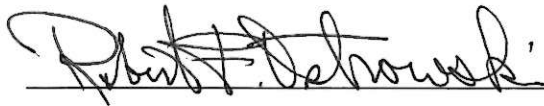

Subject: Wis Dot Predictive Analytics Crash Reduction Project

Portage County Highway Traffic Safety Commission; Predictive Analytics; Speed enforcement and Crash reduction

Stevens Point Police Department is proposing goals of reducing speed related crashes and increase pedestrian safety in school zones and speed enforcement targeted areas. More specifically in elementary school crossing zones staffed and unstaffed by crossing guards.

Data Collection

Stevens Point PD will work to collect speed data for identified speed problem areas in the community using predictive analytics, other local data sources, as well as identified school zones. Current problem areas for speed are State Hwy 66 East bound near CO. Hwy HH into Stevens Point from Wisconsin Rapids, West River Dr. between railroad tracks and Co Hwy HH (pedestrian fatality)

-Non-display Phase

Collect speed data with portable speed boards and speed trailer with no visual display for specified period between one to two weeks depending on the start date of the project.

-Display Phase

Collect speed data with portable speed boards and speed trailer with visual speed display for a similar specified period between one to two weeks.

-Non-display with enforcement

Collect speed data with portable speed boards and speed trailer with no visual display for specified period between one to two weeks. Introduce speed enforcement funded by BOTS speed grant and or straight time speed enforcement.

--Non-display Phase

Collect data with portable speed boards and speed trailer with no visual display for specified period between one to two weeks in order to gauge project effectiveness.

Solution Techniques

Increased speed awareness with speed boards/ speed trailer set in display mode combined with increased police presence. Stevens Point PD is participating in BOTS traffic enforcement grants with 25% straight time enforcement. Currently SPPD is participating in BOTS Grants for OWI, Seat Belt, and Speed. With current staffing challenges, we are not seeking additional funds for enforcement as we had declined additional BOTS funding for bicycle/pedestrian enforcement grants. Speed boards/message signs are a way to address speed concerns and not overtask limited staffing resources.

We would also incorporate a social media campaign to highlight speed enforcement areas to increase the public's awareness.

(Language Pending approval)

This project was presented to the Portage County Traffic Safety Commission on June, 4, 2024. The TSC analyzed and endorsed this proposal, approving its submission to Wis DOT.

Activities:

- Purchase and deploy pole mounted speed boards in addition to a mobile/stationary speed display/message board display unit.
- Conduct speed enforcement in targeted areas with BOTS speed enforcement grant staffing.
- Conduct a social media awareness campaign, as well as traditional press releases, for targeted speed enforcement areas.

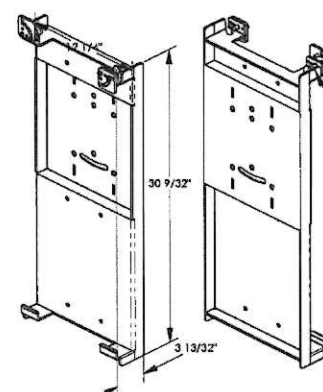
SpeedAlert 24 Mounting Hole Positions

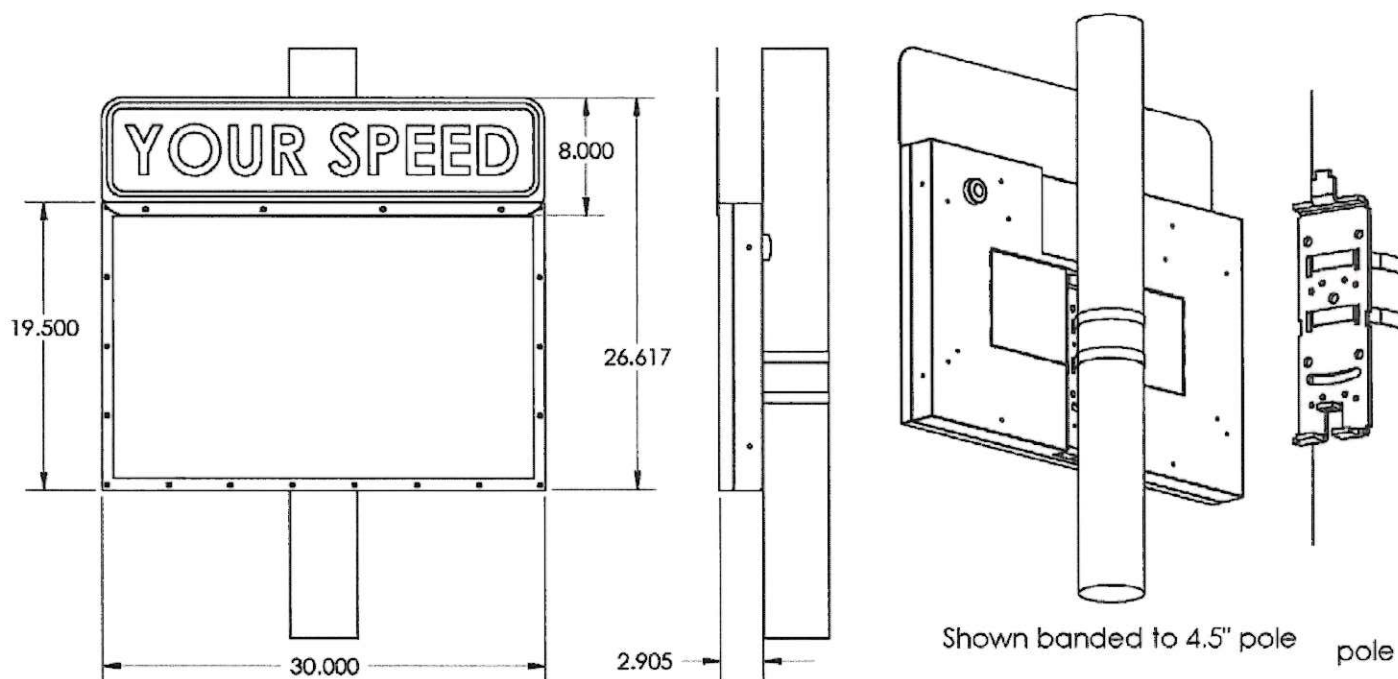

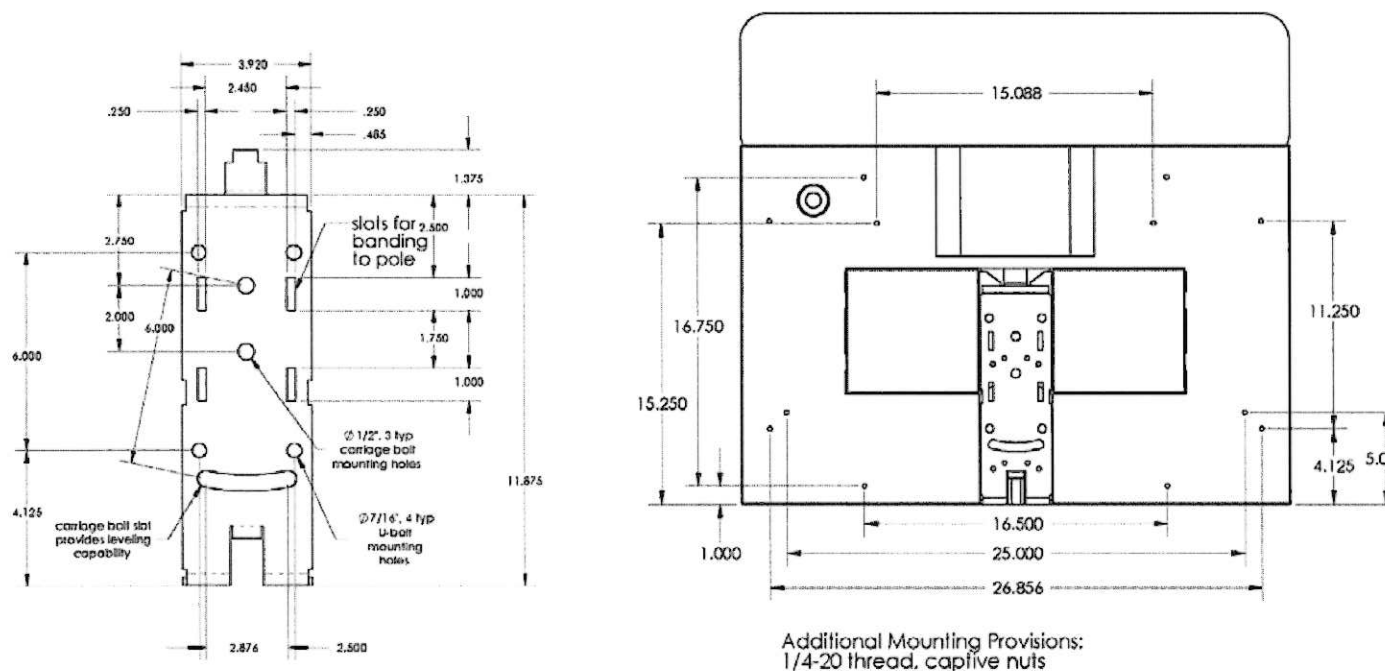

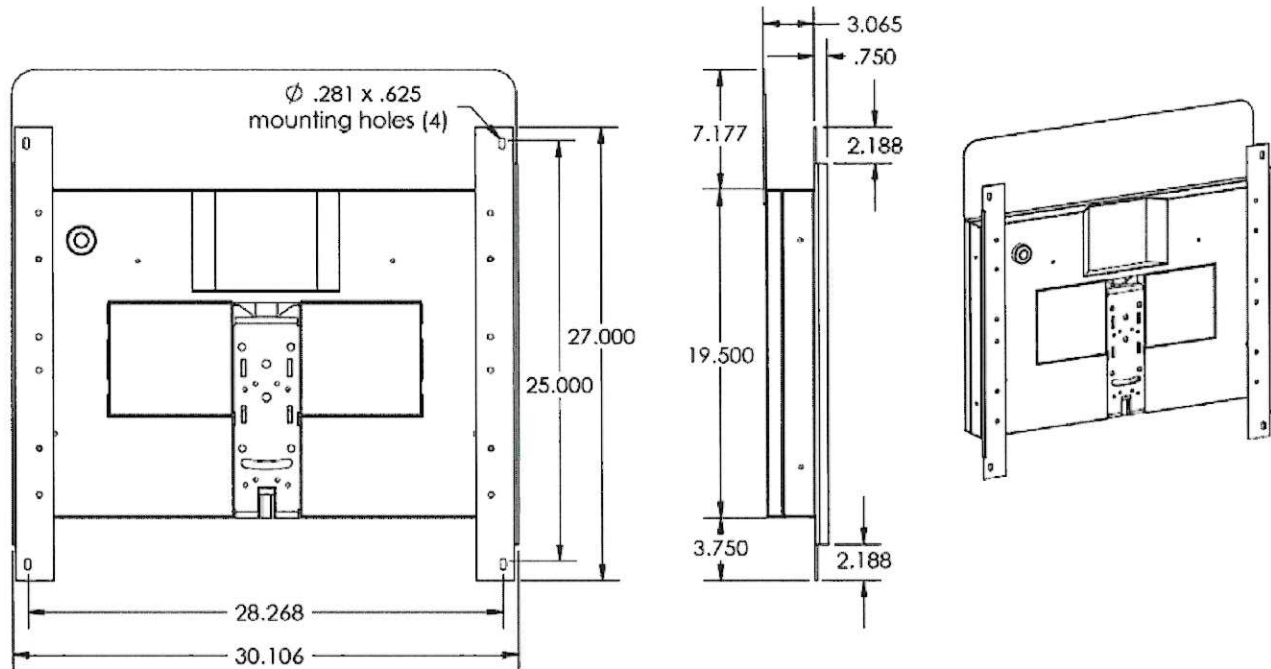

April Use of Force Summaries

- 4-6-24 – Officers were attempting to arrest a subject wanted on felony charges. The subject had been seen entering an upstairs apartment and ignored Officers commands to stop. Officers made entry into the residence with their guns drawn and later located the suspect in the bathroom, along with two other people inside the residence. The wanted subject was arrested and later jailed. No injuries.
- 4-14-24 – Officers were dealing with an intoxicated subject downtown, who would not leave the area and kept trying to fight with people. At one point the subject, very large in stature, walked towards the Officer, who was alone. The Officer, feeling threatened, pulled their Taser and pointed it at the subject. The subject begged the Officer to tase them but stopped walking at them and de-escalated. The Officer holstered the taser. A short while later, the same suspect came back and tried fighting with others and was arrested and jailed without incident.
- 4-17-24 – Officers executed a search warrant at a residence on the northside of Stevens Point. During the execution, Officers had their pistols and rifles out as they cleared the residence. Several people were inside the residence and were all taken into custody without incident. No Injuries.
- 4-19-24 – Officers had arrested a subject and while walking to the squad car, the subject decided to resist and tried pulling away. The Officers were forced to take the subject to the ground, who continued to try and resist. One Officer used a pressure point on the subject to get them to stop resisting, which was effective. When officers arrived on scene, two had their patrol rifles slung and at the ready. Officers made contact with one of the parties involved and there were no weapons. 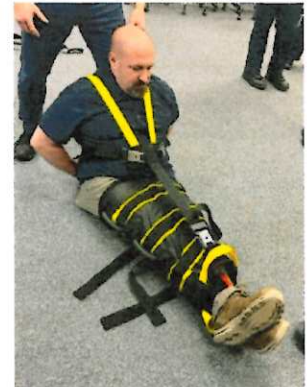

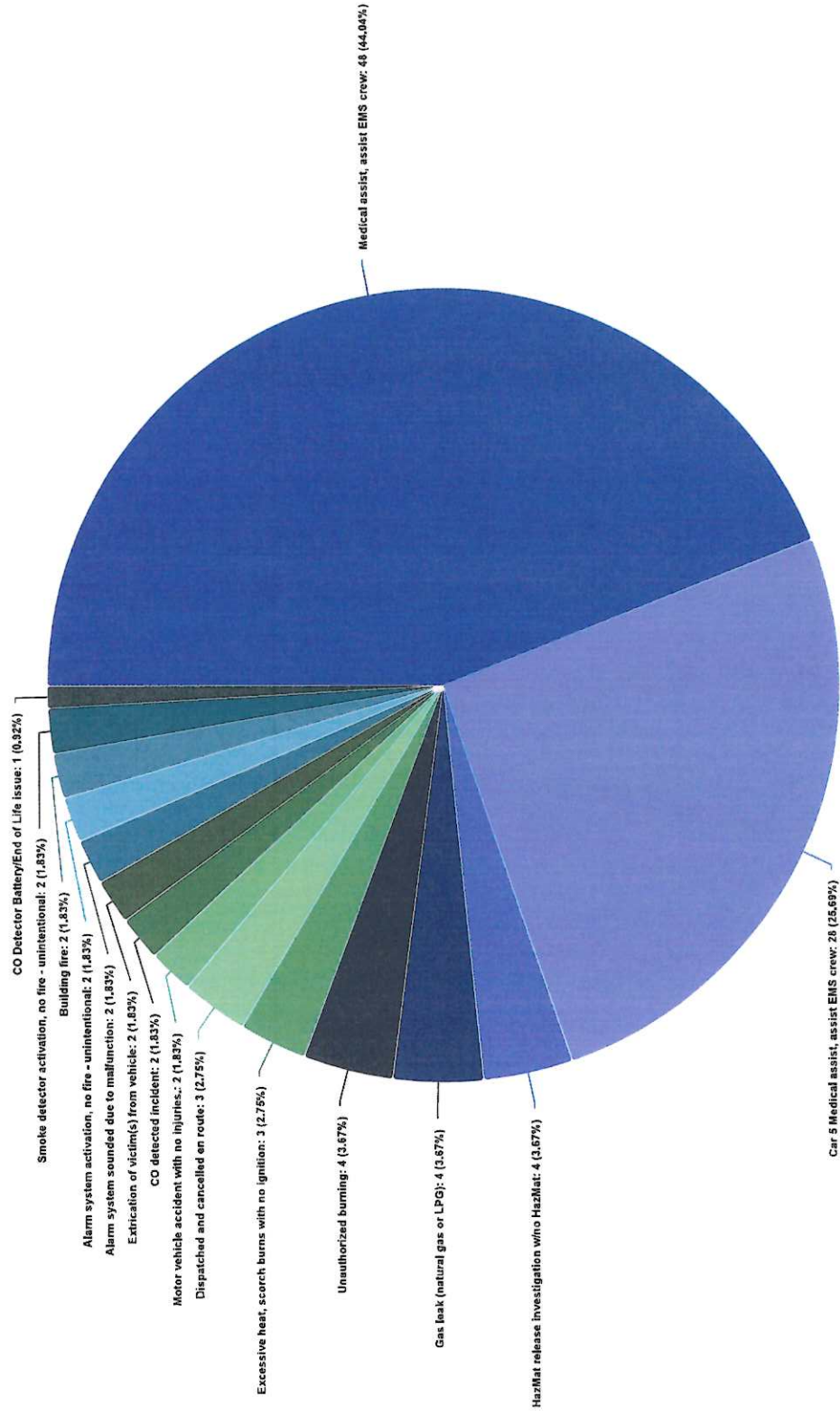
