2. Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Mrozek moved, seconded by Commissioner Kirschling, to approve the minutes of the March 9, 2023, meeting as presented.

4. Police Chief's Report

- Met with Cole Peterson's parents and Eric Duffy's parents to discuss ways to prevent more drownings in the river.
- Assisted Dept. of Revenue with numerous issues at ICON bar.
- Ready Transport started on April 1st to assist with transports on Emergency Detentions.
- Officer Clark and Officer Wierzba issued Life Saving Award for overdose.

- 3-1-23 Lt. Johnson hosted a pizza party for 23, 6th grade Safety Cadets at Bannach School.
- Lt. Johnson hosted another pizza party for 40 Safety Cadets at Jefferson School. The group consisted of 4th, 5th and 6th graders.

- 3-2-23 Honor Guard assisted with the funeral for former Sheriff Ron Borski.
- 3-2-23 the Police Department met with school and City officials to discuss the traffic concerns around Ben Franklin Middle School before and after school hours. Some suggestions were made as well as alternatives presented to the District.
- 3-3-23 Lt. Uitenbroek and Asst. Chief Williams attended the ICS 300 training for large scale events at Portage County Sheriff's Office Emergency Government.
- 3-6-23 Chief Kussow and Lt. Johnson met with the Portage County Tavern League and after a suggestion was made Lt. Johnson began working with Streets Personnel to get 7 "Free Parking during the day" signs put up in the downtown area. Specifically in Lot 2, Lot 7 and Lot 16.
- 3-8-23 Lt. Johnson presented Run, Hide, Fight to approx. 20 staff at the Country Inn and Suites.
- 3-14-23 Lt. Johnson and Lead Officer Beach attended the Law Enforcement Career Day at UW-Platteville. Approximately 75 other agencies from around the state, Illinois, Iowa and Federal Departments were present as well.
- 3-15-23 Lt. Johnson and School Resource Officer Kramer attended the College and Career Fair at SPASH. At this event the Officers spoke with many students who had questions or interests in Law Enforcement or the Stevens Point Auxiliary Unit.
- 3-28-23 Meeting and training for implementation of online scheduling.
- 3-29-23 Lt. Johnson met with Emergency Response Personnel with Festival Foods and did a walk-through of their facility. During the walk-through safety concerns were discussed as well as future training plans for staff.
- 3-30-23 AC Williams, Mayor Wiza, Chief Kussow, Lt. Johnson, Director Kramer, Lt. James(UWSP), Stacey Duellman (UWSP Director of Center for Prevention), Superintendent Scott Halverson, and the Duffy Family, met to discuss potential safety improvements to Pfiffner Park and combatting underage drinking in Stevens Point.

Calls of Interest:

- 03-30-23, Assist Wisconsin Dept. of Revenue with compliance check at ICON Bar. Violations observed and addressed, no licensed bartender and multiple violations identified by Dept. of Revenue agents.
- 03-28-23 Physical Disturbance, 500 blk of Bliss, male suspect left the scene prior to police arrival. Male suspect was later located and arrested on domestic charges and a warrant.
- 03-26-23 OverDose, 700 blk of Johns Dr. Officer responded to report of a man down outside of the complex. Officers responded and assisted med. Unit with two doses of narcan. Further investigation led officers to believe the male used meth and heroin.
- 03-25-23 Stolen Vehicle, Auto Zone, vehicle owner left vehicle running with keys in it unlocked. Further investigation by SPPD Officers located the vehicle. Contact was made with 4 suspects at the residence at which the vehicle was located. During the investigation, an amount of meth was located as well as other drug paraphernalia. All 4 subjects were arrested on Probation Holds.
- 03-25-23 OverDose Death, 700 blk of Johns Dr., Officers responded to investigate a report of possible dead body. Upon further investigation, a deceased male was located in the apartment with evidence of possible Drug related OverDose. SPPD Detectives were called to the scene to investigate.
- 03-25-23 Assist Portage County Sheriff's Office with Vehicle Pursuit when a high speed pursuit entered Stevens Point PD Jurisdiction. The tires of the suspect vehicle were deflated with spike strips. The occupants of the suspect vehicle were taken down at gun point during a high risk vehicle stop.

- 03-23-23 Suspicious Vehicle, Auto Zone, SPPD Officer made contact with a male occupant. The male occupant had several warrants, probation hold, and bail jumping. During police contact, the male suspect admitted to swallowing narcotics that required further medical assistance.
- 03-21-23 Physical disturbance between males, Mead Park, Suspects had left prior to Officers arrival. Later one of the parties presented at the Hospital with injuries and claimed he had been beaten and robbed of his wallet and phone.
- 03-20-23 Assist Med Unit, Officers responded to 1600 Division for a report of a female having a heart attack as result of Meth use. Further investigation with the male associated with her led to his arrest for Felony Bail Jumping.
- 03-12-23 Disturbance, 1000 blk of First St. Female in the hallway causing a disturbance due to her meds being off. Female was arrested on Probation and Parole warrant.
- 03-15-23 Burglary In Progress, SPPD Officers responded to the Country Club based on a report of suspects stealing which was verified by live video. SPPD Officers arrived first and placed a male in custody who was later turned over to Portage County as the address is in Portage Co. Sheriff's jurisdiction.
- 03-16-23 Physical Disturbance, YMCA, SPPD Officers responded to investigate a report of two male physically fighting. Further investigation led to one male being arrested on Probation Warrant and the other trespassed from the premise.
- 03-14-23 Physical Domestic Disturbance, 500 blk of Johns Dr. Officers were called to the residence for a physical disturbance. Upon further investigation, the female was arrested for battery and domestic Disorderly conduct.
- 03-11-23 OverDose, Econo Lodge, Officer responded to 911 call that a male had overdosed. Officer arrived and provided Narcan and performed CPR. Male victim was later learned to have an active warrant, which was not acted upon due to medical concerns. SPPD Officers later received lifesaving award for their efforts.
- 03-11-23 Physical domestic disturbance, 2000 blk of Ellis, Officer responded to report of family holding a male down. Officer escorted the male out of the residence, while doing so he punched a window causing self-injury in need of medical attention. Upon further investigation, the injured subject's mom and mom's boyfriend were arrested for battery and DC charges domestic related. Another male juvenile had a battery warrant from West Allis, which was addressed.
- 03-09-23 Disturbance, Caller reported that he was being followed by a male. Further investigation by Officers of the matter learned the caller had a warrant. The caller was located in the area and fled officers on foot. Suspect was apprehended and taken into custody on warrant and fresh charges.
- 03-07-23 Suspicious, 1430 Torun Rd. Officers responded to male who was under the influence of narcotics. The male injured himself while attempting to enter a trailer that was not his. The male then made entry to a nearby vehicle that was not his. The male was bleeding due to his injuries. A Probation and Parole warrant and fresh charges were not acted upon at that time as medical attention was needed.
- 03-07-23 Disturbance , 1600 Academy Festival Foods, Officers responded to report of male causing a disturbance yelling at himself and fake shooting people with his finger gun. The male was contacted and arrested on disorderly conduct, bail jumping, and probation hold.
- 03-04-23, Missing Person/ Death investigation. SPPD Officer were called to 200 blk of Minnesota for a welfare check on 20 yr old male who was missing. Upon further investigation by patrol and Detectives and active searches of geographical areas it was determined the male may have gone through the Ice on the Wisconsin River. Mutual aid by area departments to include the Marathon Co. Sheriff's Dept. Dive team located the body of the 20 year old male in the Wisconsin River.

03-03-23 OverDose, 3000 blk of Michigan Av. Officers investigated and found evidence of a domestic disturbance in which the male caller beat the female who Overdosed. The male was arrested and Jailed.

- 03-01-23 Disturbance after the fact that involved a gun, Female reported that a known male was flashing gun at her when she was following him in Wausau. Female complainant reported finding a gun in her vehicle that was confiscated by officers when she reported to the Police Department to make the complaint. Request for charges sent to District Attorney's office.

March Use of Force Summaries

- 3/9/23 – Officers located an individual walking on the sidewalk who had an actable warrant for their arrest. One Officer tried to get the subject to stop walking by asking the subject a question. The subject did not listen, dropped their belongings and began running from Officers. Officers pursued the subject for a short distance, where the subject stopped, pointed a finger gun at an officer and began to imitate shooting the Officer. Another Officer came up to the other side with their taser deployed. Officers then handcuffed the subject. The subject continued to be verbally resistive and uncooperative. The subject claimed injury and asked for an ambulance. The subject was later taken for medical clearance and once inside the Emergency Room, the subject refused to obey officers and tried to head butt an officer. At this point, the subject was pushed onto the bed. The subject continued being verbally abusive toward Officers. The subject was later taken to jail without incident. The subject claimed injury, but no injuries were located.
- 3/23/23 – Detectives assisted an outside agency with the execution of a narcotics warrant. During the execution Officers pointed their duty weapons at occupants inside the residence until they were taken into custody. No injuries.
- 3/23/23 - Detectives assisted an outside agency with the execution of a 2nd narcotics warrant. During the execution Officers pointed their duty weapons at occupants inside the residence until they were taken into custody. No injuries.
- 3/24/23 – Officers assisted Portage County Sheriff's Office with a high-speed pursuit that came into the City of Stevens Point. The suspect vehicle stopped and SPPD Officers along with PTSO Deputies took the suspects in the vehicle into custody. While the Officers were doing this they pointed their firearms at the suspects. No injuries.
- 3/25/23 – Officers were investigating a stolen vehicle complaint. Officers located the stolen vehicle in a garage, occupied by 4 people. Officers surrounded the residence along with the assistance of K9 Barry. Officers had their firearms out and when contact was made with the suspects, the Officers pointed their firearms at the suspects. K9 Barry was held on a leash and was also used as a display of force to get the suspects to cooperate with the Officers. All 4 of the suspects were taken into custody without injury.
- 3/26/23 – A driver fled from a SPPD Officer during a traffic stop. The fleeing driver was located by another Officer nearby. That Officer pointed their taser at the suspect, however the suspect kept running. Eventually the suspect fell and allowed the Officer to catch up. The Officer then tackled the suspect to the ground, where the suspect got some scrapes on their knees. The suspect was later arrested for OWI.
- 3/29/23 – SPPD Officers assisted PTSO Deputies after a suspect fled from a traffic stop in Stevens Point. One SPPD Officer was able to locate and catch up to the suspect and tackled him to the ground. The suspect was then taken into custody without injury to the suspect or the Officer

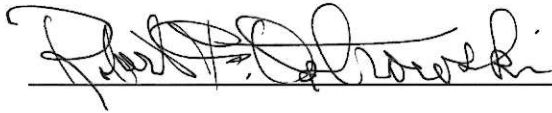
Commissioner Kirschling moved, seconded by Commissioner Zenner, to accept the 2002 Annual Report for the Stevens Point Fire Department.

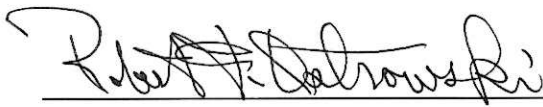

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 45/49

Note of Interest:

- Crossing Guard David Wagner resigned from his position after working since January 13, 2023. He left the position for a better paying job with more hours.
- 4-11-23 Lt. Johnson attended the Fox Valley Technical College Public Safety Career Fair.
- 4-20-23 New Hires, William and Kylie, began their pre-employment testing for expected start date of 5-22-23.
- 4-22-23 Ofc. Schultz participated in the Annual Spring Prescription Drug Take-back. Over a 1,000 pounds of unused, expired or unwanted prescription drugs were disposed of through the program in Portage County.
- 4-24-23 Ast. Chief Williams attended her 5th week of Command College.
- Throughout the month of April, several members from SPPD observed and critiqued lockdown drills at Pacelli High School, St. Peter's Middle School, St. Stephen's Elementary School, St. Paul's Elementary School, SPASH and other schools within the district.
- 4-24-23 Ofc. Stankowski and Lt. Johnson participated in a bike rodeo at Madison Elementary School on April 24th. Well over 50 students participated in the event. Ofc. Stankowski showed off one of SPPD's Bike Patrol Bicycles.
- 4-25-23 Lt. Johnson, Lt. Brooks, Lt. Moss and Ofc. Brooks continue to work closely with SPFD, Plover PD, PTSO and other agencies to include the Stevens Point School District on Rescue Task Force Training scheduled in June 2023.
- 4-27-23 Lt. Johnson met with area officials for the first TRIAD(SPPD, PTSO and Seniors) Meeting, after the Committee folded during COVID. TRIAD's goal is to enhance the quality of life of older adults, through education and active participation in statewide

programs and projects, by partnering with law enforcement, senior serving agencies and seniors to help reduce criminal victimization of older adults.

Calls of Interest:

- **04-23-23 Traffic Stop with Drug Seizure-** SPPD Officer conducted a traffic stop west side, and ended up finding 2 pounds of THC and THC products. Lots of gummies and cartridges. Driver stated he purchased out of state for personal use. Driver in jail, on charges.
- **04-22-23 OverDose,** Officer responded with Med unit to an address at 2600 blk Bush St. to assist with a person who had consumed alcohol and sleeping pills. Subject transported medically.
- **04-21-23 Welfare Check/ Drug arrest,** Officers were dispatched to North Point Pub to check the welfare of male passed out in vehicle. Officers observed drug paraphernalia in plain view and subsequent search located 10 grams of possible heroin or fentanyl. Also located were scales, baggies, and cash. Driver was arrested for possession with intent to deliver and P&P Hold.
- **04-21-23 Driving Complaint,** PTSO Deputy and SPPD Officer conducted a traffic stop on suspect vehicle in driving complaint. Driver of suspect vehicle would not cooperate or get out of the vehicle. The driver ingested unknown substance in front of officers, a med unit was requested. Search of vehicle located suspected meth and us currency.
- **04-21-23 Suspicious Person,** Officers responded to 1000 blk Franklin for report of unknown male tearing down a garden shed. Male was disoriented possibly under the influence. Male became uncooperative with officers and took a fighting stance. Male was tased and hand cuffed. Upon medical clearance the male was taken to jail.
- **04-19-23 Death Investigation,** SPPD Officers responded to Schmeekle Reserve to investigate a death. SPPD Detectives responded as well as the medical examiner. Case turned over to UWSP PD.
- **04-18-23 Disturbance,** SPPD Officers responded to physical disturbance between father and son. Son was arrested for strangulation, battery. Son initially removed his ankle monitor, however he was located by Officers in a nearby park.
- **04-17-23 Driving complaint,** SPPD Officer responded to area of Rogan's shoes to investigate a driving complaint. The suspect vehicle was located and stopped. Driver refused field sobriety testing, .312 BAC which required further medical clearance prior to going to jail.
- **04-17-23 Suspicious,** SPPD Officers responded to area of 100 blk Minnesota Av. to investigate report of male in black jacket banging on doors at multiple residence waking people up. The male was contacted by Officers and later taken into custody on P&P hold.

- **04-01-23 possible bomb**, 1700 blk Oak St. caller reported finding a possible WW2 bomb under the floor. Marathon Bomb Squad reported to remove the item.

- 4-7-23 – SPPD was involved in an Officer Involved Shooting. Division of Criminal Investigations is investigating this incident.
- 4-21-23 – SPPD Officers responded to a residence where a male was trespassing and tearing down a shed that did not belong to the person. Upon contact with the person, they appeared under the influence of drugs and were not making sense. During the entire contact the suspect was uncooperative, yelling, making

weird noises and swearing at the Officers. Once the Officers told the suspect they were not free to leave, the suspect turned around, clenched his fist and squared off with an Officer. The suspect was tased. The suspect fell to ground and the Officers handcuffed the suspect. The suspect requested an ambulance, but had no injuries.
