May Use of Force Summaries

- 5-5-23 – SPPD Officers were pursuing a moped in the City of Stevens Point. The moped failed to stop for Officers and fled the area. Officers did not pursue any further due to unsafe driving by the moped. The moped later crashed in someone's backyard and police were notified. The suspect had fled on foot at this time and a SPPD Officer located the suspect running. The Officer pointed their firearm at the suspect and advised the suspect to stop. The suspect was taken into custody without incident or injury.
- 5-9-23 – SPPD Officers were called to a residence for a welfare check on a person who had been cutting themselves with a razor blade. Once Officers arrived the subject grabbed a knife and would not show Officers their hands. One Officer drew their firearm and pointed it at the subject while the other Officer drew their Taser. The subject eventually went onto the roof and threatened suicide, only to drop the knife and surrender to police after some time. The subject was taken into protective custody without injury.

Vaping has been a significant issue all year- most vapes we recover now seem to be THC vapes, and we are also running into THC wax on a regular basis. I had two incidents reported this month where we believe students consumed edible gummies and then had bad reactions to them. In the first incident, the student purchased the gummy at school, consumed it outside of school, and it was later reported by the parent. The second incident happened at project graduation when three students vomited within a half hour of each other, and all ended up getting transported to the hospital.

Ben Franklin conducted 1 Long Fire Drill and 1 Lockdown Drill in May, and we assisted with other elementary schools. We had a County-wide Truancy meeting at the Bliss Center that is mandated by statute that hasn't happened since before Covid that was very informative for all involved. We wrapped up the Police Outreach Program with lessons 3&4 involving Anger Management and Conflict Resolution as well as Drug ID, awareness, and the social consequences. Overall, we saw an increase in the presence of THC use being reported in school and the use of it being confirmed by multiple students.

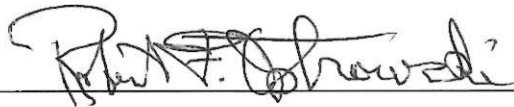

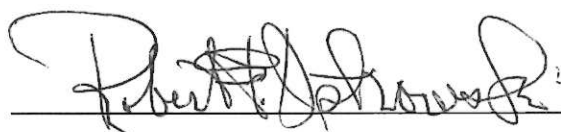

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 45/49

Note of Interest:

- June was the start of the Law Enforcement Speed Grant, this grant is in cooperation with the Portage County Sheriff's Office and Plover PD.
- **6-2-23/6-5-23/6-8-23** - Rescue Task Force Training. Approx. 120 police Officers from 5 different agencies, 100+ Fire Fighters/paramedics/first responders from 5+ agencies and well over 200 teachers or staff members from the 3 school districts were trained participated in the training over the 3 days. There were also over 100 people who volunteered their time to act as role players/victims during the scenarios across the 3 days. The training consisted of presentations, breakout groups and a large-scale scenario, where everyone was involved. Initial feedback is that the training was huge success and a big opportunity for everyone involved to learn. The goal is for each group to go back and debrief and discuss what works well and what doesn't and to get better and be more prepared. Another goal is to continue to train with the school districts, whether it be on in-service days, small presentations or more trainings like this, in the next several years.
- **6-3-23** – Lead Officer Nissen helped organize and participated in the Cops-n-bobbers event at Lake Pacawa, Plover, WI.
- **6-6-23** – Honor Guard presented the colors for the WI IAAI Fire Conference at the Holiday Inn and Assistant Chief Rottier welcomed the participants to the City.
- **6-9-23** – Assistant Chief Williams graduated from Command College with a degree as a Certified Public Manager from UW Madison.
- **6-9-23** - Lt. Johnson and Det. Drossel were able to fly to the Challenge Academy at Fort McCoy in a Blackhawk II helicopter along with several members from several school districts. While at the Academy they were given a tour by a cadet and also given a

presentation about the academy and the history behind it. The purpose of the tour was so we can be better informed and able to possibly refer kids who are struggling to the program.

- **6-14-23** – Stevens Point/Plover SWAT team completed their annual tryouts.
- **6-15-23** – Ofc. Kristi Ahrens, Linda Froehlich NAMI, Amy Pond (PCHHS) and Jessica Hake (PCHHS) were honored by the WI chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness for becoming a certified CPI (Crisis Intervention Partner). A team that works cooperatively to train non-sworn citizen members and business leaders how to spot a mental illness crisis and de-escalate it.
- **6-20-23** – Lt. Uitenbroek successfully completed probationary period and is now permanent status.
- **6-20-23** - Ofc. Radsek and Lt. Johnson gave a tour of the Police Department to 11 kids with the Madison View Boys and Girls Club. The kids got to see the inner workings of the PD, ask questions, get a tour of a police car and meet K9 Willow.
- **6-26-23** – USGA Senior Open event which will run through July 2, 2023.
- **6-29-23** – Officer Alan Raasoch retires after 26+ years of service with the Stevens Point Police Department and to the City of Stevens Point.
- **6-30-23** – Riverfront Rendezvous

Calls of Interest:

06-19-23, One Vehicle Roll Over Church and Centerpoint, The crash vehicle took corner too fast and rolled. Driver and occupants fled the scene. Some of the occupants returned to the scene at which time, a parent of one of the occupants (known to L.E. based on prior contacts) physically challenged officer and was arrested for D.C and resisting. Upon further investigation all occupants were identified and medically treated for injuries sustained in the crash. One of the juvenile occupants was a listed runaway.

06-16-23, Disturbance, 1000 blk of Park St. Officers were called to investigate a domestic disturbance. Upon further investigation, it was discovered the male had busted out several windows while making threats to the female. The male was later contacted and arrested.

06-14-23 Physical Disturbance, 1100 blk of Main St for a domestic between Male and Female residents. Male trashed a light and tossed a computer against the wall. Initially barricaded himself in his room with the couch up against the door. Didn't want to come out at first, but eventually did. Male was not very cooperative like usual. Male was arrested for domestic disorderly conduct and damage to property, 3 counts of misdemeanor bail jumping and 1 count of felony bail jumping.

06-14-23 Restraining Order Violation, 200 blk of Union, Ex- husband entered the property. Female called to report the violation. Ex-husband was arrested on TRO violation.

06-13-23, Assist Portage County Sheriff's Office and Division of Criminal Investigations with Arson investigation.

06-13-23 Welfare Check, 400 blk of West St N, Officers investigate report of three young children left home alone. Upon further investigation, three children ages 8, 6, and 3 were left unattended at home by mom. CPS contacted and responded to location. Family is already working with CPS.

06-13-23 Disturbance Elbow room, SPPD Officers responded to report of black female who punched a patron, was kicked out by staff and later urinated on the sidewalk. While Officers were enroute, the female left the area in a vehicle with no lights on at night. A SPPD Officer passed the suspect vehicle which then turn 180 degrees around driving towards the police squad stopping approx.. 3 ft in front. The female suspect exited her vehicle and walked towards officers. The female was contacted by officers at which point the suspect physically resisted officers, grabbing a male officer on the groin causing pain. The female suspect appeared to be under the influence and was arrested for OWI and resisting.

06-13-23, Welfare Check, Officers checked the welfare of a male who became upset after playing video game fortnite. The male reportedly grabbed a knife to cut himself as he lost the game. The knife was put away prior to officer arrival. Safety plan put in place by Green Bay Crisis.

06-13-23 Assault Robbery, Report by a female who was drug out of her vehicle by her hair and had her money, keys, and other items taken. A group of 5-6 suspects participated in the assault. The incident was captured on downtown cameras. Vehicle keys recovered and the investigation is still pending.

06-12-23 Stolen Vehicle, complainant reported his vehicle stole from the area by Pfiffner park. Use of the FLOCK cameras located the vehicle traveling S/B on Post road. Waupaca PD located the vehicle which was driven by 16 year old runaway from Green Bay.

06-11-23 Traffic stop, Male driver was stopped for traffic violation by SPPD Officer. Male driver was later arrested on Marathon Co. Warrant. Vehicle was searched as a strong odor of marijuana was observed. During the search a rifle was located. The male driver had conditions of bond not to possess firearms due to domestic abuse injunction.

06-09-23 Assist DNR, SPPD Officer was able to assist DNR with vehicle lic. Plate from Flock cameras. The suspect vehicle was identified in relation to an arson investigation.

06-08-23, Warrant, Flock camera alert notified SPPD officers of a vehicle with Registered Owner with warrant. SPPD Officers located vehicle and later arrested the male.

06-07-23 Disturbance, 5110 Main after the fact report by female who reported the male boyfriend beat her after an argument. The male was kicked out of the hotel due to the disturbance by staff. Officers later located and arrested the male.

06-01-23, Death Investigation, SPPD Officers responded to Water St. residence at which adult son located father decease of an apparent self-inflicted gun shot wound. Detectives requested to process the scene and investigate.

June Use of Force Summaries

- **6/13/23** – Officers were called to the area of the square for a suspect who had created a disturbance downtown and then left in a vehicle, striking two other parked vehicles. The vehicle was located and stopped after almost colliding head on with a squad car. The suspect approached Officers yelling at them and ignoring their commands. One SPPD Officer drew their firearm and held it at the

low ready while commanding the suspect to the ground. Once on the ground the suspect resisted Officer's attempts to get handcuffs on them and at one point grabbed one Officer's groin, causing that Officer pain. The Officer delivered 3 elbow strikes to the suspect's lower back to get them to stop this, which was successful. The suspect was then handcuffed. Both Officers received scratches and scrapes to their knees, hands and arm, but the injuries were not significant. The suspect was arrested for Operating while impaired along with battery to Law Enforcement Officer and other charges.

- **6/14/23** – SPPD Officers were called to a residence for a domestic disturbance. The suspect had barricaded inside a bedroom. When Officers were able to get the bedroom door ajar, they noticed the suspect with their arms crossed. One Officer removed their taser from the holster and held it at the low-ready position as they issued commands to the suspect. The suspect eventually came out of the room and was handcuffed. No injuries.
- **6/16/23** – SPPD Officers were investigating a domestic abuse incident. Officers located the suspect hiding in a garage and was failing to obey Officer's orders. K9 Barry was present, and the handler gave commands to the suspect, advising if the suspect did not follow the commands, they may be bitten. The suspect then followed the commands and was taken into custody without incident or injury.
- **6/17/23** – Officers from SPPD were investigating a car accident when a parent of one of the involved occupants arrived on scene and became aggressive towards Officers. The parent chest bumped the Officer and squared off to fight them. The Officers were able to grab the suspect, advising the suspect they were under arrest and the suspect continued to pull away. The Officers were forced to put the suspect to the ground, face down. While on the ground the suspect still tried to resist, but Officers were able to get the suspect handcuffed. During the struggle on the ground, two of the Officers that used force were also injured. They received scrapes to their knees and hands. The injuries were minor. The suspect was not injured.
