5. Police Chief's Report

Chief Kussow explained the new section on his report "Personnel" – current Officers vs. how many Officers the city has approved the Department to have.

Officer Jadon Solis is now on solo patrol.

The Department is working with the Sheriff's Office and Plover PD for all three agencies to use a new program for assisting with Emergency Detentions, which will free up officers to continue working patrol.

Note of Interest:

- 2-1-23 Ast. Chief Williams and Lt. Uitenbroek read to a class at McKinley School for Read Across America Day.
- Lt. Johnson worked with several locations this month who have purchased and are installing Knox Boxes, to include Aspirus Hospital on Vern Holmes Dr., Redeemer Lutheran Church, the Boys and Girls Club, Berard Center and Good News Fellowship Church.
- 2-4-23 Several Officers participated in Polar Plunge for Special Olympics raising over \$2000.
- 2-9-23 Several members from SPPD attended SPASH to assist them with participating in the Wisconsin School Breakfast Challenge. The school gets points for doing certain things and inviting certain groups to their events to help support their food program.
- 2-9-23 Chief Kussow, Lt. Moss and Lt. Johnson attended a security meeting at Aspirus Hospital on Vern Holmes Dr. to address several safety concerns to include poor radio connections, lack of security, and active shooter plans.
- 2-20-23 Lt. Johnson gave a Rescue Task Force training to Pacelli High School.
- 2-22-23 Hosted Sheepdog K9 training – 2 day seminar that covers topics including narcotic-contraband detection dog operations and relevant case law related to the Supreme Court, United States of appeals for the Seventh Circuit and the State of Wisconsin.
- 2-24-23 Ofc. Radsek and Lt. Johnson presented to the City Parks Department on homeless population in the City.
- 2-27-23 Ast. Chief Williams attended meeting with Plover PD, Portage County Sheriff's Office and Redi transport regarding pilot program for mental health commitments.
- 2-28-23 received 3 sealed bids for PD roof. All three will be presented to Committees and one will be approved by committees in March.

Calls of Interest:

- **02-25-23** Physical Disturbance, Icon Night Club, Officers investigated a report of drunk male fighting another male due to possible theft of money. Further investigation found not theft, however male was arrested and jailed for State Disorderly Conduct.
- **02-24-23** Physical Domestic Disturbance, 700 blk Illinois Av. Male and female involved in physical disturbance. Upon further investigation a dual arrest was made on the male and female for charges of domestic related battery and domestic disorderly conduct.
- **02-24-23** Physical Domestic Disturbance, 500 blk Forest St, Officers responded to location to investigate a physical disturbance between father and son. Upon further investigation, the father was arrested for domestic battery.
- **02-23-23**, Disabled Vehicle, Green and Simonis, Officer stopped to check on what appeared to be disabled vehicle. Further contact with the vehicle and occupants found drug activity in play. The female occupant was arrested on probation hold as meth and marijuana paraphernalia was located.
- **02-22-23**, Disturbance with possible gun, 3900 blk Robert St. Officers responded to a disturbance between and male and female with mention of gun. Upon arrival and further investigation, no gun located and neither party wanted to cooperate with investigation despite the male having minor injury to hand from punching a hole in the wall.
- **02-22-23**, Assist State Patrol, State Patrol had a vehicle pursuit with known vehicle with out of state plates. SPPD Officers assisted by attempting to locate suspect vehicle which was located in the city of Stevens Point. Another vehicle traveling with the pursuit suspect vehicle drove past the abandon vehicle used in the pursuit with State Patrol. A second High speed pursuit was initiated by Portage Co Sheriff who was initially out with Stevens Point Officers near abandoned vehicle. Portage Co. Sheriff later terminated the pursuit due to speeds. Follow up by SPPD Officers lead to a search warrant for abandoned suspect pursuit vehicle. The search located a firearm.
- **02-22-23**, Welfare Check/ Deceased Subject, 700 blk Johns Dr., Officer attempted contact with male. Housing authority keyed in to apartment under exigent circumstances. Officers located a decease male along with signs of drug use. Detectives responded and later located a quantity of illegal drugs.
- **02-20-23**, Disturbance, 900 blk Main St., Officers investigated a report of disturbance between two males. During the investigation it was learned one of the male had a warrant. Male was arrested and transported to jail.
- **02-18-23**, Disturbance with Property damage, 700 blk John's Dr. Officer investigated a report of a male who smashed an apartment window and

car windshield with a grill. Subject later located and arrested for Disorderly conduct.

- **02-16-23**, Drunk and disorderly male, 1200 Main (Old Shopko Lot), report of intoxicated male wanting to fight people. Male was arrested for disorderly conduct and resisted. The male had 3 separate knives on his person which he had attempted to access. (Resulted in officer injury)
- **02-16-23**, Disturbance with Firearm, 2300 blk Center, Report of male who returned home intoxicated causing damage to TV, cabinets, and other items. Male then escalated by loading a 30-06 rifle. Family exited the house and a perimeter was established. Upon verification that only the male was inside, the perimeter was terminated, with later follow up investigation.
- **02-10-23**, Domestic disturbance with injury, 800 blk Second St. Female ran into Point After with Bra and sweat pants with fresh injuries and bruises. Further investigation learn male had struck her several times with a wooden object and with fists over an argument about a PlayStation. Male was located at residence and refused to exit. Family member of female made entry and convinced suspect to turn himself in. Male subject arrested substantial battery and Bail Jump.
- **02-10-23**, Disturbance with Knife, 2100 blk Ellis St. Report of a disturbance with a male and female arguing each with knives. Officers observed the reported behavior and entry was made. Contact with the male and female resulted in arrest for both and medical attention due to cuts.
- **02-09-23**, OverDose, South Point, Officer responded to restaurant for report of male OD on drugs. Contact with male probation search of the male located narcotics. Male arrested for possession after medical clearance.
- **02-07-22**, OverDose 300 blk First St N report of a male who overdosed on heroin. Officers arrived and gave two doses of narcan. Due to medical concerns male was not arrested on probation warrant, however was left in the care of medical staff.
- **02-06-22** Child Abuse, Officer investigated report of 3 year old female with bruising to her sternum and stomach area. Further investigation found male boyfriend was upset with 3 year old and struck her for wetting her pants. Male suspect initially fled when confronted by family. Suspect later turned himself in.
- **02-05-23** Disturbance, Officer responded to report of male and female arguing over infidelity on the part of the female half. The male who was also intoxicated was arrested for trespass and bail jumping for no drink.
- **02-05-23** Domestic Disturbance, 400 blk West Karner, Female victim returned home to find broken TV's and other property. The male half sent text death threats to the female victim. Male suspect arrested for Domestic DC.

February Use of Force Summaries

- **2-1-23** – SPPD Detectives executed a narcotics search warrant on a residence in Stevens Point. During the warrant execution, Detectives pointed their service weapons at occupants inside the residence while taking them into custody. All occupants were taken into custody without incident or injury.
- **2-16-23** - SPPD Detectives executed a narcotics search warrant on a residence in Stevens Point. During the warrant execution, Detectives pointed their service weapons at occupants inside the residence while taking them into custody. All occupants were taken into custody without incident or injury.
- **2-16-23** – SPPD Officers were dispatched to a disturbance in a parking lot where an intoxicated subject was trying to fight groups of people. Once Officers arrived, the suspect was approaching and threatening a group of people. To avoid an altercation Officers gave commands to the subject, who ignored them, so Officers immediately each grabbed an arm of the suspect and walked him away from the crowd. As soon as Officers did this, the suspect tensed up and tried reaching for items in their pocket, which was observed to be a knife. The knife was removed and the subject was put on the ground for handcuffing. Once on the ground the suspect attempted to keep their hands tight to their body. Officers had to use a considerable amount of force to get the suspect's hands behind their back, using wrist pressure. Once the suspect was handcuffed, several more knives were located. The suspect was highly intoxicated and continued to be belligerent throughout the contact. One of the Officers injured their thumb during this event and ended up missing time at work.

Commissioner Moore thanked Commissioner Taylor for his time and commitment.

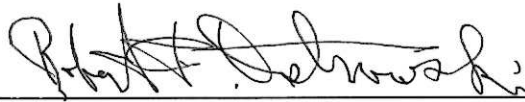

Note of Interest:

- 3-1-23 Lt. Johnson hosted a pizza party for 23, 6th grade Safety Cadets at Bannach School.
- Lt. Johnson hosted another pizza party for 40 Safety Cadets at Jefferson School. The group consisted of 4th, 5th and 6th graders.
- 3-2-23 Honor Guard assisted with the funeral for former Sheriff Ron Borski.
- 3-2-23 the Police Department met with school and City officials to discuss the traffic concerns around Ben Franklin Middle School before and after school hours. Some suggestions were made as well as alternatives presented to the District.
- 3-3-23 Lt. Uitenbroek and Asst. Chief Williams attended the ICS 300 training for large scale events at Portage County Sheriff's Office Emergency Government.
- 3-6-23 Chief Kussow and Lt. Johnson met with the Portage County Tavern League and after a suggestion was made Lt. Johnson began working with Streets Personnel to get 7 "Free Parking during the day" signs put up in the downtown area. Specifically in Lot 2, Lot 7 and Lot 16.
- 3-8-23 Lt. Johnson presented Run, Hide, Fight to approx. 20 staff at the Country Inn and Suites.
- 3-14-23 Lt. Johnson and Lead Officer Beach attended the Law Enforcement Career Day at UW-Platteville. Approximately 75 other agencies from around the state, Illinois, Iowa and Federal Departments were present as well.
- 3-15-23 Lt. Johnson and School Resource Officer Kramer attended the College and Career Fair at SPASH. At this event the Officers spoke with many students who had questions or interests in Law Enforcement or the Stevens Point Auxiliary Unit.
- 3-28-23 Meeting and training for implementation of online scheduling.

- 3-29-23 Lt. Johnson met with Emergency Response Personnel with Festival Foods and did a walk-through of their facility. During the walk-through safety concerns were discussed as well as future training plans for staff.
- 3-30-23 AC Williams, Mayor Wiza, Chief Kussow, Lt. Johnson, Director Kramer, Lt. James(UWSP), Stacey Duellman (UWSP Director of Center for Prevention), Superintendent Scott Halverson, and the Duffy Family, met to discuss potential safety improvements to Pfiffner Park and combatting underage drinking in Stevens Point.

Calls of Interest:

- 03-30-23, Assist Wisconsin Dept. of Revenue with compliance check at ICON Bar. Violations observed and addressed, no licensed bartender and multiple violations identified by Dept. of Revenue agents.
- 03-28-23 Physical Disturbance, 500 blk of Bliss, male suspect left the scene prior to police arrival. Male suspect was later located and arrested on domestic charges and a warrant.
- 03-26-23 OverDose, 700 blk of Johns Dr. Officer responded to report of a man down outside of the complex. Officers responded and assisted med. Unit with two doses of naran. Further investigation led officers to believe the male used meth and heroin.
- 03-25-23 Stolen Vehicle, Auto Zone, vehicle owner left vehicle running with keys in it unlocked. Further investigation by SPPD Officers located the vehicle. Contact was made with 4 suspects at the residence at which the vehicle was located. During the investigation, an amount of meth was located as well as other drug paraphernalia. All 4 subjects were arrested on Probation Holds.
- 03-25-23 OverDose Death, 700 blk of Johns Dr., Officers responded to investigate a report of possible dead body. Upon further investigation, a deceased male was located in the apartment with evidence of possible Drug related OverDose. SPPD Detectives were called to the scene to investigate.
- 03-25-23 Assist Portage County Sheriff's Office with Vehicle Pursuit when a high speed pursuit entered Stevens Point PD Jurisdiction. The tires of the suspect vehicle were deflated with spike strips. The occupants of the suspect vehicle were taken down at gun point during a high risk vehicle stop.
- 03-23-23 Suspicious Vehicle, Auto Zone, SPPD Officer made contact with a male occupant. The male occupant had several warrants, probation hold, and bail jumping. During police contact, the male suspect admitted to swallowing narcotics that required further medical assistance.
- 03-21-23 Physical disturbance between males, Mead Park, Suspects had left prior to Officers arrival. Later one of the parties presented at the Hospital with injuries and claimed he had been beaten and robbed of his wallet and phone.
- 03-20-23 Assist Med Unit, Officers responded to 1600 Division for a report of a female having a heart attack as result of Meth use. Further investigation with the male associated with her led to his arrest for Felony Bail Jumping.

- 03-12-23 Disturbance, 1000 blk of First St. Female in the hallway causing a disturbance due to her meds being off. Female was arrested on Probation and Parole warrant.

Male victim was later learned to have an active warrant, which was not acted upon due to medical concerns. SPPD Officers later received lifesaving award for their efforts.

Officer escorted the male out of the residence, while doing so he punched a window causing self-injury in need of medical attention. Upon further investigation, the injured subject's mom and mom's boyfriend were arrested for battery and DC charges domestic related. Another male juvenile had a battery warrant from West Allis, which was addressed.
- 03-09-23 Disturbance, Caller reported that he was being followed by a male. Further investigation by Officers of the matter learned the caller had a warrant. The caller was located in the area and fled officers on foot. Suspect was apprehended and taken into custody on warrant and fresh charges.
- 03-07-23 Suspicious, 1430 Torun Rd. Officers responded to male who was under the influence of narcotics. The male injured himself while attempting to enter a trailer that was not his. The male then made entry to a nearby vehicle that was not his. The male was bleeding due to his injuries. A Probation and Parole warrant and fresh charges were not acted upon at that time as medical attention was needed.
- 03-07-23 Disturbance , 1600 Academy Festival Foods, Officers responded to report of male causing a disturbance yelling at himself and fake shooting people with his finger gun. The male was contacted and arrested on disorderly conduct, bail jumping, and probation hold.
- 03-04-23, Missing Person/ Death investigation. SPPD Officer were called to 200 blk of Minnesota for a welfare check on 20 yr old male who was missing. Upon further investigation by patrol and Detectives and active searches of geographical areas it was determined the male may have gone through the Ice on the Wisconsin River. Mutual aid by area departments to include the Marathon Co. Sheriff's Dept. Dive team located the body of the 20 year old male in the Wisconsin River.

- 03-03-23 OverDose, 3000 blk of Michigan Av. Officers investigated and found evidence of a domestic disturbance in which the male caller beat the female who Overdosed. The male was arrested and Jailed.
- 03-01-23 Disturbance after the fact that involved a gun, Female reported that a known male was flashing gun at her when she was following him in Wausau. Female complainant reported finding a gun in her vehicle that was confiscated by officers when she reported to the Police Department to make the complaint. Request for charges sent to District Attorney's office.

March Use of Force Summaries

- 3/9/23 – Officers located an individual walking on the sidewalk who had an actable warrant for their arrest. One Officer tried to get the subject to stop walking by asking the subject a question. The subject did not listen, dropped their belongings and began running from Officers. Officers pursued the subject for a short distance, where the subject stopped, pointed a finger gun at an officer and began to imitate shooting the Officer. Another Officer came up to the other side with their taser deployed. Officers then handcuffed the subject. The subject continued to be verbally resistive and uncooperative. The subject claimed injury and asked for an ambulance. The subject was later taken for medical clearance and once inside the Emergency Room, the subject refused to obey officers and tried to head butt an officer. At this point, the subject was pushed onto the bed. The subject continued being verbally abusive toward Officers. The subject was later taken to jail without incident. The subject claimed injury, but no injuries were located.
- 3/23/23 – Detectives assisted an outside agency with the execution of a narcotics warrant. During the execution Officers pointed their duty weapons at occupants inside the residence until they were taken into custody. No injuries.
- 3/23/23 - Detectives assisted an outside agency with the execution of a 2nd narcotics warrant. During the execution Officers pointed their duty weapons at occupants inside the residence until they were taken into custody. No injuries.
- 3/24/23 – Officers assisted Portage County Sheriff's Office with a high-speed pursuit that came into the City of Stevens Point. The suspect vehicle stopped and SPPD Officers along with PTSO Deputies took the suspects in the vehicle into custody. While the Officers were doing this they pointed their firearms at the suspects.
