POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION MINUTES
MEETING OF JUNE 7, 2022**

1. **Roll Call:** Commissioners Kirschling, Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski, Taylor

Also Present: Fire Chief Moody, Police AC Rottier, Police AC Williams, Alderperson Mary Kneebone, Brandi Makuski– Point/Plover Metro Wire

2. **Presidents Report**

President Moore thanked the streets department for patching the Police Department parking lot. President Moore stated the commission will start using Zoom Meetings again.

3. **Confirmation of bills**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling to approve the confirmation of the April 2022 bills.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

4. **Discussion, with possible action, Posting of the Division Chief and Battalion Chief Positions**

Positions for Division Chief – Fire Marshal, and Battalion Chiefs were posted on June 1st. A Chief's Assessment Center for both positions will be held in July. Finalists will be presented at the August Police and Fire Commission Meeting.

5. **Discussion, with possible action, Authorization to hire 2 police officers**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Taylor to extend a conditional offer of employment to Jason Dienger and Samuel Hessel upon the successful completion of all hiring protocols and testing.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

6. **Discussion, with possible action, Station #1 Building Updates**

Chief Moody discussed following was discussed in relation to Station 1.

- The HVAC system at Station 1 has been in use beyond it's lifespan.
- A study is being conducted on the system to determine specific needs.
- Bids are being gathered from air conditioner vendors to determine replacement costs.
- The parking lots at Station 1 and 2 will be replaced later this year using funds allocated in 2020. Costs for the project have doubled since then due to lingering affects from the pandemic.
- Proposed Capital Improvements for 2023 include replacing the apparatus bay flooring and repainting walls.
- Currently, the apparatus bay does not meet standards for space, but Truck 1 and an ambulance will be moved to the Training Site in 2024.

7. Police Chief's Report

Assistant Chief Rottier reported:

Note of Interest:

- Completed backgrounds on 3 applicants. We are looking to hire two from this list. Assistant Chief Rottier will be looking for PFC's approval on 6-7-2022.
- Assistant Chief Williams was sworn in on May 3, 2022.
- May 16th I asked Lt. Johnson to put something out to the public about heavy traffic enforcement in the future with the Click it or Ticket and speed grants. In 1.5 days they created a commercial with the help of City Media. Incredible job
- Lt. Johnson had a table for SPPD and spent 4 hours at The Boys and Girls Club Job Fair. The audience was teens looking for summer jobs and future career choices.
- May 13th Lt. Johnson took the top 78 Safety Cadets and 6 advisors from the Stevens Point Elementary Schools to the Wisconsin Dells on May 13th. Each cadet and advisor was given a t-shirt we had made at Mada and was sponsored by local businesses and Unions. The trip was a reward for them for leading the way for their schools and being good role models. The trip went very well.
- Lt. Johnson, Ofc. Schultz and Ofc. Radsek all assisted St. Paul School with their active shooter drill.
- Lt. Johnson gave and 1.5 hr presentation to residents of the Berkshire Retirement Complex. Topics discussed were, what to do in case of an emergency, appropriate use of 911, preparedness in case of an emergency, and several types of Scam were discussed. The Wisconsin Senior Guide was handed out to all participants.
- Assistant Chief Williams has been accepted to 2021-2022 Command College.

Calls of Interest:

- **05/04/22 – Traffic Stop – Pursuit** – Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for speeding. Vehicle fled officer at over 60 mph. Officer terminated and vehicle was not found.
- **05/05/22 – Welfare Check** – Male subject Facebook live streamed himself taking a bunch of pills. He then walked to the Patch St disc golf course where he changed his mind about wanting to die and called 911. He was located and transported to saint Michael's Hospital.
- **05/06/22 – Follow Up – SPASH Alternative** – Vaping complaint from the bus driver the previous day turned into an arrest for drug and drug paraphernalia. Officers arrived and interviewed 4 kids involved. One 17yo male was uncooperative, marijuana, \$700 cash and what is believed to be LSD gel tabs located in his backpack. Resisted arrest, and was carried out to squad car by 4 officers. In Jail.
- **05/06/22 – Disturbance – Late Night Transit Bus** – Bus driver called stating a drunk college kid had tried kicking him. Officers responded found 2 kids trying to flee but got slowed up by the fence by SPASH. Taken into custody
- **05/06/22 – Disturbance – Icon Bar** – Fight inside the bar spilled out into street. Female had been struck in the face with beer bottle, friends and family assisted in gettin her out of downtown. Suspected female was located and cited and also removed from the area.
- **05/07/22 – Suspicious Vehicle – Dixon@Fremont** – Report of teens shooting a BB gun at a person walking. UW-PD stopped the vehicle SPPD took over investigation, several teens in the car several citations issued and parents notified.
- **05/08/22 – Welfare Check – Second St North** – Male subject threatening suicide and then was being physically restrained by his father. Chpt. 51 approved by GBC.

- **05/09/22 – Disturbance – Econo Lodge** – Male party called 911 reporting female was going to stab him during their ongoing argument. Parties were separated. Male caller had a warrant out of MI and another male roommate also had a warrant out of MI. both in jail. Report on disturbance.
- **05/13/22 – Disturbance – Frank&Ernies** – Male arguing with bar tender got upset and pulled out a hand held taser and sparked it. Male was located and arrested for DC and poss. of an electronic weapon.
- **05/14/22 – Burglary – 4412 First St** – House under construction, side door was kicked in Dewalt tools taken, itmes were located in woods nearby while Officers cavassed area. Also located were numerous other vehicles that had been rummaged through, and a couple garages. Investigtion continuing.
- **05/17/22 – Suspicious Male – 3rd@Water St** – Report of a male in the river, officers arrived and he was out of water, located as he came out of an alley way and went after Officer still in squad. He was taken into custody and arrested for, DC, resisting, misd. Bail-jumping x2, felony bail-jumping x2, in jail.
- **05/18/22 – Disturbance – The Cabin/Aspirus Hosptial** - Male presented at Aspirus with a large laceration to his chest, approx 20cm cut needed 26 stitches to close. Male suspect was only ID'ed. Investigation conintuing.
- **05/25/22 – Suspicious – Hardee's South** – Caller believed his truck had been shot as he pulled into Hardee's lot. Rear truck topper window shattered, hole in front window of truck topper and shattering the rear truck cab window. No projectile located, vehicle searched and area cameras chekced.
- **05/27/22 – Stabbing – 1900 Blk Water St** – Male and female were in an argument when the female it would appear grabbed a knife and stabbed the male twice, once in the arm and once in the stomach. She was arrested and in jail. Detectives called in to assist, investigaiton continuing.
- **05/30/22 – Threats – 900 Blk 5th Ave** – Female called reporting she was still getting calls from male party who was not to have contact, and now he was threatening to come over and shoot her and then himself. Investigaiton continuing.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 3 (28)

- **5-6-22** – SPPD Officers were searching a subject's backpack, who was suspected of selling drugs. The subject became verbally resistive and when officers advised the subject to sit down he refused. The subject was taken control of by the officers, but refused to put his hands behind his back and the officers were forced to take the subject to the ground. On the ground the subject continued to resist, forcing officers to use pressure on the subject's wrists, which allowed them to get handcuffs on the subject. No injuries.
- **5-13-22** – Officers were attempting to arrest ad individual who was intoxicated and was concealing an electric weapon. The suspect was verbally resistive. Once officers tried to handcuff him the suspect pulled one hand free and tensed up. The officers were able to get the suspect's hand behind his back again handcuff him. At this time the suspect stopped on an officer's foot. In order to keep the suspect from stomping on the officer's foot again, a knee strike was delivered to the suspect's leg, stopping the suspect. No injuries to the officer or the suspect.

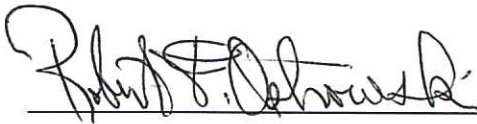

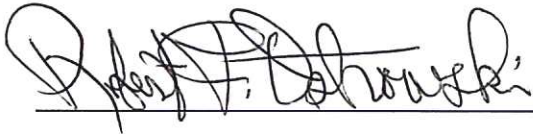

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Note of Interest:

- Assistant Chief Williams' first week of Command College will be August 2022.
- June 7, 2022 – Lt. Johnson and Det. Yenter presented ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) to Portage County Boys and Girls Staff.
- June 9, 2022 – Arrest of suspect in slashing case downtown from 5-19-2022.
- June 9, 2022 – Warrant on Church St. resulted in meth and money.
- June 15, 2022 – Donated approx. 55 unclaimed bicycles to Working Bikes in Chicago, IL. (nonprofit group that works with the community, fixing, training mechanics and donating bikes around their city and several other cities)
- June 20, 2022 Ben Uitenbroek was promoted to Lieutenant, assigned to Operations, and Justin Klein was promoted to Sergeant, assigned to the Patrol Division.
- June 20, 2022 – Ordinance passes council for 25grams of THC for \$5.00.
- June 21, 2022 – recruitment video completed for joint SWAT team training.
- June 22, 2022 Officer Kevin Gomez was selected to fill immediate vacancy on the SPPD SWAT team and Officer Ross Wierzbka was selected to start in Jan. 2023.
- June 23, 2022 – recruitment video for citizen's academy completed.
- June 26, 2022 – Roe vs Wade protest downtown to court house - Asst. Chief Williams came in to assist patrol. No issues
- June 27, 2022 – New CSO, Michelle Klepps – 10am to 2pm shift.
- June 27, 2022 Jason Dienger was sworn-in as the newest member of the SPPD. Jason came with 4 years law enforcement experience.

Calls of Interest:

- **06/02/22 – Overdose Death – 2601 Indiana Ave** – Male party called in an overdose of a 27 year old female. Detectives called in to assist. Large amount of marijuana located, along with cocaine, and other drugs and \$6,000.00 in cash. Male party in jail on P&P hold. Investigation continuing.

06/03/22 – Disturbance – 601 John's Dr – Male caller stating another male was at his apartment and he was not allowed to be and possibly had a gun. Owner gave consent to enter, Officers used a SWAT Shield and called the unwanted male out of apartment without incident, no gun found.

06/10/22 – Shooting – 1400 Fourth Ave – Dispatch received a 911 text to call from someone who stated they had shot their GF and was going to shoot himself. Multi-agency response to the area. Lots of very quick investigating done and soon determined to be a SWATTING call.

06/10/22 – Domestic – 400 block 1st St. – Previously reported Domestic, male suspect was taken into custody, for criminal damage to property, strangulation, substantial battery, felon in possession of a firearm x2, threats to injure, OWI – 5th, intimidation of a victim, bail jumping, and criminal OAR. In Jail.

06/14/22 – Welfare Check – Southpoint Restaurant – Caller stated a male subject entered the restaurant and had a lighter and he the caller thought the male had dumped lighter fluid on himself. Male was located after leaving restaurant and spoken too, not suicidal and misinformation.

06/14/22 – Domestic – 725 John's Dr - Female had fled her apartment and went to neighbors to call for help and her newly arrived male friend had been assaulting her. Male would not answer door. Permission given from female as male had no rights to be there. Perimeter set and K9 called to assist, but male stepped out back door as was arrested without incident.

06/16/22 – Disturbance – 2700 Block Bush St – Emergency tones dispatched for a male party chasing a female with a gun. Numerous Officers arrived to discover the female caller was clearly under the influence of drugs and hallucinating. Investigation determined there was no gun and male was cooperative and not under the influence or anything. Female arrested on a P&P hold.

06/21/22 – Overdose – 324 2nd St – Report of a male who was unresponsive and not breathing. Officers arrived with med units, prior overdose issues at residence, subject was transported via ambulance and woke up after Narcan was administered.

06/22/22 – Fire – 825 Bliss Ave – Active fire with resident still inside, Officers, firefighters and citizens attempted in extrating the female through a window, but due to females condition and fully engulfed fire their efforts were not successful. Detectives and DCI called in to assist.

06/23/22 – Death – 3200 Block Marth's Ln – Detectives called in to assist with the investigation of the death of a 3 month old.

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 4 (32)

- **6-3-22** – Officers were granted permission to search an apartment for an individual who had made mention of owning a firearm, was trespassing and also was wanted on a DOC warrant. Officers opened the exterior door and made verbal contact with the suspect. Due to the unknowns, two officers had their weapons drawn on the suspect. The suspect listened to their commands and was taken into custody without incident. No injuries
- **6-7-22** – Officers were attempting to clear a residence that had forced entry to an exterior door. Once inside officer's located a locked interior door that appeared to move. Officers were able to open the door and make contact with the suspect. One officer had his weapon drawn and pointed at the suspect. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and jailed for criminal trespass. No injuries
- **6-10-22** – Officers received information an individual had been shot and the suspect was now threatening suicide. Officers surrounded the house and it was determined who the resident was. The information received was also determined to likely be false and considered a "Swatting" call. The resident came out of the house and officers had their weapons pointed at the resident, due to unknown information. No one was found to be injured and the resident was unaware of what was going on. No injuries.
