POLICE AND FIRE COMMISSION MINUTES
MEETING OF AUGUST 10, 2022**

1. **Roll Call:** Commissioners Kirschling, Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski, Taylor

2. **Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling to approve the Minutes of the July 5, 2022 meeting.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

3. **Confirmation of bills**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to approve the confirmation of the July 2022 bills.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

4. **Approval of Cole O'Neil to regular police officer status**

Commissioner Taylor moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling to approve Cole O'Neil to regular police officer status effective August 22, 2022.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

5. **Police Chief's Report**

Notes of Interest:

(DC is short for disorderly conduct)

- 7-5-2022 - Lt Johnson completed a two-hour presentation at the Portage County Crisis Center. The presentation focused on Run, Hide, Fight and Active Shooter Incidents. Attendees were County employees with CAP Services or Crisis Centers from three different Counties.
- 7-11-22 – Officer Samuel Hessel was sworn in as newest Officer. (279th)
- 7-7-22 – PD tour of Gamber Johnson Headquarters
- 7-12-22 – Lt. Johnson, Asst. Chief Rottier, Asst. Chief Williams, Lead Officer Lee, CSO Gaboda and myself attended lights of Christmas fundraiser at Pizza Ranch. The event was to raise money, to be used around Christmas time to purchase gift cards for people in need. (\$1900 raised/last year \$1676.37)
- 7-12-22 Det. Klein (Sgt.) made an arrest, after a lengthy investigation, of two males in the overdose death of a pregnant female. A search warrant resulted in 55.74g of Fentanyl,

29.40g of Crack/Cocaine, 8.93g of Methamphetamine, 5.27g of Marijuana laced with Methamphetamine, 5 hits of LSD and 2 firearms/ammunition.

- On 7-13-22, Laron C. Thomas (5/30/1987) and Isaiah N. Solis (5/17/1999) have each been charged with two counts of first-degree reckless homicide for the death of the 27-year-old victim and the unborn child. Both are currently in jail on other charges and have been informed of these new charges.
- 7-13-22 – Chiefs met with Downtown Business Alliance Reps. Regarding homeless situation.
- 7-22-22 – Asst. Chief Williams and Chief Kussow attended Mid-State Tech site dedication to AMETA(advanced manufacturing, engineering technology and apprenticeship)
- 7-28-22 – Officer Radsek assisted the Salvation Army with their bi-annual homeless population count. Each homeless located were give a bag with resources for them, along with a lunch. (10 identified)
- 7-28-22 – Lee Ann, Records Bureau Supervisor, celebrated her 28th year at the Police Department.

Calls of Interest:

07-30-22 Disturbance, Graffiti's male was intoxicated and caused a disturbance. The male was arrested on misdemeanor bail jumping.

07-29-22, Disturbance with firearm, female reported a male **threatened her with a gun** during an argument. Male had made threats to shoot everyone in the house. Male was arrested for threats to injury and Domestic D.C. Ruger LCP .380 seized.

07-26-22, Lewd and Lascivious, Iverson Park male who exposed his genitals and began touching himself. The male suspect was arrested and jailed on PO hold

07-23-22 Fight, Icon nightclub, during a physical altercation between males.

07-23-22, Report of Male who pulled a gun, Bukolt Park, officers responded to report of male who pulled a gun to learn a male did display (what was later determined to be an air pistol) during a road rage incident. The male with the gun did threaten to shoot the caller from the other vehicle. The male was taken into custody during a high-risk stop. The male suspect was arrested for Threats to injury, DC and facsimile weapon.

07-23-22 Med/PNB 3 month old, 3200 block of Church St. CPR attempted by officers and medics to no avail. I.B and Medical Examiner responded.

07-22-22 Disturbance involving a firearm, initial report of a male who pointed a gun at another male. Further investigation found one of the males ran up to a male in his car and started yelling at him at which point the driver **pointed his firearm** at the male as he thought he was going to be robbed.

07-21-22 Disturbance, library tunnel male and female involved in a physical disturbance. Both male and female arrested and taken to jail. A third person somewhat involved was arrested on unrelated warrants.

07-21-22 Overdose- 2100 block of Tamarac for an unresponsive female. Pills located next to her. Med unit Narcaned her. She came back and off to the hospital. After talking to her, appears she smoked some heroin earlier. Report.

07-21-22 Bomb Threat (SWATTING), SPPD Officers along with UWSP responded to UWSP Old Main for report of a bomb in the building. Building evacuated and Officers conducted a sweep of the building finding no suspicious objects. Likely, an internet hoax similar occurrences at other

University this month.

07-19-2022 Assist ATF, SPPD officers assisted AFT seize \$20,000 in funds from Shell Gas Station on Stanley St. Concerns also brought up that it is a Felony for Class A liquor License. Establishment to have video gambling machines. Matter ref. to DA for consideration.

07-18-22 Possible Felony in Possession of Firearm, Officers acted on a tip a male Felon may be in possession of a firearm at his residence. Act 79 search located an **air pistol, Taser** and ankle monitor, not a firearm.

07-17-22 Walk away from Care Facility, Elderly male was located in caller's garage. Upon further investigation, the male had walked away from local care facility.

07-17-22 Disturbance, 2300 block of Dixon, Male and female argued about not wanting to have sex with each other. The male half struck the female half, which resulted in fresh D.C. Domestic, and P&P hold as male was not to have violent contact with female.

07-16-22 Traffic stop turned 10-80, Female driver failed to stop for Officer during traffic stop traveled at low speed to the Family crisis center. Female taken into custody w/out incident. Female did not believe officer was the real police, possible mental health issue associated.

7-16-22 Dogs fighting, 100 block of N. Forest St. Elderly male with 12 dogs living at the residence, two of which had been fighting with each other. Referral made to Humane Society and Humane Services due to living conditions of filth and dog feces in the house.

07-15-22 Domestic disturbance between Brothers, Blue Top, and Initial call was physical disturbance between brothers who were residing in a camper at the Blue top Motel. One of the brothers had not slept for 7 days. Further investigation resulted in both brothers being arrested to include bail jumping, D.C. Search of the camper located drug paraphernalia.

07-15-22, Foot Chase/Warrant Arrest, Officer observed known wanted male near the Shell gas station who ran from officer for 2 blocks and was taken into custody for resisting, Felony Bail Jumping and other charges

07-15-22, Vehicle pursuit, Stanley and Minnesota Av, Officer observed motorcycle traveling 80mph, which resulted in short chase prior to Officer terminating pursuit. Suspect motorcycle located in nearby woods.

07-14-22 Armed Suicidal male, Officer assisted Plover PD with **suicidal male armed with a rifle and pistol**. Subject eventually surrendered.

07-11-22 Overdose, 81-year-old female took overdose of hydrocodone and found unresponsive. Transported to hospital with chapter 51.

07-11-22 Welfare check, 1400 block of Sixth Officers requested to check welfare of 67-year-old male. Officers located the male who had been deceased for some time.

07-10-22, Possession of Firearm in Tavern, Final Score report of male inside with a concealed handgun. Upon further investigation, male suspect came to Stevens Point to harass his ex. Suspect later arrested for D.C. and going armed while drinking. **Two hand guns located on his person.**

07-09-22 Suicide Attempt 2000 block of Dixon, with car, male intentionally drove his vehicle into the

garage in attempt to kill himself.

07-09-22 Assist PTSO with two males who crashed by Ice Hawks arena and fled on foot. One male tased and taken into custody. K-9 track for second male did not result in locating the suspect.

07-06-22, Welfare check 400 block of Michigan Av, male who was suicidal, male shut the door on officers after making **comment about getting his gun**. Officer forced entry after which the male struggled with officers and taken into protective custody. Chapter 51

07-05-2022, Bike theft investigation 700 block of First, Detective and Patrol were working a bike theft investigation. One of the suspects fled and pursued by officers. While making the arrest the suspect resisted and was tased. Subject taken into custody with multiple charges.

07-02-22, Welfare Check 1430 Torun, report of male with self-inflicted cut. Further investigation found the male was picking at meth scabs and accidentally cut himself. Subject later taken for medical clearance where the suspect was learned to have pinworms, which are highly contactable. Upon medical clearance, male subject taken to jail on warrant.

07-01-22 Disturbance ICON Nightclub, between groups at the bar, a female patron involved became upset with officers and struck one officer bending his glasses. Subject then kicked a squad after have been taken into custody.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 10 (42)

7-2-22 – Officers were dealing with a large disturbance downtown, trying to break up several people from fighting. A female individual who was previously upset tried to get involved with the fight. One officer separated her from the fight and the female had fallen on the ground, but had gotten back up and began flailing her arms. At this time, the officer was struck in the face, near his eye. The officer's glasses were bent and he got a slight cut and swelling near his eye. After the contact with the officer, another officer was able to get control of this female who was handcuffed and arrested.

7-5-22 – Officer had stopped a person of interest who was riding a stolen bicycle. The suspect tried to run after refusing to cooperate, but quickly tripped on a rock and fell on the ground. Officers attempted to keep the suspect on the ground, but he suspect stood up and began flailing their arms. Officers were able to get control of each arm and another officer attempted to deploy a taser, the deployment was ineffective. Officers gained control of the subject who was handcuffed and arrested. No injuries.

7-5-22 – Members from SPPD executed a search warrant on a residence for narcotics and stolen items. While officers cleared the residence, they had their duty weapons out of the holster. All subjects taken into custody without incident and there were no injuries.

7-6-22 – SPPD Officers were dealing with an intoxicated subject who refused to go to the hospital with them after he made comments about killing himself. The subject yelled at the officer and then tried to slam the bedroom door in the officer's face after making mention about getting a gun. One officer pushed the door open and took the subject down, onto his bed, where the subject was handcuffed. The subject cooperated after this. No injuries.

7-7-22 – Members from SPPD executed a search warrant on a residence. While officers cleared the residence, they had their duty weapons out of the holster. All subjects were taken into custody without incident and there were no injuries

7-12-22 – Officers were attempting to take a person into custody on an involuntary mental health hold. The subject refused to get out of the car. Officers were able to get the door open and grab the subject's arm. The subject tried to strike the Officers, but missed. The Officers gained control of the subject by getting them out of the car, subject was then handcuffed. No reported injuries

7-14-22 – A SPPD Officer observed a wanted subject near a Kwik Trip in Stevens Point. The Officer attempted verbal contact with the suspect; however, the suspect ignored the Officer and fled on foot. After a short foot chase, the suspect slowed and stopped. The Officer had removed his Taser and pointed it at the suspect. The suspect refused to cooperate and ran again, stopping after a short distance. Once the suspect stopped this time, the Officer was able to gain control of the subject and take him into custody. No injuries.

7-16-22 – SPPD Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for driving without lights on during hours of darkness. The vehicle failed to stop for the officer and led the officer in a slow speed pursuit towards the west side of town. The suspect eventually pulled into a parking lot and got out of their vehicle. The Officer drew their firearm and the subject complied with the Officer's commands. No injuries.

7-20-22 – SPPD Officers were at a noise complaint and one of the parties involved had refused to turn down the music and was creating a disruption in the neighborhood, which caused the neighbors and their kids to feel unsafe. The suspect refused to cooperate with Officers and when they went to take him into custody, he tensed up and resisted their efforts. The suspect was quickly handcuffed and walked to the car, where he resisted getting into the squad. The suspect was pulled into the squad by his shoulders. No injuries.

7-23-22 – SPPD Officers had received a report that a male had pointed a firearm while seated in his vehicle at another person and then drove away. Officers were able to locate the suspect and conducted a high-risk traffic stop on the suspect. Officers on scene had their weapons drawn and gave verbal commands to the suspect inside the vehicle. The suspect followed the Officer's commands and taken into custody. A BB gun was located with no safety orange on it. No injuries

6. Discussion with possible action, on the use and evaluation of exit interview materials

Commissioner Mrozek reached out to Marshfield, Wausau and Wisconsin Rapids to inquire about their Department exit interview policies. Human Resources handles exit interviews at these departments.

President Moore suggested using the city's policy as a template to create a policy. He asked Commissioner Mrozek to begin this process and provide a draft at next month's meeting. Anyone with suggestions can forward them to Commissioner Mrozek.

7. Discussion of update to the Administrative Procedures of the Police and Fire Commission

The Commission realizes the need to update their policies to ensure compliance with Wisconsin State Statutes. PFC Administrative Procedures contains six sections for review and finalization.

8. Discussion, with possible action, HVAC bids – Fire Department

The Department received two bids; one bid from Badger Heating & Air Conditioning for \$436,092.00 and one bid from Complete Control for \$504,000.00. After extensive review of both bids and conversations with Lt. Kedrowski who is in charge of building and maintenance at Station 1, Chief Moody is recommending having Badger Heating & Air Conditioning perform the work at Station 1.

Commissioner Kirschling moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to approve the bid to Badger Heating & Air Conditioning.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

9. Recommendations for filling both bureau and line positions within the Stevens Point Fire Department

After running an internal and external chief's assessment center, it is Chief Moody's recommendation the department fill both current and long-term range positions in the Bureau and on the line within the Stevens Point Fire Department with the following three names: Terrence Sinner, Kraig Arndt and Victor Kedrowski. The chief believes these three individuals would be a good fit for the positions within the Department.

Commissioner Kirschling moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to fill the bureau and line positions as recommended by Chief Moody with Terrence Sinner, Kraig Arndt and Victor Kedrowski.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

10. Recommendation to continue with the filling of the Battalion Chief positions that are open and the re-filling of the Division Chief position

There are currently two vacant battalion chief positions. With the resignation of Trevor Howard, there is also a Division Chief position vacant. It is the Chief's recommendation to move forward with filling the vacant Division Chief position and continue the search for two additional battalion chiefs.

The Chief would like to post the positions in the very near future.

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commission Ostrowski to continue with the filling of the two vacant battalion chief positions and the Division Chief position.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

11. Establishment of salary, hours and overtime compensation provisions for the Battalion chief position

Chief Moody is requesting the salary for the position of Battalion Chief Victor Kedrowski start at Grade Q, Step 5. This salary step is appropriate and in alignment with policy, 2.06 based on the applicant's current salary and overtime average. City of Stevens Point Administrative Policy Promotions and Transfers, 2.06(4) states, "The starting salary upon promotion shall be the first step in the grade the position resides that provides the employee an increase of a minimum of 5%."

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commissioner Taylor to approve Battalion Chief Victor Kedrowski's salary to start at Grade Q, Step 5.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

12. Policy review on Battalion Chiefs position within the Administrative Procedures of the Stevens Point Police and Fire Commission

After some discussion it was determined the Battalion chief positions would fall under the Fire Department operational policies and not within the Administrative Procedures of the Police and Fire Commission.

13. Discussion, with possible action, Long Term Agreement with the Village of Park Ridge

The agreement with the Village of Park Ridge has been effective since August 1, 2022. The Department has approximately one month of data and will report this data on August 29, 2022 at the Village meeting. There has been no notification to date that Park Ridge is asking for a

- long-term agreement and the village has until November 1, 2022 to make that notification.

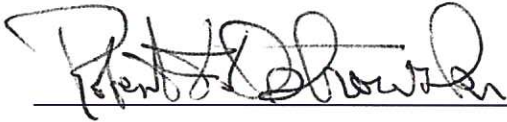

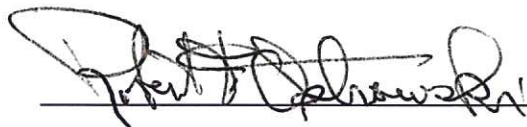

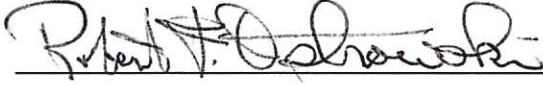

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Note of Interest:

- 8-4-2022 - Several members of the RTF Instructor Cadre participated in the reunification training at PJ Jacobs. The training was held for members of the school district, law enforcement, fire and other agencies in the city that host children before or after school. The training was put on by the I Love You Guys Foundation.
- Lt. Johnson held a meeting with this year's crossing guards, luckily all five are returning for work on Sept. 6. Adolph Betro just celebrated his 23rd year, Mary Boris is coming up on her 24th year, Agnes Kowalski is approaching her 20th year this year and David Wochinski celebrates his 20th year on 9/17/22.
- Lt. Johnson and Officer Kramer met with Officials with the Pacelli Catholic Schools to discuss school safety. A security walk-through was completed at St. Stephens Elementary School as well as a meeting at Pacelli. Knox boxes were installed and secured on three catholic schools and members from SPPD were enrolled in the Catholic Schools Crisis GO App, which is an online format for alerting staff of critical situations. Since, the program has been tested and appears to be working well.

- 8-30-2022 – SPPD displayed a squad at Gamber Johnson for the C4T (Connect 4 Tomorrow) conference and had an Officer speak about their products we use, how it makes our job easier and how it helps us be more productive.

08-27-22 Physical Fight, Brickhouse two males involved in physical fight. One of the males involved caused damage to a car denting it during the fight.

08-27-22 Suicidal male with firearm, 215 Meadow. Male was initially in possession of firearm and made statements of self-harm. Male decided to leave the weapon behind and go for a walk prior to LE arrival. Chapter 51 approved and firearm taken for safekeeping.

08-26-22 Disturbance 2340 Fourth Avenue. Disturbance between male and female. The female started throwing stuff at officer. Female arrested on domestic disorderly conduct and attempted battery to Law Enforcement.

Initial call for officers on Johns drive did not located the victim. Officer's further investigation found victim at another residence. Suspect was later taken into custody by Wausau PD.

08-05-22 Overdose 3401 Church St. 21-year-old female used heroin which caused her to stop breathing. Officers administered narcan which brought the female back to consciousness.

08-04-22 Trespass complaint, 1430 Torun, Male broke into #329 claiming squatting rights. Male was later arrested for criminal trespass and probation hold.

The female was hysterical and attempted to elbow and hit the Officer at one point when the Officer tried to de-escalate the situation. At this time, the suspect kicked the door and continued to yell so the Officer pulled the subject by the arm, onto the ground. The Officer tried to get her hands behind her back, but the suspect pulled away and then claimed she could not breathe. The Officer let go of the suspect at this time and the suspect calmed down. No injuries.

8/28/22 – SPPD Officers were working with a subject who was suicidal and uncooperative at the hospital. The subject had been restrained to the table and was attempting to bite/chew on medical chords attached to the subject. Officers attempted to get the medical chords out of the subject's mouth with no success. Several pressure points were attempts, none of them being useful. The suspect finally released the chord and it is unknown if it was due to the pressure point or on the subject's own accord. No injuries.
