MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 6, 2022**

1. **Roll Call:** Commissioners Kirschling, Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski, Taylor

2. **Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Taylor moved, seconded by Commissioner Mrozek to approve the Minutes of the August 10, 2022 meeting.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

3. **Confirmation of bills**

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling to approve the confirmation of the August 2022 bills.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

4. **Discussion, with possible action, on the use and evaluation of exit interview materials**

Commissioner Mrozek and Chief Kussow worked together to reach out to other departments to inquire as to exit interview policies. They found departments throughout Wisconsin who report to a Police and Fire Commission do not have a PFC that attend exit interviews. However, Mrozek believes the commissioners who have attended exit interviews have obtained valuable information to share with Department heads that can possibly help them better their departments.

Commissioner Mrozek believes it is important to create a policy regarding exit interviews. She believes exit interview questionnaires should be facilitated through the HR department and that records should be maintained by HR. In addition, she would like to see two commissioners in attendance at the exit interviews for the sole purpose of listening and providing feedback to department heads. Both the Police Chief and the Fire Chief have expressed the continued interest in knowing where the department is succeeding or knowing what areas there is potential for improvement.

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling to create an exit interview policy at the Police and Fire Departments facilitated by Human Resources. Human Resources will maintain the records. Two Police and Fire Commissioners will attend to listen and provide feedback to departments as deemed appropriate.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

5. Presentation of full time CSO position and discussion, with possible action, starting nighttime CSO at Grade D, Step 6

Chief Kussow is proposing a full-time dayshift Community Service Officer (CSO).

Currently the Department employs four part-time CSO officers. The CSOs all work 20 hours a week, with a starting pay of \$16.75 per hour. It would cost approximately \$90,000.00 for one full-time (daytime) CSO and one part-time (nighttime) CSO. The current amount budgeted for the current positions is \$76,282.00. The difference of \$13,464.00 would be covered within the existing parking enterprise budget.

The benefits of having a full-time CSO in lieu of three part-time CSOs during the daytime include:

- Job becomes more desirable from a retention standpoint. SPPD has struggled to keep CSOs employed for a variety of reasons. Since April 2016, SPPD has employed approximately 17 part-time CSOs.
- Making this position full-time allows the CSO to earn an income capable of supporting a couple or a small family. The employee would get five raises the first five years and would make \$23.44 by year five. Employee would be able to earn time off consistent with the City Administrative Policy.
- Allows for consistent work, as opposed to having three people work differently every three hours and potentially using much different discretion/decision making on enforcement. Allows the potential to make more money as enforcement times would be more consistent over an eight-hour day and possibly make more money in the position due to the consistent work. It allows for the employee to get very familiar with the position and its duties. Allows SPPD and/or City of Stevens Point to add additional responsibilities to the CSO on top of previous job descriptions, such as identifying certain code issues and reporting them as appropriate.

The department wants to keep the one part-time night shift CSO. This position works 2A-6A five days a week. It is vital for the parking program to keep the position filled based on the income it brings in.

The current parking enforcement program is successful, especially when staffed at 100%. With the proposed changes in staffing, the Department can make a more sustainable and consistent program that will only increase the revenue brought in by the program, with keeping the upfront cost to the City almost the same.

Commissioner Kirschling moved, seconded by Commissioner Ostrowski to hire one full-time CSO officer at Grade G, Step 2.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

6. Discussion, with possible action, moving forward with therapy dog for police department.

Chief Kussow is looking for formal approval to move forward with obtaining a therapy dog starting in 2023. The dog would be donated through Blueberry Cottages Labradoodle from Osseo, Wisconsin. The training costs would be approximately \$2,500 and would come out of the operational training budget.

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Taylor to approve a therapy dog for the Police Department in 2023.

7. Police Chief's Report

Notes of Interest:

- 8-4-2022 - Several members of the RTF Instructor Cadre participated in the reunification training at PJ Jacobs. The training was held for members of the school district, law enforcement, fire and other agencies in the city that host children before or after school. The training was put on by the I Love You Guys Foundation.
- Lt. Johnson held a meeting with this year's crossing guards, luckily all five are returning for work on Sept. 6. Adolph Betro just celebrated his 23rd year, Mary Boris is coming up on her 24th year, Agnes Kowalski is approaching her 20th year this year and David Wochinski celebrates his 20th year on 9/17/22.
- Lt. Johnson and Officer Kramer met with Officials with the Pacelli Catholic Schools to discuss school safety. A security walk-through was completed at St. Stephens Elementary School as well as a meeting at Pacelli. Knox boxes were installed and secured on three catholic schools and members from SPPD were enrolled in the Catholic Schools Crisis GO App, which is an online format for alerting staff of critical situations. Since, the program has been tested and appears to be working well.
- 8-11-2022 – Several Officers and SPPD honor guard attended Dr. Clark Pagel's funeral to honor his commitment to Law Enforcement.
- 8-19-2022 – Lt. Johnson, Officer Beach, Chief Kussow and AC Williams spent a considerable amount of time at Dunkin Donuts for "Cop on the rooftop" fundraiser, which is aimed at raising money for Wisconsin Special Olympics. Almost \$2000 was raised.
- 8-19-2022 – Records Specialist Stacey Sprea welcomed Elton Stone Heindl into the world. All are doing well.
- 8-19-2022 – SPPD is offering officers the opportunity to purchase Pink Badges in support of Breast Cancer Awareness, which they will be allowed to wear for the month of October. (10% of the all sales goes to support the National Breast Cancer Foundation)
- 8-21-2022 – Officer Sam Hessel successfully completed step #1 of the FTO process and will be moving onto step #2 with FTO Lepinski.
- 8-22-2022 – Officer Cole O'Neil was placed to permanent status after completing his 18-month probation period.
- 8-22-2022 – Assistant Chief Williams began her first week of Command College at Fort McCoy.
- 8-22-2022 – Welcomed all attendees for the State Wide Fire Investigator Training sponsored by the SPFD.
- 8-28-2022 – Re-scheduled Guns and Hoses fund raising softball game for veterans to Oct. 9, 2022.
- 8-30-2022 – SPPD displayed a squad at Gamber Johnson for the C4T (Connect 4 Tomorrow) conference and had an Officer speak about their products we use, how it makes our job easier and how it helps us be more productive.

08-25-22 Welfare check, known female was placed under arrest for probation violation in which the female resisted arrest. The female suspect kicked one of the officers while being medically cleared.

08-23-22 Overdose 700 blk Johns Drive. Welfare check on male lying on the front lawn unresponsive male. Narcan given by medics and the male came to followed by a medical transport by ambulance.

08-23-22 Burglary, 3500 Bush #11, suspect made entry through bedroom window and took jewelry and related items.

08-22-22, Threats with Knife, walk-in juvenile complainants reported being threatened with a knife. Upon further investigation, juvenile suspect reported the complainants threatened him and wanted to take his nerf gun.

08-21-22 Disturbance 325 Northpoint, female suspect arrived at the residence of male victim wanting to gain entry to the residence. Female suspect had no contact with male victim. Female broke the front window of the residence during the disturbance and left prior to officer arrival.

08-06-22 Shooting/ kidnapping, 641 Johns Dr., Officers responded to reports of male subject who was shot and kidnapped by ex-boyfriend of female resident. Initial call for officers on Johns drive did not located the victim. Officer's further investigation found victim at another residence. Suspect was later taken into custody by Wausau Police Department.

08-05-22 Overdose 3401 Church St. 21-year-old female used heroin which caused her to stop breathing. Officers administered narcan which brought the female back to consciousness.

08-04-22 Trespass complaint, 1430 Torun, Male broke into #329 claiming squatting rights. Male was later arrested for criminal trespass and probation hold.

08-03-22 Traffic stop, Doolittle and Green, male and female occupants of the car had been flipping off the officer. When the vehicle was stopped one of the occupants pulled out an airsoft rifle. Both subjects detain followed by K-9 sniff finding paraphernalia. Female arrested on bail jumping

08-01-22 Burglary, 2900 blk Lindbergh, residents returned home from vacation to find the house had been broken into with 5k in cash and 3 k in old coins stolen

8/30/22 – SPPD Officers had arrived at a residence looking for a male who was suspected of assaulting another person. The victim had fled the residence and Officers were given permission to force entry into the residence if they got no answer. There was a child in the residence with the suspect and there was a concern for the child's welfare. After no response from anyone inside, Officers kicked in the door. One officer had his duty weapon drawn upon kicking the door in. Just inside the door was the suspect who was taken into custody without incident.

8/26/22 – SPPD Officer arrived at a disturbance where a female was yelling and banging on a house to be let back inside. The female was hysterical and attempted to elbow and hit the Officer at one point when the Officer tried to de-escalate the situation. At this time, the suspect kicked the door and continued to yell so the Officer pulled the subject by the arm, onto the ground. The Officer tried to get her hands behind her back, but the suspect pulled away and then claimed she could not breathe. The Officer let go of the suspect at this time and the suspect calmed down. No injuries.

8/28/22 – SPPD Officers were working with a subject who was suicidal and uncooperative at the hospital. The subject had been restrained to the table and was attempting to bite/chew on medical chords attached to the subject. Officers attempted to get the medical chords out of the subject's mouth with no success. Several pressure points were attempted, none of them being useful. The suspect finally released the chord and it is unknown if it was due to the pressure point or on the subject's own accord. No injuries.

8. Discussion, with possible action, Long Term Agreement with the Village of Park Ridge

During a recent Village board meeting President Steve Menzel reported the Park Ridge Village Board hired Neenah based McMahon & Associates to conduct a fire prevention services study. The study identified the following three options:

- **Option 1: Restore the Park Ridge Fire Department to active duty status on January 1, 2023.**
Under this option, all three Park Ridge vehicles would need to be replaced at a cost of approximately \$885,000.00. The youngest vehicle is out of compliance with the NFPA. The study also recommends the construction of a new fire department building at a cost of approximately 1 million dollars.
- **Option 2: Contract fire protection services with Stevens Point.** Under this option the village would pay approximately \$96,000.00 annually to the city to provide fire protection and inspection services.
- **Option 3: Contract fire protection services with the Town of Hull.** Under the terms discussed with Dave Wiltz, Town of Hull president, the village would sign a two-year contract with the volunteer fire department. Hull Fire Department would also provide fire inspection services. The hull contract would cost the village approximately \$60,000.00 per year.

As of this date, Village President Menzel has not been in contact with the Police and Fire Commission to request a possible long-term agreement for fire prevention services.

Commissioner Taylor moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling in the event the Village of Park Ridge President reaches out to the Police and Fire Commission, Chief Moody has the authority to create a long-term agreement for approval by the necessary bodies of Stevens Point government.

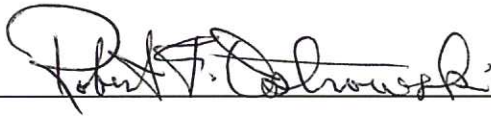

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Note of Interest:

- 10-5-22 Lt. Greg Bean is retired after 25 years of dedicated service to the PD and the City. We will be having a retirement celebration for him at the PD at 10am.
- 9-24-22 Jack Stand Car Cruise group donated \$5000 to the SPPD K9 program.
- 9-23-22 Honor Guard lead the SPASH Homecoming Parade.
- 9-23-22 Officer Samuel Hessel successfully completed step 2 of the FTO process.
- 9-22-22 Ofc. Radsek had a booth at the Community Safety Fair at the Aging and Disability Resource Center to share information on financial and online safety.
- 9-22-22 Officer Kris Marchel had been selected to be our primary handler for the Therapy Dog program which will be implemented in 2023.
- 9-21-22 Lights of Christmas Fundraiser at Culvers East attended by SPPD, PTSO and Plover PD.
- 9-20-22 Coffee with a Cop at Franny's Restaurant
- 9-19-22 Lt. Johnson attended committees and council for approval of a fulltime community service officer. It was approved and deadline for internal applicants is Oct. 6.
- Lt. Johnson participated in a safety fair at the Children's Discovery Center.
- 9-13-22 Police Department parking lot was started and is on track to be completed at the end of Sept.
- 9-13-22 SWAT Competed in a competition with 5 other teams and took 1st place.
- 9-8-22 First day of Portage County Citizens Academy
- 9-6-22 School began and SPPD currently has an opening for a crossing guard but 5 crossing guards returned from last year.
- 26 unclaimed bicycles were donated to the WI/Nicaragua Partners of America.

Calls of Interest:

09-25-22, Road rage with firearm, Officers responded to Bukolt Park to investigate a road rage incident between teen groups. Two groups of teens met for a confrontation in the park. A teen from one of the groups brandished a firearm. Officers conducted a high-risk stop on the suspect vehicle detaining the occupants. Further investigation learned the gun was an airsoft gun. Also located during the investigation were THC and vapes. Parents of suspects were summoned and citation were issued.

09-24-22, Domestic disturbance with weapon, Report of male striking his house with a hammer. The male was contacted by officer and arrested for violation of no- contact for prior domestic and Felony domestic incident.

09-22-22, Physical Fight with weapons, Alley by Graffiti's, Officer responded to group of people fighting with a sledgehammer and possibly a gun. Upon arrival, people scattered. A sledgehammer was located, however a firearm was not.

09-21-22, Disturbance, 500 blk Second female caller reported a known male made force entry to her residence by kicking in the back door. Upon further investigation, the male was located and arrested on Disorderly Conduct and bail jumping charges taken to jail.

09-20-22, Threats with Firearm, 400 blk Washington, Caller/ Land lord reported a tenant made threats with a gun. Upon further investigation, tenant threaten to shoot his vehicle with a bb gun. No further action

09-20-22, Domestic disturbance, 400 blk West St N. male made threats towards female caller's son. Male was later taken into custody on P&P warrant as he was in violation of rules.

09-20-22, Storm Damage, Power outages across the city and flooding at underpasses.

09-19-22, Domestic disturbance, 300 blk North Point Dr. Male and Female subjects who are known to Law Enforcement, were involved in physical disturbance. The female was determined to be the primary aggressor. Female resisted arrest attempt to kicked and bite officers. Female cause self-harm during transport in squad by banging her head and kicking the squad interior. Domestic related charges

09-18-22 Injury by stabbing, Male subject presented at Aspirus Stevens Point with a stab wound. Upon further investigation, it was determined the incident took place in Wisconsin Rapids. WRPD notified.

09-17-22 High risk Stop, Male suspect from domestic incident at 600 blk of Portage St. with felony warrants taken into custody with high risk stop as he had fled from police during prior attempts to place him in custody.

09-17-22 Physical disturbance, 400 blk Second, one male physically assaulted another male however officers were not able to make contact with suspect. RFC for Battery

09-17-22 Domestic Disturbance, Physical disturbance in which the female suspect assaulted the male victim. Based on prior repeated domestic disturbances, felony domestic battery charges will be forwarded to district attorney.

09-15-22 Disturbance, report of male attempting to start fights inside of Guu's. Male contacted and cited. During the investigation other subjects contact one of which was arrested on warrant.

09-13-22 Firearm found, Stolen shotgun located in backyard of 100 Union St.

09-13-22 General School Threats, Social media threats of school shooting. Matter investigated by Patrol, SRO notified. It was determined to be general social media posts, which were shared locally, however were not specific to Stevens Point.

09-11-22 Disturbance, 1400 blk Soo Marie, Verbal argument which resulted in one party using pepper spray on the other. Request for charges for battery and disorderly conduct.

09-04-22 OD/gun call, 1900 blk Elk, Male reportedly took overdosed on prescription pills and armed himself with a shotgun. Officers negotiated and were able to have the male surrender and was taken into protective custody.

09-02-22, Suicidal male with firearm, 3200 Water, Officers responded for welfare check on male who learned his wife had been cheating on him. Male was contacted without the gun and arrangements made with a friend to stay with him. Police took the gun for safekeeping.

09-01-22, Suspicious male with gun, report of male walking around with a handgun. Male contacted who recently purchased a handgun and thought it came with a Carry Concealed Weapon license. Male did not have valid CCW. Firearm was confiscated.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 5 (50)

9/3/22 – SPPD Officers responded to a disturbance in a residence. The male inside the residence was destroying property and was suspected of being strung out on drugs and alcohol. Officers attempted to reason with the suspect without success. Due to the suspect's threats and carrying an unknown object, one Officer removed his taser and pointed at the suspect's chest when the suspect exited the room. The item the suspect was carrying was observed and was not a threat, the taser was holstered. The suspect was later handcuffed due to verbal defiance towards the officers. No injuries.

9/5/22 – SPPD Officer located an unsecured, vacant building in Stevens Point and also evidence that people may be squatting there. Officers began to clear the building and located several people inside.

While clearing the building Officers had their guns drawn and pointed at the suspects they encountered. No injuries.

9/7/22 – SPPD Officers were looking for a vehicle being driven by a suspect in a domestic abuse incident. The suspect had displayed a handgun to the victims and it was reported the suspect took the gun with him when he left the area in the vehicle. One Officer located the suspect vehicle and due to the suspect possibly having a handgun, the Officers all pointed their handguns at the suspect when they conducted a high risk traffic stop. The suspect was taken into custody without incident and a handgun was located in a small pack on his person. No Injuries.

9/17/22 – SPPD Officers were attempting to arrest a subject wanted on fresh domestic abuse charges. The suspect also had a felony warrant and was known to carry knives. Once Officers located the suspect, he fled on foot. The suspect was later able to get into a Plover Taxi and Officers stopped the Taxi and conducted a high risk traffic stop. All Officers had their weapons pointed at the suspect, who refused Officer's orders for much of the time, but eventually got out of the vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody without incident or injury.

9/25/22 – SPPD Officers were called to a road rage incident where there was a report of a gun being displayed. One Officer located the suspect vehicle as it left the area of the victim's vehicle and conducted a high risk traffic stop. Due to the threat of the gun, all officers had out their guns, pointed at the suspect vehicle as verbal commands were issued to everyone inside. All occupants were taken into custody without incident. A facsimile Glock handgun was located in the center console of the vehicle. No injuries.

Ben Franklin

For the Month of September at Ben Franklin Jr. High school, things started out slow and picked up after the first week. As far as my Police Outreach Program classes, Ofc. Marchel taught a total of 76 students who are all 7th graders 3 different sessions. The first was about how the internet works and cyberbullying. The second was on sexting and internet safety, and the third covered conflict resolution and anger management. This involves 3 different class periods every Thursday and involves classroom discussion, PowerPoint presentations, videos and questions by the students.

Additionally there were approximately 40+ calls which included a fire drill, meeting with students about behavior, meetings with counselors and parents about student behavior and various other incidents including class room police outreach. A break-down of more notable incidents include.

- 2 knives found either on a student or in their locker
- 4 physical incidents involving students hitting or shoving other students to the ground
- 1 student throwing tables and chairs during a break-down due to a schedule change by teachers
- 1 social media threat that was shared from a Ben Franklin student from another area

- 6 bullying incidents
- 1 sexual assault by a parent reported to counselor/Portage County Health and Human Services
- 1 theft of a cellphone by a student (recovered)

These incidents resulted in multiple school consequences including suspensions, both in school and out of school, 2 citations for disorderly conduct, 2 YES referrals (1 accepted) and several meetings with parents. A welfare check was conducted on a student whose family recently was evicted and believed to be homeless.
