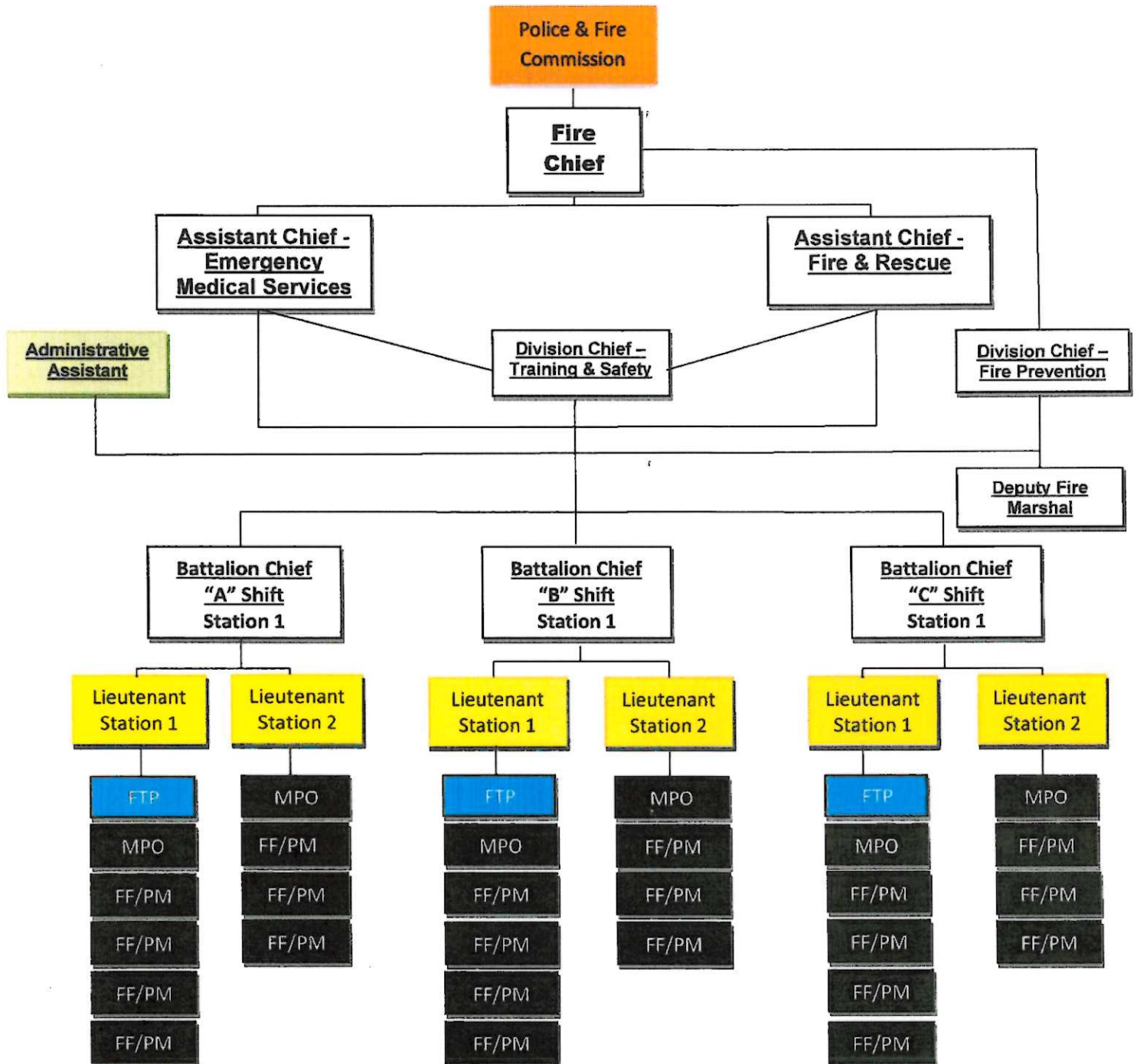

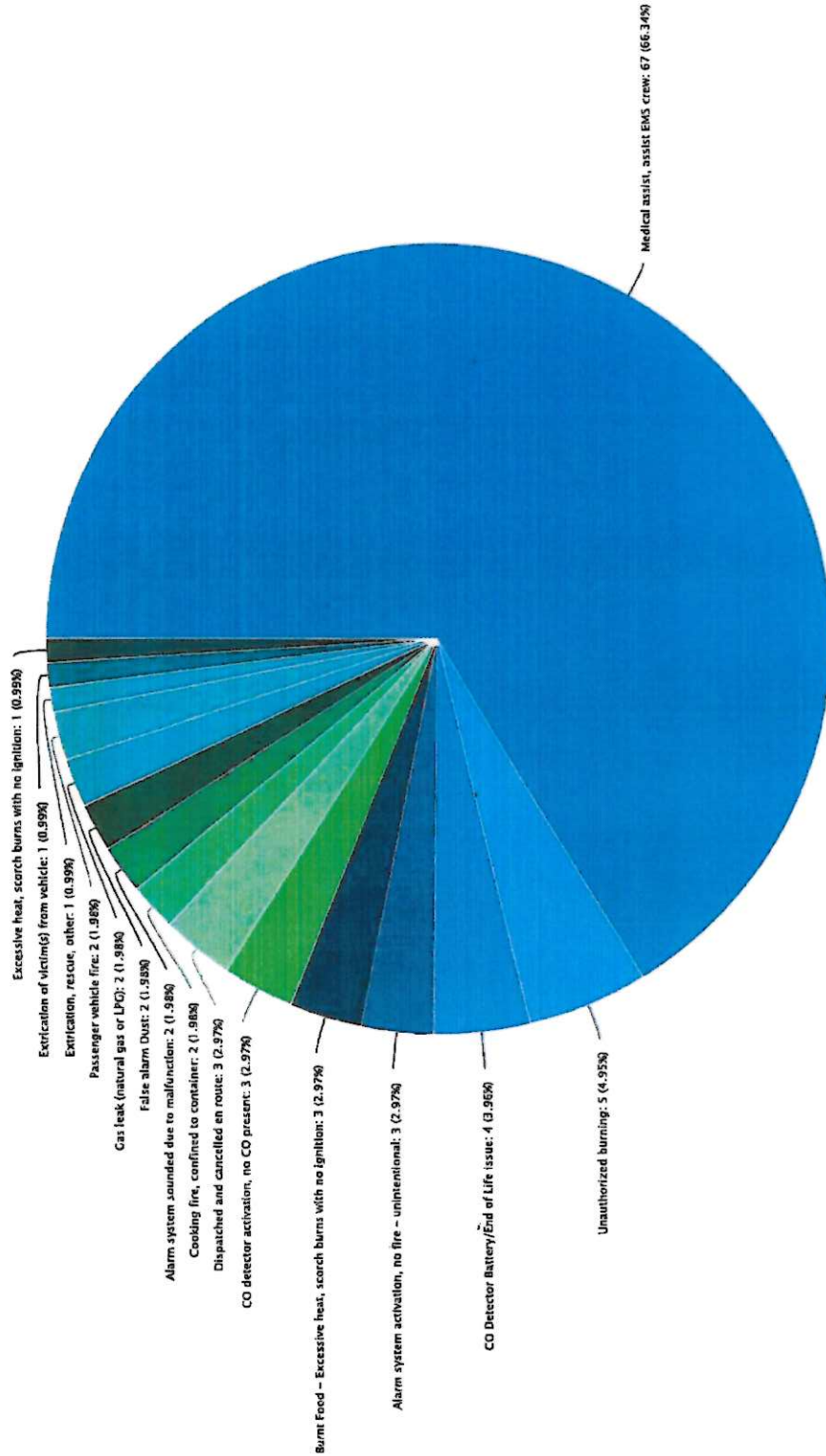

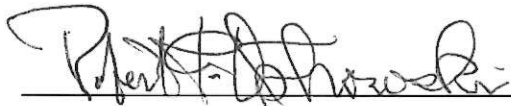

- 11-9-23 Portage County Citizens Academy graduation.
- 11-15-23 Officer Ross Wierzba selected as Lead Officer due to Officer Clark's resignation.

November Use of Force Summaries

- 10/27/2023 – SPPD Detectives assisted an outside agency with a vehicle take-down associated with narcotics. The vehicle was stopped by Officers and as they were ordering the suspect from the vehicle, they had their weapons pointed at the suspect. The suspect was taken into custody without incident.
- 11/4/2023 – A SPPD Officer was assisting an Officer from another jurisdiction at a traffic stop. The driver of the vehicle was required to get out of the vehicle so the Officers could complete a legal search for narcotics inside the vehicle. The driver refused to get out and resisted the Officer's efforts to get her out. The SPPD Officer was forced to apply pressure to the wrist area while pulling the driver from the vehicle. Once on the ground the driver continued to resist and attempt to kick the Officers. More pressure was applied to the wrist until the subject was handcuffed without injury.

- 11/11/2023 – SPPD Officers attempted to stop a vehicle associated with a felony bail jumping and retail theft case. The vehicle did not stop for Officers and led Officers on a high-speed chase out of town. The driver eventually ran from the vehicle and the passenger was taken into custody at a high-risk stop. While both subjects were taken into custody, Officers pointed their firearms at the vehicle and the occupants. No injuries.
- 11/11/2023 – SPPD Officer attempted to stop a vehicle for a minor infraction. The vehicle fled from the Officer and eventually got away. Officers located the vehicle after it had disabled itself due to a crash nearby and no one inside. A person who lives nearby called 911 and advised the Officers someone was hiding in their garage. When Officers arrived the suspect in the garage closed the door and refused to cooperate. Officers had pointed their firearms at the suspect. Once the door was opened the suspect refused to comply with orders and was taken to the ground and handcuffed and later jailed. No injuries, however, there was damage done to the doors to the garage as Officers tried to get inside.
- 11/12/2023 – SPPD Officers had stopped a suspect reckless driver/Operating while under the influence. The driver was less than cooperative and refused to exit the vehicle after almost striking pedestrians. Due to the subject's movements in the vehicle, the Officer grabbed the suspect's arm and removed the suspect from the vehicle, directly to the ground. The suspect was handcuffed at this time. After the suspect was arrested for Operating while under the influence, the Officer's attempted to put the suspect in the squad car and the suspect resisted. The Officer's attempted to apply pressure to the suspect's wrists, however the suspect pulled away and fell, hitting their head. The suspect continued to resist throughout the contact and at one point kicked an Officer in the groin. The suspect was jailed.

One occupant was inside, and the weapon was pointed at them until they were taken into custody without incident.

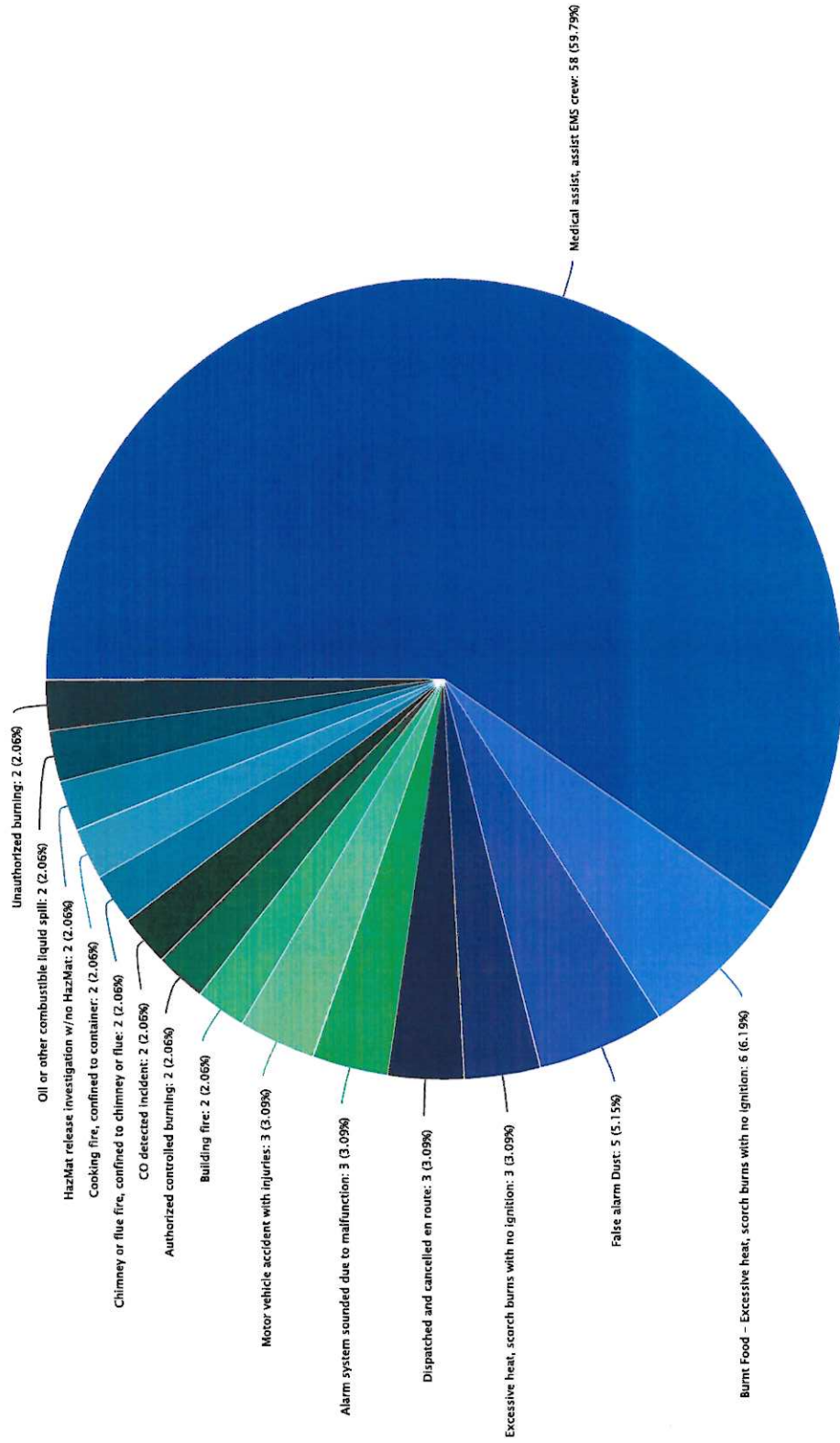
