- 11-29-22 Lt. Johnson attended Police Lights of Christmas Hand-Off event in Green Bay. Attendees assembled backpacks to be given to people in need throughout the community and gift cards were also collected and brought back to also be handed out. These gift cards were earned through fundraising events, one at the Pizza Ranch in July and another at Culvers on the East side in September.

Calls of Interest:

11-26-22 Disturbance, 500 blk Bliss Av. Officer responded to investigate a dumpster fire. Upon further investigation male was arrested for domestic Disorderly Conduct, felony bail jumping and resisting.

11-26-22, Warrant arrest officer injury, Officers observed group of males in disturbance in front of Brickhause. One male was identified and found to have warrant. Subject ran and resisted officers causing injury to officers. Male suspected taken into custody.

11-25-22 Disturbance, 1700 blk Lincoln Av, report of male hiding in garage because he thought the police were after him. Probation and Parole placed a hold on subject taken to Jail.

11-25-22 OWI traffic W/firearm, Officers investigated a driving complaint reference a male driver doing a burn out on the square. Driver arrested for Operating while intoxicated and going armed(firearm) while intoxicated.

11-25-22 Domestic disturbance, 300 blk Green Av. Male slammed female's head against car door and broke her phone. Male arrested on Domestic Disorderly Conduct and bond revoked as he threaten to return and do worse.

11-23-22, Welfare Check, Officer waived down to check on intoxicated Male with cut to his eye and was trying to start fights. Officers made contact, further investigation learned the male had felony bond not to drink and several warrants. Medical clearance and off to jail.

11-20-22 Overdose 3800 blk Roberts, male Overdosed on meth and fentanyl. Narcan administered by Officers and Med unit. Transported to Hospital. Act 79 search located drugs which resulted in Probation hold and 961(drug) charges.

11-19-22 Disturbance at Politos, Male arrested for causing disturbance. Prior to arrest the male had thrown pizza at squad car. Disorderly Conduct; state charge

11-17-22 Patrol Assist Investigation bureau/SWAT with search warrant for weapons. Resulted in a high-risk stop with warrant arrest.

11-16-22 Burglary 1060 Centerpoint, Male suspect let in to apartment complex. Male found random open door and took a shower and made some eggs for a meal.

11-13-22 Disturbance, unwanted male patron at Congress Club. Officers escorted male out given ride to warming shelter.

11-12-22 Overdose, Days Inn, 36 year old male not responsive with CPR in progress. Officer did CPR and administered narkan. Investigation Bureau called in as male was transported, however not breathing on his own. K-9 sniff hit on vehicle involved in the investigation.

11-10-22 Welfare check, 3400 blk McCulloch, report of suspicious smell of rotten meat. Upon further investigation, a deceased male was located in his apartment and had been there for some time. No indication of foul play.

11-06-22 Burglary to Old Shopko, Investigation ongoing with juvenile male suspects at large.

11-05-22 Missing Person, 24-year-Old female reported missing with cognitive disability. (Female later contacted family)

11-05-22 Disturbance, 300 blk Washington, report of multiple persons in physical disturbance. Disposition of city ordinances for Disorderly Conducts.

11-03-22 Disturbance, 2500 blk Michigan. Physical disturbance between male and female. Female sustained injuries requiring stitches, however not cooperative with investigation. Male arrested on warrants and Substantial Battery charges.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 7 (66)

10-25-22 – SPPD Officers were investigating an incident where a suspect was assaulted. The Officers located the suspect downtown and attempted to take the suspect into custody. The suspect had a lighter in their hand and attempted to burn officers as they tried to handcuff the suspect. The Officers were forced to take the suspect to the ground to stabilize them, get the lighter away and handcuff the suspect. Once the suspect was handcuffed the Officers got the suspect into the squad, which is when the suspect began kicking the squad door. At the jail the suspect got out of the squad and knocked over an Officer. Inside the holding cell the suspect would not cooperate, so one SPPD Officer used a wrist compliance hold on the suspect which gained temporary compliance. The suspect was left in the holding cell. No injuries.

10-30-22 – SPPD Officers were called to a report of an assault. The suspect was being held down when Officers arrived. Officers stood the suspect up to apply handcuffs, which is when the suspect began to resist the Officer's efforts. The suspect attempted to pull away and hold his arms in front of him. Due to the level of resistance one Officer deployed their taser into the small of the suspect's back. This allowed for Officers to lower the suspect to the ground and apply handcuffs. Prior to the transport of the suspect, the suspect refused to get into the squad. The suspect received minor wounds from the Taser probes.

11-2-22 – SPPD Officers were investigating a no contact order. The suspect in the case was very

agitated and pacing. The Officer grabbed the suspect's arm and tried to place handcuffs on them. The suspect tensed up and would not allow the Officers to place handcuffs on them. One Officer displayed their taser to the suspect, who then cooperated and allowed Officers to handcuff them. No injuries

11-17-22 – SPPD/Plover SWAT executed a search warrant on a residence in Stevens Point. The warrant was to search for weapons used in commission of violent crimes. During the execution of the warrant, member of the team pointed their weapons at one of the suspects as they were taken into custody. No injuries.

11-17-22 – SPPD Officers were standing by as Narcotics Officers were conducting surveillance on a target residence. The suspect was known to possess firearms and was a convicted felon. The surveillance officers observed the suspect leave the residence in a vehicle and due to fresh charges, requested the suspect be stopped and taken into custody. SPPD Officers conducted a high risk stop, pointed their firearms at the suspect, who was the only occupant and gave the suspect commands to exit the vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody without incident or injury.

11-26-22 – Officers were on scene of a domestic disturbance. One of the people involved in the disturbance continued to argue with the other party and lunged towards them, then ran around a vehicle from officers, failing to obey their commands. One Officer was able to tackle the suspect to the ground. Once on the ground, the suspect continued to resist and not follow commands. Officers were able to get the suspect secured in handcuffs, without injuries.

11-27-22 – Officers were attempting to arrest and subject downtown on a probation warrant. Just prior to applying the handcuffs on the suspect, the suspect pulled from the Officer's grips and took off running. One Officer tackled the suspect and they both fell. The other Officer attempted to jump over the suspect and also fell and was incidentally kicked in the eye, by the suspect. The suspect got back up and ran some more until the Officer was able to catch up and tackle the suspect two more times, until the suspect stopped resisting and was placed into handcuffs. The suspect was not injured, however the Officer was injured.

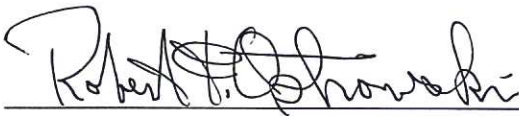

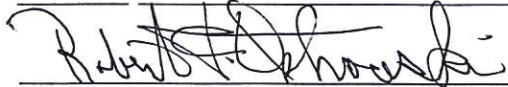

William then enrolled and was selected to participate in the MSTC Criminal Justice Law Enforcement Academy beginning January 9, 2023, which has an expected graduation date of May 17, 2023.

William's background revealed that he is a very hard worker, who puts his family first. Sgt. Burris of the Wisconsin Rapids PD stated that William had a positive impact with his supervisor and always had a positive demeanor and attitude. Past employers described William as great with dealing with people, has a calm demeanor, easy to speak to, very personable, incredible work ethic, great person to be around and is a person that always holds himself to a high standard.

Everyone interviewed believes William will be a great representative of and for the Stevens Point Police Department.

11/30/22 – A SPPD Detective assisted Portage County Sheriff's Office Detectives with a drug warrant. During the execution of the warrant, the Detective pointed their firearm at a suspect while clearing the residence. No injuries.

12/2/22 – SPPD Officers had made contact with an individual who was suspected of stealing some items. The suspect was arrested by Officers and walked outside to the squad car. Once to the squad car the suspect began to tense up and lift their feet off of the ground, causing Officers to hold the suspect up. The suspect refused to get into the squad car. Officers were forced to pull the suspect in backwards into the squad. Once the doors were shut, the suspect began to kick the squad doors. The suspect was taken to jail and turned over to jail staff where he continued to resist with them. No injuries.
