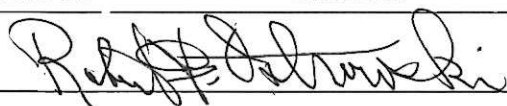

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 46/49 (4 currently in the academy)

Note of Interest:

- Sept. 3rd – Lt. Johnson gave a tour to an "intro to Criminal Justice" class from Mid-State Technical College.
- Sept. 6th – Lt. Johnson and Ast. Chief Rottier interviewed applicants for night time Community Service Officer – Hired Auxiliary member, Devon Kawalski
- Sept. 9th – SPPD hosted Department of Justice First Line Supervisor training at the PD – 40 students (35 in person – 5 virtual) – 2 weeks
- Sept. 11th – SPPD purchased two new drones. One for interior searches and one for exterior searches. Thank Ofc. Plummer for completing the research on this incredible new tool for the PD.
- Sept. – Lt. Johnson, Ofc. Hughes and Sara Theroux (City Production Specialist) worked with Canadian National to create a railway safety video for Rail Safety Week (Sept. 23-27)
- Sept. 17th – Lt. Johnson had an informational table at the Children's Discovery Center Safety Event. (spoke with youths about begin safe and stranger danger)
- Sept. 18th - Det. Poeschel, SRO Kamer, SRO Yang, SRO Marchel and Lt. Johnson attended the first of four, parent engagement forums, focusing on bullying and cyberbullying at the SPASH library. The above officers have been working with the Stevens Point School District preparing this forum to address this problem. The next forum is on Oct. 16th at 6 pm at the SPASH library.
- Sept. 18th - Ofc. Hughes and Lt. Johnson had a table at the UWSP major career fair. The officers spent 4 hours speaking with students about a career in law enforcement and what SPPD has to offer. Ofc. Hughes was recruited last year at this job fair as a UWSP student.

- Sept. 19th – Lead Ofc. Cole O’Neil, Ast. Chief Williams and Chief Kussow worked with Gamber Johnson for a promotional taping for the products they offer in our squads.

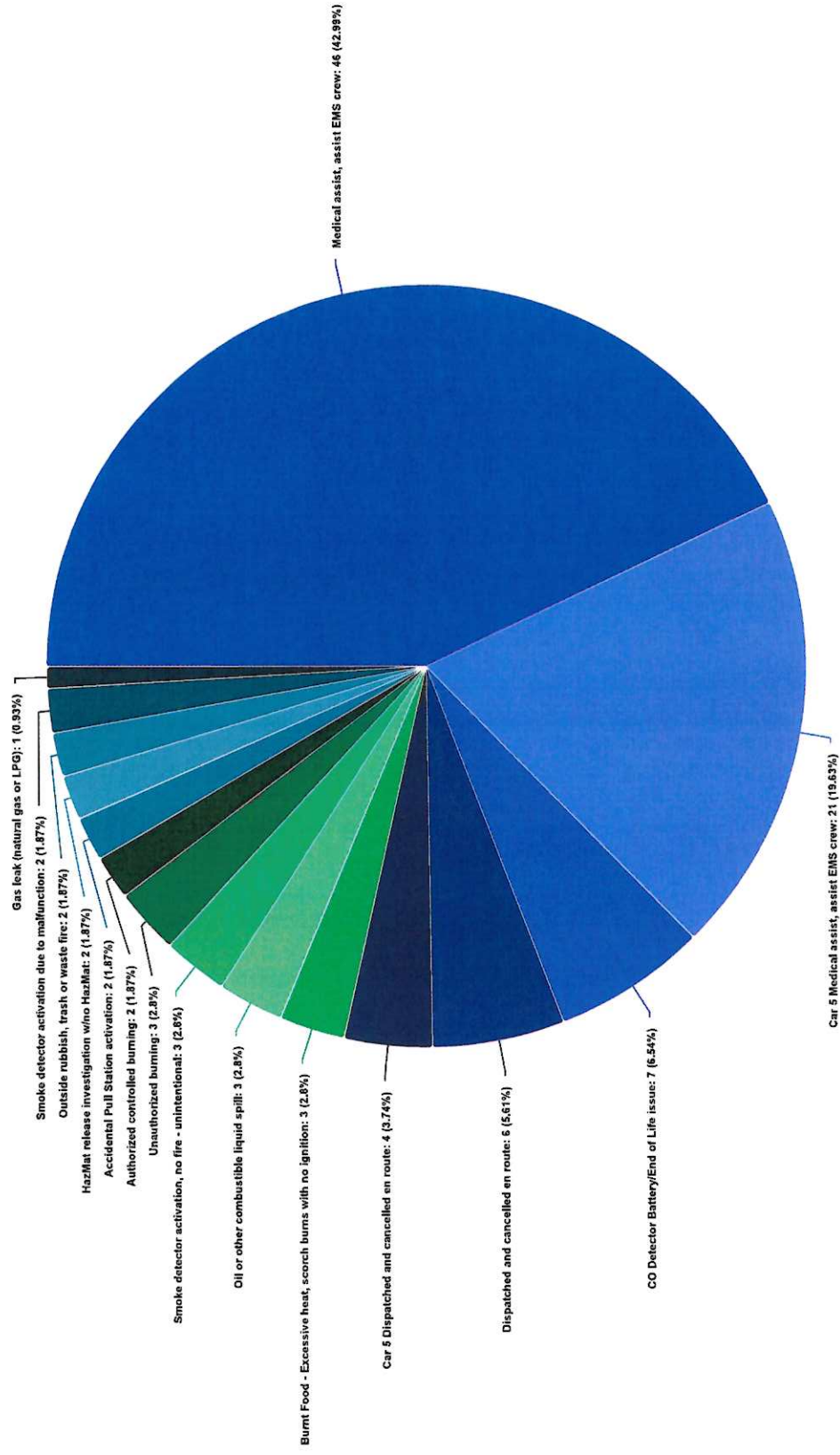
