWI (mushrooms and THC) felony fleeing, endangering safety, possession drugs, and numerous traffic citations
- **02/09/2022 – Missing Person – YMCA** – Male subject with cognitive disabilities reported missing from the YMCA. Numerous locations checked but officers unable to locate the male. Multiple alerts sent out to local agencies and the community. Male was later located at Saint Michael's Hospital. He had gone to the fifth floor and entered a room undetected.
- **02/13/2022 – Fatal Crash – Country Club Drive/Kirschling Court** – Officers responded to one vehicle crash with possible ejection. Male driver was ejected from vehicle and was deceased upon officer arrival. Uninjured female passenger was still seat belted in the passenger seat. Portage County Sheriff's Office took over investigation as accident ended in their jurisdiction
- **02/17/2022 – Disturbance/Pursuit – Zenoff Park** - Officers responded to a call of a male aiming a crossbow at a female and blocking her from leaving the park. Female did provide a registration plate number before becoming uncooperative with follow-up information. Vehicle was leaving as officer arrived. Suspect vehicle fled at high speeds as officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop. Suspect then increased speed to 60+mph and running stop signs in residential neighborhood. Pursuit was terminated. Another complaint a short time later of the suspect vehicle speeding on West side of the city. Vehicle was later located unoccupied. Vehicle was towed and inventoried. Male driver later located and arrested. Had purchased a crossbow the night before.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 7 (11)

- 1/27/22 – Officers were attempting to reason with a man who had created a disturbance at a hotel. The suspect was unwilling to leave the hotel and kept slamming the door in the officer's face. The officers made entry into the room where the man resisted their efforts. Officers gave the suspect commands while he was on the ground, which the suspect did not follow. One SPPD officer deployed his taser, striking the

suspect on his left side. The suspect removed a probe, making the taser ineffective. The man was taken into custody. No injuries.

- 1/27/22 – SPPD Officers were investigating an attempted burglary to a building in town. Two suspects had fled the area after being observed by a reporting witness. Officers located the suspects hiding in the woods. The female suspect had her hands in her pockets and when officers gave her commands to show her hands, one officer had his gun drawn. Both suspects were taken into custody without incident. No injuries.
- 1-30-22 – Officers were investigating a disturbance where a juvenile female had broken glass, destroyed a house and attempted to assault her mother. The suspect tried walking past an officer by physically trying to move the officer out of the way. Officers lowered the suspect to the ground where they tried to handcuff the suspect. The suspect bit an officer in the leg. The bite caused minor pain. The suspect was then handcuffed without incident. The suspect was not injured.
- 2-2-22 – SPPD Detectives were conducting a search warrant on a residence. Upon entry into the residence, the officers had their guns drawn. When they confronted a suspect, he failed to listen to commands and was taken down onto a couch, where he was taken into custody without incident or injury.
- 2-6-22 – Officers were pursuing a vehicle that had fled during a traffic stop. The suspect vehicle had struck an officer with the side mirror during the pursuit. An Officer was able to perform a P.I.T maneuver on the suspect vehicle, disabling it in a snow bank. Officers exited their squad cars and pointed their weapons at the suspects. K9 Fala was also on leash in an active display. The suspect was taken into custody without further incident.
- 2-10-22 – Officers were attempting to stop a fleeing suspect from a domestic abuse incident. The suspect had just struck the victim with her car. As the vehicle came to a stop, the suspect got out of their car quickly and walked toward officers. The officer had his weapon drawn, but not pointed at the suspect. The suspect followed officer commands and the officer holstered his weapon. As the officers were trying to handcuff the suspect, she began to pull away and scream. The officers had to apply pressure to the suspect's wrists to gain compliance. Once the suspect was in handcuffs, she claimed her shoulder was injured.
- 2-15-22 – SPPD Detectives and Officers conducted a drug warrant on a residence. The officers who entered the residence had their guns drawn. Suspects were encountered and taken into custody without incident or injury.

 - One Emergency Commitments
 - Five Voluntary Commitments
 - One completed suicide

- Lead Officer Joe Clark attending "Dare to be Great Leadership" training.
- Officer Al Raasoch and Officer Kristi Ahrens attending Advanced Crisis Intervention Training.
- Lead Officer Robert Roser, DAAT instructor for the Department, attending training identified as "Legally Justified but Avoidable"

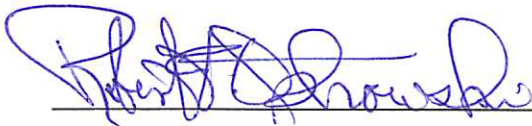

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Note of Interest:

- Motorola/Spillman Records Management System (RMS) went live on Jan. 25th and is going well with some minor issues, which is expected.
- Officer Stacy Morton has completed Step 3 of the field training process. She is currently in Shadow Phase assigned to Officer Alex Beach. Ofc Morton is progressing to expectations and is expected to be on solo patrol April 7th assigned to nights with Lt. Bean.
- Lt. Johnson presented Use of Force to the PFC.
- Lt. Johnson presented Run, Hide, Fight to Holy Spirit March 15, 2022. (30-45 present)
- Ofc. Radsek completed a tour of the PD for a special program that assists cognitively disabled adults with getting jobs post High School.
- Lt. Johnson presented to current and future students planning on living off campus next year about parking and good neighbors/issues associated with this. (25 present)
- Ofc. Lee and Lt. Johnson participated in First Responder Career Day put on by Jefferson School.
- Lt. Johnson and Ofc. Yang participated in career fair at UW-Platteville.
- A couple Pizza Parties for the local Safety Cadets for their hard work and leadership. (approx. 70 cadets and 3 advisors)
- Chief Zenner has announced his retirement date as May 2, 2022.

Calls of Interest:

- **03/01/22 – Welfare Check – Fire – 1220 2nd St.** – Male subject started a blanket and clothing on fire by careless use of a cigarette, male left apt. with smoldering pile. Downstairs business called in fire, male was later located and due to mental health issues was placed on a Chp. 51.
- **03/09/22 – Traffic Stop – Drugs** – Officer stopped a vehicle and PTO K9 Indy alerted on the vehicle. Female passenger was arrested for possession of meth, marijuana, poss. of para. poss. of prescription meds with out prescription and 3 counts of bail jumping. In jail.

- **03/10/22 – Welfare Check – Days Inn** – Officers were called to Days Inn for male passed out in his vehicle. Male was later arrested for possession of marijuana, fentanyl, meth and several active warrants.
- **03/10/22 – Welfare Check – 200 Block of Division St** – Officer on patrol came upon a male subject laying the road, turns out he was highly intoxicated and his friends had placed him into the back of a pickup truck as they left the bar but did not close the tailgate. As the intoxicated driver left the bar the highly intoxicated male in the back fell out onto the road. Male in road was transported to hospital with minor injuries. Male driver was located and arrested for OWI causing Injury.
- **03/18/22 – Medical Assist – Frontenac Ave.** – Female there was pulseless and not breathing, Officers arrived and started CPR, narcan given along with glucose from Medics, female came to and was transferred to Wausau. Believed to be an opiate overdose. IB following up.
- **03/19/22 – Welfare Check – Goodwill** – Report of a female passed out in vehicle. Female contacted and after investigation was arrested for 8th Offense OWI Drug related numerous prescription meds found in car.
- **03/21/22 – Overdose – 2100 Block Madison St** – Subjects were loading a female into a vehicle to drive her to St. Mike's as she had overdosed. Vehicle was intercepted by officers and female was administered 2 doses of Narcan as she was wheeled into the Hospital. Other officers responded to the residence to hold the house as evidence. Search warrant obtained, house searched.
- **03/23/2022 – Domestic – 2800 block Henrietta St.** – Report of a domestic. When Officers arrived victim exited and stated the suspect was possibly armed, intoxicated and would shoot police if they came in. SWAT/Negotiators activated and it was determined the suspect had left on foot prior to perimeter being set up. K9 Barry deployed and was instrumental in tracking suspect to where he was apprehended within 1 hour 20 minutes without incident. (UWSP/PTSO/Plover PD assisted)
- **03/27/22 – Disturbance/Gun Call – John's Dr** – Female called stating a neighbor had pulled out a gun, cocked it and threatened to shoot her dog and children if the dog ever attacked his family again. Male subject identified and was uncooperative during phone conversations. Investigation continuing.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 8 (19)

- **2/28/22** – Officers were dispatched to a residence where there was a man threatening the caller with a gun if she did not let them in the residence. Officers arrived and encountered two males in the garage. The officer drew their firearms and pointed them at the suspects who complied with their orders and were taken into custody. No injuries, no damage to property.
- **3/1/22** – Detectives and Officers conducted a search warrant on a residence looking for narcotics. During the warrant officers had out their patrol weapons and pointed them in the direction of people who were taken into custody inside the residence. No injuries.
- **3/11/22** – Detectives and Officers were attempting to take a subject into custody who was suspected of shooting a building with a 9mm. Due to the threat of the subject having a

weapon, Officers pointed their duty weapons at the subject during a traffic stop. The subject was taken into custody without incident. No injury or property damage.

- **3/13/22** – Officer was attempting to stop a vehicle driving recklessly. The vehicle failed to pull over right away and drove into a parking lot and continued past open stopping points. Eventually the vehicle came to a stop. Due to the unknown status of the driver, dark tinted rear windows and the unusual driving behavior, the Officer pointed their duty weapon at the driver and issued commands to the driver to exit the vehicle. The driver came out of the vehicle and was taken into custody without incident, later being arrested for OWI. No injuries.
- **03/15/22** – Officers responded to a report of a male yelling, swearing, screaming and throwing things. Contact made with male who was uncooperative and resisted officers during contact. Male was directed to the ground where he was handcuffed, male subject ended up with 2 broken fingers, 2 officers were also injured in the scuffle. Male charged with DC and Felony resisting arrest. A Use of Force review was completed and it was found the officers were within policy and procedure during the incident.
- **3/22/22** – Detectives and Officers executed a search warrant at a residence for narcotics. During the execution of the warrant officers pointed their guns at people inside the residence. All individuals inside the residence were taken into custody without incident.
- **3/25/22** – Officer was called to the scene of an unwanted person. Once the Officer arrived, the subject jogged away, failing to listen to commands. The Officer was able to catch up with the subject and escort the subject off the road. Once on the sidewalk the subject was taken to the ground, where the subject was handcuffed without injury.
- **3/26/22** – During a traffic stop the driver, who was suspected of drinking and violating bond conditions, refused to get out of his vehicle. Through an extended period where officers tried to reason with the subject, no resolution was met and the subject refused to get out and advised Officers he would flee if they tried to get him out. At the appropriate time, the Officers were able to unlock the car doors and grab both the subject's arms and take off his seatbelt. The subject was then pulled from the car and taken into custody without incident or injury.

- **3/18/2022** – LO Lee and Fala assisted Plover PD with a traffic stop. K9 Fala sniffed the front seam of the driver's door and sat, providing a positive indication on the vehicle. Marijuana and fentanyl located on driver.
- **03/25/2022** - Sgt. Ballew and Barry assisted Lt. Bean with a traffic stop. K9 Barry sniffed the passenger door and stuck his head near the open window. K9 Barry came to a final

response and 30.57g of methamphetamine, 31.44g marijuana and .56g of heroin was located in the vehicle. (hidden compartment)

- Det Sgt. John Lawrynk attended the WI DOJ First Line Supervisor School Mar. 28th – April 1st.
- Assistant Chief Kussow continues his command college with a graduation date of June 10, 2022.
