2. License List

Ald. Nebel **moved**, Ald. Leek seconded, to approve the temporary Class "B" for Pacelli Catholic School's Picnic License.

Ald. Fishler **moved**, Ald. Kneebone seconded, to approve the extension of licensed premise.

3. Overnight Street Parking

Ald. Jennings suspended the discussion until after the Special Common Council meeting.

4. Ordinance Amendment - Section 16.12 (1)(h)1 - Temporarily Waive Sidewalk Cafe Vending Equipment Removal Requirements

Ald. Nebel **moved**, Ald. Fishler seconded, to approve the ordinance amendment with the addition of requiring the temporary waived sidewalk cafe vending equipment to be cabled by 10:00 p.m.

Bob Woehr, 727 Second Street, said the current ordinance regarding sidewalk cafes require that they stop operation at 11:00 p.m. He encouraged Council members to do their homework before they start making decisions.

Ald. Jennings **recessed** the Public Policy and General Government meeting at 6:50 p.m.

Ald. Jennings **called** the Public Policy and General Government meeting back to order at 6:52 p.m.

Ald. Nebel **moved**, Ald. Fishler seconded, to amend the motion to change the time to 11:00 p.m. rather than 10:00 p.m.

Call for the vote: ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

5. Ordinance Amendment - Section 2.28 Public Protection Committee Renamed Public Policy and General Government

Ald. Cindy Nebel **moved**, Ald. Keely Fishler seconded, to approve the change of the name from Public Protection to the new name of Public Policy and General Government.

Call for the vote: ayes, all; nays, none; motion carried.

6. 3. Overnight Street Parking Continued.

Lisa Peters, 3308 Dixon Street, explained the parking issues they have been having. She said they were previously able to park on a gravel road near the apartment complex and now they cannot and it is raising concerns with parking.

Nancy Roppe, 925 Smith Street, said she is opposed to the overnight parking changes. She said if this goes through the burden goes from the rental property owners to the police and streets departments, and the tax payers.

Joe Roppe, 925 Smith Street, explained the initial request for the proposal of over night parking. He provided photos of what will happen if overnight parking is allowed.

Denise, 3308 Dixon Street, showed the Committee where the vehicles park on the property and where the City is currently allowing the landlord to put in additional parking.

Ald. Zarazua read a letter from Trevor Roark, 601 Washington Avenue, who wrote against the overnight parking and said it needs to be priced correctly.

Bob Woehr, 727 Second Street, said this needs to be addressed by staff and then can be amended by Council if they see fit.

Ald. Jennings said she received 13 letters in opposition of this.

Ald. Kneebone **moved**, to rescind overnight parking restrictions until October 1st. Due to the lack of a second the motion failed.

The committee took no action and sent it back to staff to come up with an appeal process for overnight parking for people who need it.
