MEETING OF FEBRUARY 6, 2023**

- 1. Roll Call:** Commissioners Kirschling, Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski, Taylor

2. Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Taylor moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling, to approve the minutes of the January 12, 2023, meeting as presented.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

3. President's Report

Commissioner Moore spoke of the Round Table meeting that he, Police Chief Kussow, and Fire Chief Moody attended last Tuesday in Mauston. It was a discussion on the Police and Fire Commissions that have Optional Powers in the state. All three agreed it was very informative and hope that there will be more statewide discussions in the future.

4. Confirmation of Bills

Commissioner Ostrowski questioned Police Chief Kussow on the purchase of the LMT 40MM 4-Shot Launcher. Kussow explained it is used by SWAT for deploying less lethal and gas rounds and is a safer option than bean bag rounds for crowd control.

Commissioner Ostrowski questioned Fire Chief Moody on the purchase of the Enclosed 14' Investigation Trailer. Moody explained is to house the tools needed for fire investigations. Commissioner Ostrowski questioned Moody on the purchase of the Elderly Female Body Mannequin. AC Gemza explained the purchase to assist in training and will be used countywide by various organizations.

Commissioner Ostrowski moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling, to approve the confirmation of the January 2023 bills.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

5. Discussion, with possible action, on revisions to Administrative Policy 4.04, Termination of Employment – Exit Interview.

After a lengthy conversation, the Commission agreed to gather more information regarding the involvement of Human Resources and will contact the City Attorney regarding any legal aspects. This topic will be discussed again next month.

6. Police Chief's Report

The Rescue Task Force, comprised of the PD and FD, did tours of Pacelli, SPASH, and Rosholt High Schools. Training students and employees on how to "stop the bleed" and identify where gauze and tourniquets should be placed in schools/classrooms.

Commissioner Ostrowski wished to go on record and thanked everyone for their service and commitment to the City. Commissioner Ostrowski stated that he reads the Chiefs reports thoroughly and is appreciative of everyone for all they do especially in the last two months with responding to serious calls.

Note of Interest:

- 1-11-23 Hired Crossing Guard David Wagner for Michigan and Rice.
- Therapy Dog, Willow, and Ofc. Marchel continue to train through obedience classes at Pawsitively Unleashed.
- 1-23/1-27 Chief Kussow attended the New Chief's Conference put on by the Department of Justice.
- 1-24-23 Ast. Chief Williams attend the "Call to Action" meeting through United Way. 70 community members identified top need of our community. (1. Mental health, 2. Child care, 3. Homelessness)
- 1-25-23 Recognition banquet organized by Lt. Uitenbroek for SPPD Auxiliary and 2022 Coin Recipients. Lt Johnson worked with Lt. Uitenbroek and organized with local media outlets to attend the Coin Recognition banquet at the Holiday Inn. Channel 9 and the Metro Wire attended and conducted interviews with recipients and SPPD staff.
- 1-26-23 – Lt. Johnson did a 1.5 hr presentation at the Stevens Point Area Coop for all staff on the topic; Run, Hide, Fight and preparedness in the event of an active shooter.
- Community Service Officer Hensel has been trained/educated on abandoned vehicle laws and spent time contacting owners whose vehicles have been on the streets for more than 48 hours. City entities feedback

reveals they have seen a significant decrease in abandoned vehicles around town with this new process.

- Lt. Mueller came up with new procedure for found property. Lt. Johnson worked with John Quirk, Community Media Manager, to create a tab on the city website under SPPD for the found property. When property is located and no owner is known, this property will be entered on our city website for potential claiming. CSO Hensel will be the point of contact for people trying to claim this property.

Calls of Interest:

- **01-30-23 Domestic disturbance**, Adult male suspect was involved in a physical disturbance with brother. The verbal argument over suspect spitting in the sink turn physical resulting in arrest for probation hold, domestic Disorder Conduct, Battery. Suspect transported to Jail.
- **01-29-23, Physical disturbance at Buffalo Wild Wings**, Off duty military and Law Enforcement intervened to break up the fight. Suspects contacted and issued citation upon completion of investigation.
- **01-29-23 OverDose**, Subject was released from Jail for approx. 2 hours and overdosed on drugs Two doses of Narcan given. Male transported for medical clearance by Med. Unit.
- **01-28-23 OverDose**, 200 blk of Meadow subject overdosed on heroin. Male subject was transported medically.
- **01-24-23, Road Rage**, Second and Fourth, male and female drivers who got into verbal argument which turned physical. The male driver was arrested for Battery and disorderly conduct.
- **01-23-23, Welfare Check**, 400 blk of Wadleigh, Officer were requested to check welfare of employee who had not showed for work for days. Officers located subject deceased due to apparent self- inflicted gun shot.
- **01-23-23, Suspicious**, 500 blk of Forest, Caller reported from his hospital room that persons may be in his house without permission. Officers made forced entry after announcing several times. Officers located a male and female in the residence. The male had been hiding and was later found to have warrants. Male arrested on warrants.
- **01-17-23, Welfare check**, 1600 blk of Riverview ,Officers responded to report of suicidal female who had cut wrist and wanted to die. Officers were able to make contact and talk female into giving up the razor blades. Female was initially cooperative with officers and was transported to hospital. Female later wanted to leave and physically resisted officers. Female was later placed on mental health hold.
- **01-17-23, 911 hang up**, male was calling 911 alleging he was about to be kidnapped. Male reported the cartel is after him. Male made repeated phone calls and was cited. Male continued and was later arrested on felony bail jumping for being under the influence.

- **01-17-23, Physical Disturbance**, 200 blk of Frontenac, report of two male fighting. Officers responded and one male fled the scene and was located. Upon further investigation, neither party wanted police intervention. Parties separated for the night.
- **01-13-23, Possible Firearm on School Bus**, School Resource Officer investigated report of a student from Point Of Discovery School displaying a firearm to other students on the bus a few days prior. Suspected student initially denied the allegations, upon further investigation, it was learned the suspected student did have a BB hand gun on the bus. BB gun retrieved by law enforcement from students residence . Juvenile referral on student.
- **01-13-23, 911 call of man with gun w/ hostages**, Day Inn, Officers from SPPD and multiple other jurisdictions responded and set up perimeter. Contact made with caller who was also the suspect. Verbal contact made with suspect who was taken down at gun point. Upon further investigation, no hostages, however loaded handgun. Suspect was determined to be under the influence of a narcotic and in possession with a firearm. Suspect arrested and transported to jail for poss. of meth.
- **01-12-23, Welfare check with Firearm**, 2800 blk of Jefferson, Officers responded to check the welfare of a male who reportedly cocked a gun in his bedroom during an argument with his girlfriend and talked about dying. Officers made contact and gained compliance. Male sought voluntary treatment. The firearm was taken for safe keeping.
- **01-11-23, Assist SPASH Threats**, Patrol assisted School Resource Officer investigate report of statements via snapchat by student about blowing up the school. Student was upset about math. Further investigation determined student did not have access to bombs and stated it was a joke. Disposition of school consequences.
- **01-11-23, OverDose**, 3300 blk of Glacier Av. Report of female who overdosed. Officer administered Narcan which resulted in normal breathing. CPR also administered. Female transported to hospital.
- **01-10-23, Welfare Check**, 3900 blk of Doolittle dr, Officer investigated report of suicidal male who left in vehicle. Contact with male on traffic stop. The male stated he was not suicidal, however the male was under the influence and later arrested for OWI 2nd.
- **01-09-23, Welfare Check**, 500 blk Forest, Officer received info. a male subject sent a video to girlfriend of him OverDosing in order to kill himself. Officers responded to residence where the male was hiding. Male was taken into custody on Warrants. Male was resistive and actively attempted to harm himself while in handcuffs banging his head against objects.
- **01-09-23, Disturbance with Firearm**, 1430 Torun Rd. Officers responded to report of male threatening others with a machine gun. Upon officers arrival, a suspect vehicle was stopped and occupants questioned. Further investigation learned a loaded 22 hand gun was involved. K-9 sniff of the vehicle resulted in a search which located the gun and narcotics. Several occupants were on probation. One female occupant arrested on

warrants. One male occupant fled the traffic stop on foot when the gun was observed by officers. The male was later located by PTSO Deputy and taken to jail on felon in possession of gun and resisting.

- **01-06-23, OverDose** , PJ Jacobs JHS, School Resource Officer and patrol assist with 14 year old student overdosing on pain meds and not feeling well. Female later sought voluntary treatment after parent notification
- **01-06-23, Accidental discharge of firearm**, 200 blk Minnesota/ 300 blk Minnesota Av. Report of damage to house by bullet, Further investigation learned a male who had been cleaning his AR-15 had an accidental discharge. The bullet traveled into nearby neighboring residence. No one was home at the time. Officers counseled the male with the firearm as to firearm safety and taking responsibility.

January Use of Force Summaries

- **1-6-23** – Officers had responded to a domestic disturbance. During the investigation it was learned a suspect had barricaded themselves in a bedroom and possibly had a hammer. Officers were forced to force their way into the bedroom and located the suspect hiding under the bed. In order to get the suspect out, one Officer displayed their taser at the suspect. The suspect surrendered, came out and was taken into custody without injury.
- **1-13-23** – SPPD Officers were called to a hotel for a report of someone possibly holding 4 people against their will, armed with a handgun. While the Officers made a perimeter around the building, other Officers began to gather more information as to the room location. As they were doing this they encountered the possible suspect. Due to the information the suspect was armed, one Officer had their patrol rifle out and pointed at the suspect, while the other had their taser out and pointed at the suspect. The suspect was given commands and was taken into custody without incident or injury.
- **1-9-23** – Officers had arrested an individual in a residence on a warrant. The suspect was uncooperative with Officers while being escorted from the residence and began banging their head against the wall. The suspect then began to put their feet on the wall in an effort to keep the Officers from being able to walk the suspect out. One Officer was forced to grab the suspect and place him on the ground at this point to avoid injury to themselves or an Officer. The suspect was then cooperative and walked out of the residence with the Officers.
- **1-20-23** – SPPD Detectives along with a few SPPD Officers executed a narcotics search warrant at a residence in Stevens Point. During the

execution of the warrant Officers pointed their firearms at suspects inside the target residence, taking them into custody. There were no injuries.

- **1-22-23** – SPPD Officers were investigating a trespassing complaint at a residence. No one had answered the door and the Officers had permission to enter the residence with force. Once Officers were entering one person was contacted. As another Officer was going downstairs, they had their weapon drawn and observed a suspect lying on a bed. The Officer pointed their weapon at the suspect and gave the suspect orders. The suspect was taken into custody without incident or injury.

- January 2023 at Ben Franklin Jr. High School saw an increase in behavioral issues as well as the presence of vaping devices. School administrators including School Resource Officer Marchel, responded to reports of vaping devices on nearly a daily basis, locating and confiscating many that contained both nicotine and different forms of THC, ranging from Delta-8, Delta-9 and Delta-10. Multiple students were sent home for observation as they appeared under the influence of suspected narcotics.
- Ben Franklin had one K9 search conducted with a positive indication, but nothing located.
- Ben Franklin also saw several threats to bring a firearm on school grounds and internet searches for firearms that were flagged on the "Securely" alert system. None were determined to be credible threats to the school after investigating. Officer Marchel did respond to a report of a BB-gun that was

brought to Point of Discovery School and a juvenile referral was submitted after a BB-gun that appeared to be a real pistol was recovered.

Commissioner Moore moved, seconded by Commissioner Taylor, to approve the Police Chief's report for January 2023.

Ayes, all; nays, none. Motion carried.

7. Discussion, with possible action, on the appointment of Firefighter/Paramedic Jeremiah Parker to the position of Motor Pump Operator.

Position available due to the retirement of Arthur Dahms, after 32 years of service at the Stevens Point Fire Department.

Commissioner Taylor recused himself from a vote.

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling, to appoint Jeremiah Parker to the position of Motor Pump Operator, effective date February 8th, 2023.

Ayes, Kirschling, Moore, Mrozek, Ostrowski; abstention, Taylor; nays, none. Motion carried.

Commissioner Moore thanked Mr. Dahms for his years of service.

8. Fire Chief's Report/EMS Report

Chief Moody stated the Fire Academy Class 2301 started January 16th and is scheduled for graduation this Friday, February 10th at 1400 at Station 1. He invited the Commissioners to the ceremony for their graduation, which will also include recent appointments and promotions for others at the Stevens Point Fire Department.

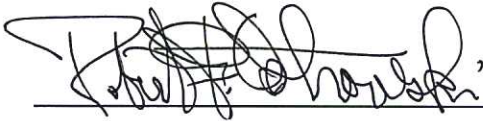

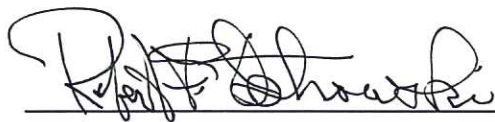

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 45/49

Note of Interest:

- 2-1-23 Ast. Chief Williams and Lt. Uitenbroek read to a class at McKinley School for Read Across America Day.
- Lt. Johnson worked with several locations this month who have purchased and are installing Knox Boxes, to include Aspirus Hospital on Vern Holmes Dr., Redeemer Lutheran Church, the Boys and Girls Club, Berard Center and Good News Fellowship Church.
- 2-4-23 Several Officers participated in Polar Plunge for Special Olympics raising over \$2000.
- 2-9-23 Several members from SPPD attended SPASH to assist them with participating in the Wisconsin School Breakfast Challenge. The school gets points for doing certain things and inviting certain groups to their events to help support their food program.
- 2-9-23 Chief Kussow, Lt. Moss and Lt. Johnson attended a security meeting at Aspirus Hospital on Vern Holmes Dr. to address several safety concerns to include poor radio connections, lack of security, and active shooter plans.
- 2-20-23 Lt. Johnson gave a Rescue Task Force training to Pacelli High School.
- 2-22-23 Hosted Sheepdog K9 training – 2 day seminar that covers topics including narcotic-contraband detection dog operations and relevant case law related to the Supreme Court, United States of appeals for the Seventy Circuit and the State of Wisconsin.
- 2-24-23 Ofc. Radsek and Lt. Johnson presented to the City Parks Department on homeless population in the City.
- 2-27-23 Ast. Chief Williams attended meeting with Plover PD, Portage County Sheriff's Office and Redi transport regarding pilot program for mental health commitments.

- 2-28-23 received 3 sealed bids for PD roof. All three will be presented to Committees and one will be approved by committees in March.

Calls of Interest:

- **02-25-23** Physical Disturbance, Icon Night Club, Officers investigated a report of drunk male fighting another male due to possible theft of money. Further investigation found not theft, however male was arrested and jailed for State Disorderly Conduct.
- **02-24-23** Physical Domestic Disturbance, 700 blk Illinois Av. Male and female involved in physical disturbance. Upon further investigation a dual arrest was made on the male and female for charges of domestic related battery and domestic disorderly conduct.
- **02-24-23** Physical Domestic Disturbance, 500 blk Forest St, Officers responded to location to investigate a physical disturbance between father and son. Upon further investigation, the father was arrested for domestic battery.
- **02-23-23**, Disabled Vehicle, Green and Simonis, Officer stopped to check on what appeared to be disabled vehicle. Further contact with the vehicle and occupants found drug activity in play. The female occupant was arrested on probation hold as meth and marijuana paraphernalia was located.
- **02-22-23**, Disturbance with possible gun, 3900 blk Robert St. Officers responded to a disturbance between and male and female with mention of gun. Upon arrival and further investigation, no gun located and neither party wanted to cooperate with investigation despite the male having minor injury to hand from punching a hole in the wall.
- **02-22-23**, Assist State Patrol, State Patrol had a vehicle pursuit with known vehicle with out of state plates. SPPD Officers assisted by attempting to locate suspect vehicle which was located in the city of Stevens Point. Another vehicle traveling with the pursuit suspect vehicle drove past the abandon vehicle used in the pursuit with State Patrol. A second High speed pursuit was initiated by Portage Co Sheriff who was initially out with Stevens Point Officers near abandoned vehicle. Portage Co. Sheriff later terminated the pursuit due to speeds.

Follow up by SPPD Officers lead to a search warrant for abandoned suspect pursuit vehicle. The search located a firearm.

- **02-22-23**, Welfare Check/ Deceased Subject, 700 blk Johns Dr., Officer attempted contact with male. Housing authority keyed in to apartment under exigent circumstances. Officers located a deceased male along with signs of drug use. Detectives responded and later located a quantity of illegal drugs.
- **02-20-23**, Disturbance, 900 blk Main St., Officers investigated a report of disturbance between two males. During the investigation it was learned one of the male had a warrant. Male was arrested and transported to jail.
- **02-18-23**, Disturbance with Property damage, 700 blk John's Dr. Officer investigated a report of a male who smashed an apartment window and car windshield with a grill. Subject later located and arrested for Disorderly conduct.

- **02-16-23**, Drunk and disorderly male, 1200 Main (Old Shopko Lot), report of intoxicated male wanting to fight people. Male was arrested for disorderly conduct and resisted. The male had 3 separate knives on his person which he had attempted to access. (Resulted in officer injury)

Family exited the house and a perimeter was established. Upon verification that only the male was inside, the perimeter was terminated, with later follow up investigation.
- **02-10-23**, Domestic disturbance with injury, 800 blk Second St. Female ran into Point After with Bra and sweat pants with fresh injuries and bruises. Further investigation learn male had struck her several times with a wooden object and with fists over an argument about a PlayStation. Male was located at residence and refused to exit. Family member of female made entry and convinced suspect to turn himself in. Male subject arrested substantial battery and Bail Jump.
- **02-10-23**, Disturbance with Knife, 2100 blk Ellis St. Report of a disturbance with a male and female arguing each with knives. Officers observed the reported behavior and entry was made. Contact with the male and female resulted in arrest for both and medical attention due to cuts.
- **02-09-23**, OverDose, South Point, Officer responded to restaurant for report of male OD on drugs. Contact with male probation search of the male located narcotics. Male arrested for possession after medical clearance.
- **02-07-22**, OverDose 300 blk First St N report of a male who overdosed on heroin. Officers arrived and gave two doses of naran. Due to medical concerns male was not arrested on probation warrant, however was left in the care of medical staff.
- **02-06-22** Child Abuse, Officer investigated report of 3 year old female with bruising to her sternum and stomach area. Further investigation found male boyfriend was upset with 3 year old and struck her for wetting her pants. Male suspect initially fled when confronted by family. Suspect later turned himself in.
- **02-05-23** Disturbance, Officer responded to report of male and female arguing over infidelity on the part of the female half. The male who was also intoxicated was arrested for trespass and bail jumping for no drink.
- **02-05-23** Domestic Disturbance, 400 blk West Karner, Female victim returned home to find broken TV's and other property. The male half sent text death threats to the female victim. Male suspect arrested for Domestic DC.

February Use of Force Summaries

- **2-1-23** – SPPD Detectives executed a narcotics search warrant on a residence in Stevens Point. During the warrant execution, Detectives pointed their service weapons at

occupants inside the residence while taking them into custody. All occupants were taken into custody without incident or injury.

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- **2-16-23** – SPPD Officers were dispatched to a disturbance in a parking lot where and intoxicated subject was trying to fight groups of people. Once Officers arrived, the suspect was approaching and threatening a group of people. To avoid an altercation Officers gave commands to the subject, who ignored them, so Officers immediately each grabbed an arm of the suspect and walked him away from the crowd. As soon as Officers did this, the suspect tensed up and tried reaching for items in their pocket, which was observed to be a knife. The knife was removed and the subject was put on the ground for handcuffing. Once on the ground the suspect attempted to keep their hands tight to their body. Officers had to use a considerable amount of force to get the suspect's hands behind their back, using wrist pressure. Once the suspect was handcuffed, several more knives were located. The suspect was highly intoxicated and continued to be belligerent throughout the contact. One of the Officers injured their thumb during this event and ended up missing time at work.
