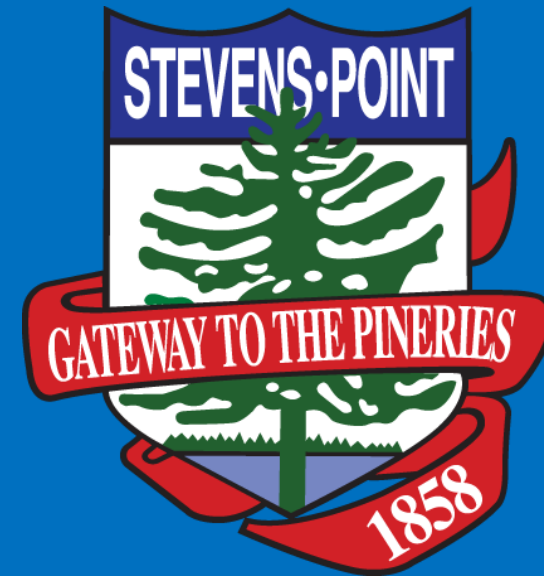

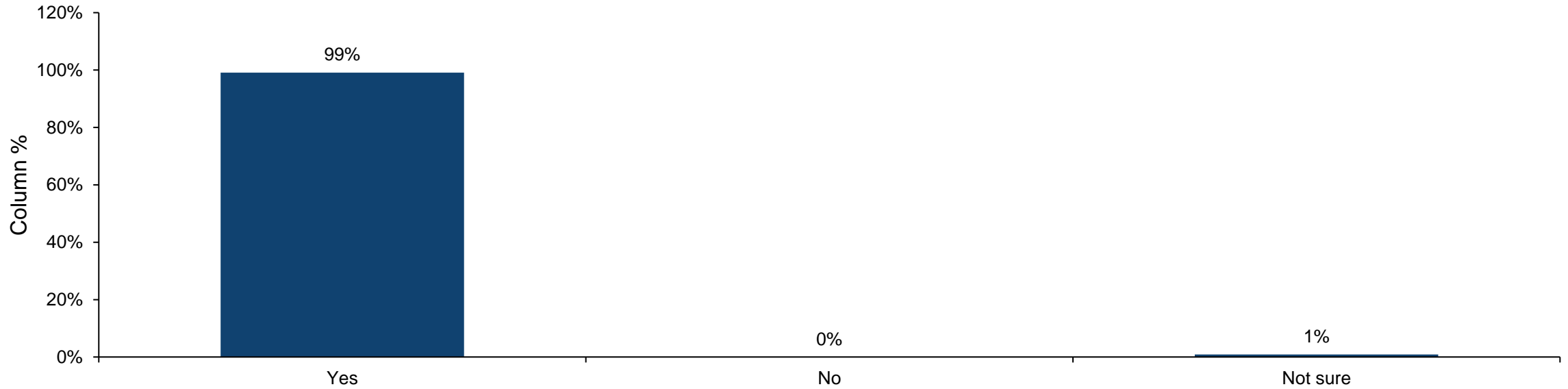

FINAL 2024 AGE-FRIENDLY COMMUNITY SURVEY OF STEVENS POINT, WI 45+

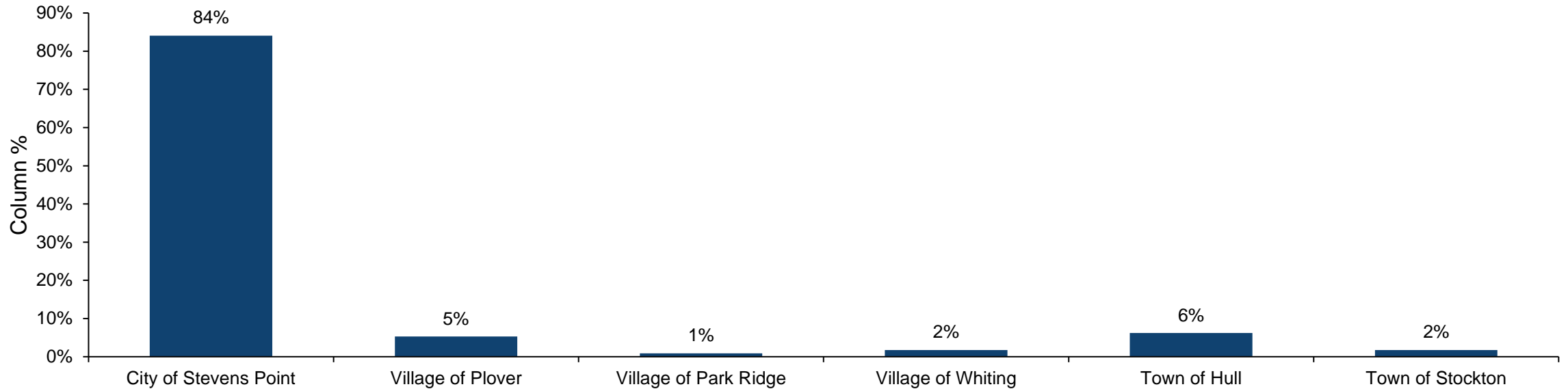


Q1x3 Are you a resident the City of Stevens Point, WI?



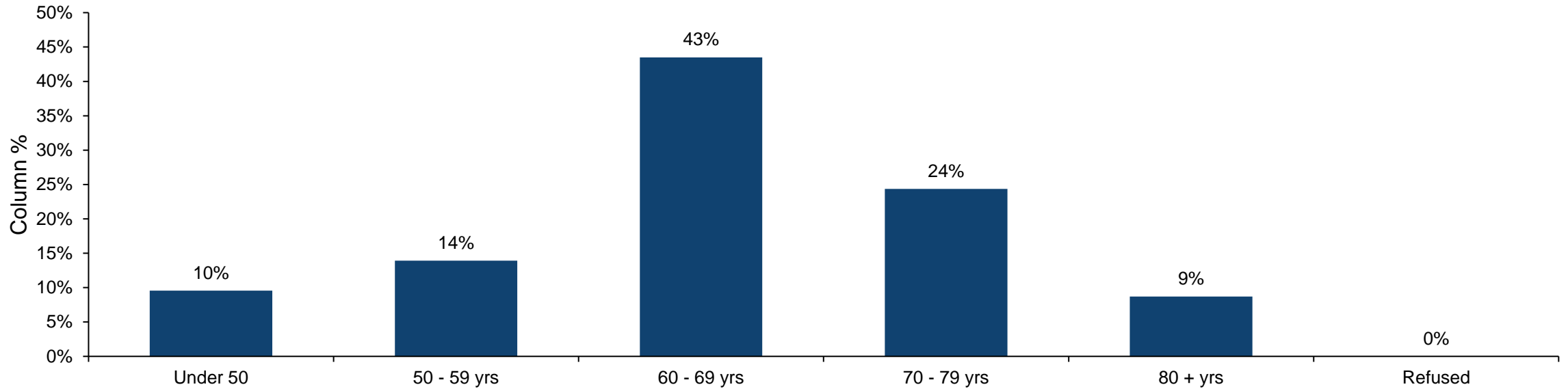

Q1x7 What is the name of your community? For some people, this would mean the town or village in which they live, or it could be their neighborhood. For some people, it could be their subdivision or development.



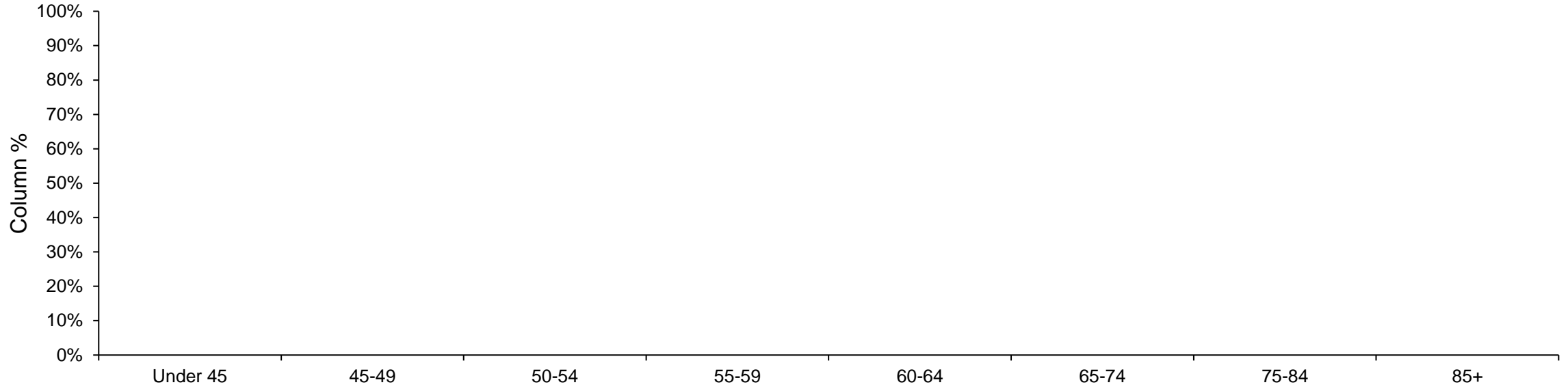

Q1x5 What is your age as of your last birthday?



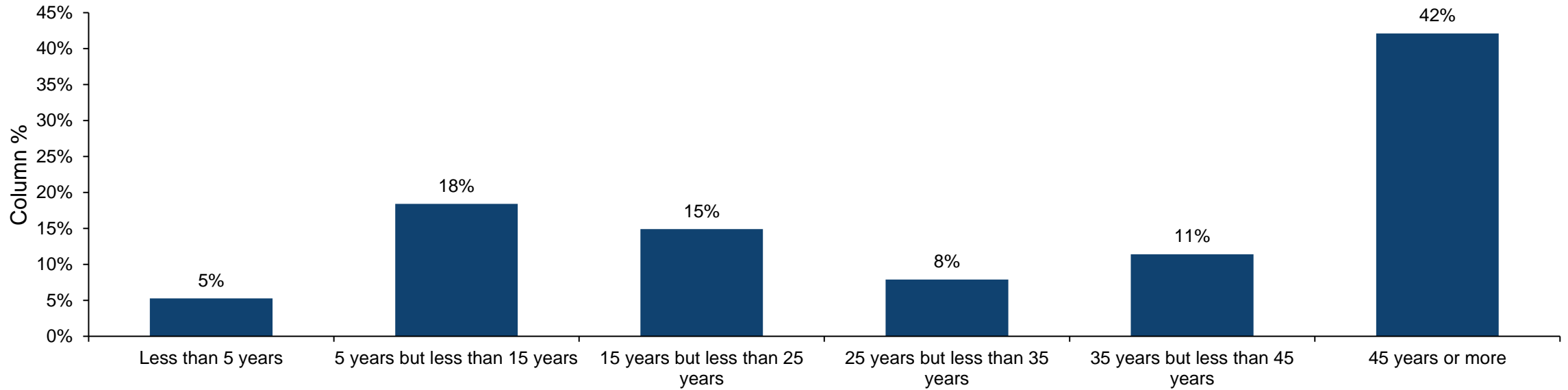

Q1x6 Some people are not comfortable giving their exact age. Which of the following age ranges do you fall into?



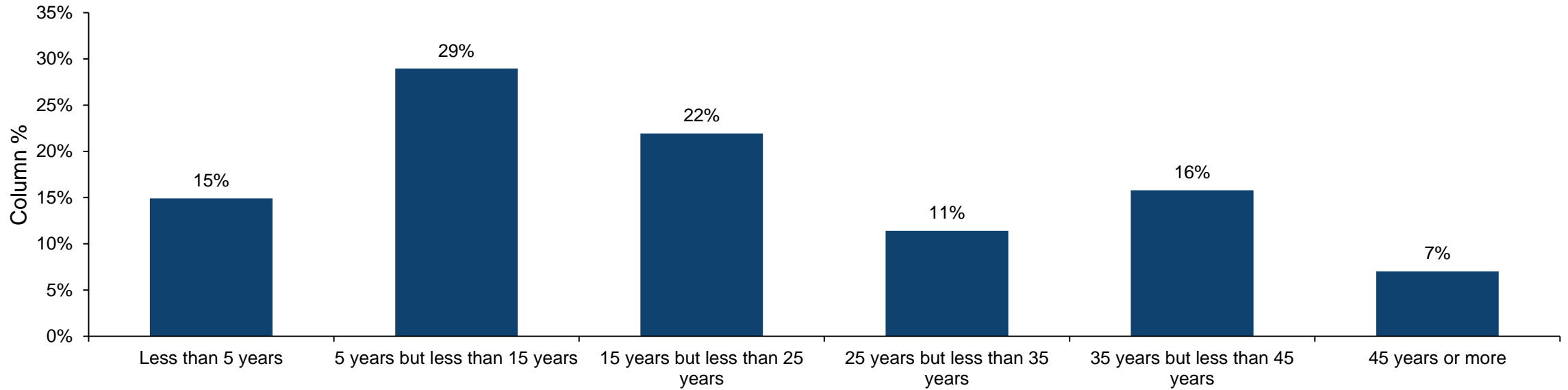

Q2x3 How long have you lived in your community?



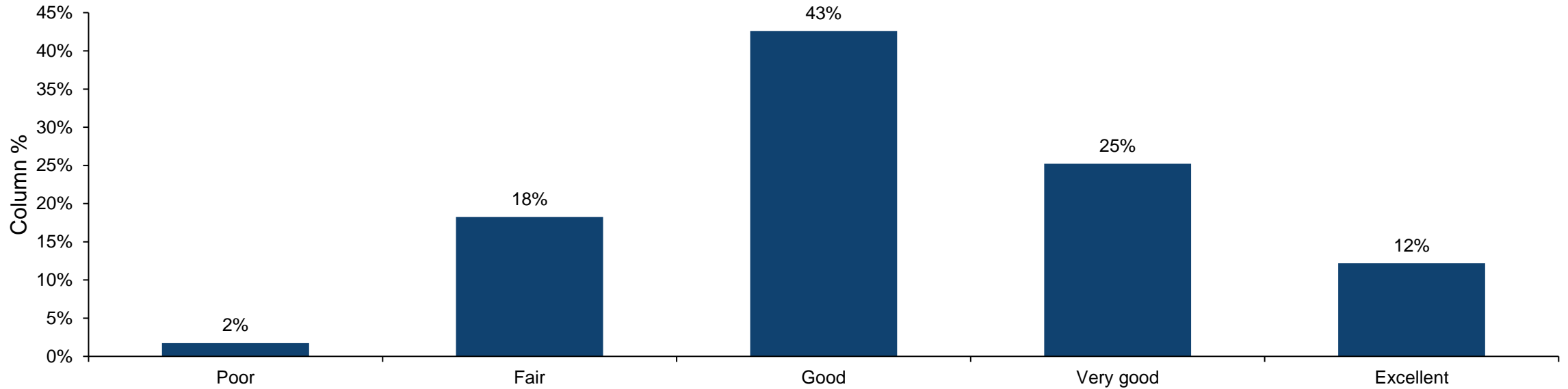

Q2x4 How long have you lived in your current residence?



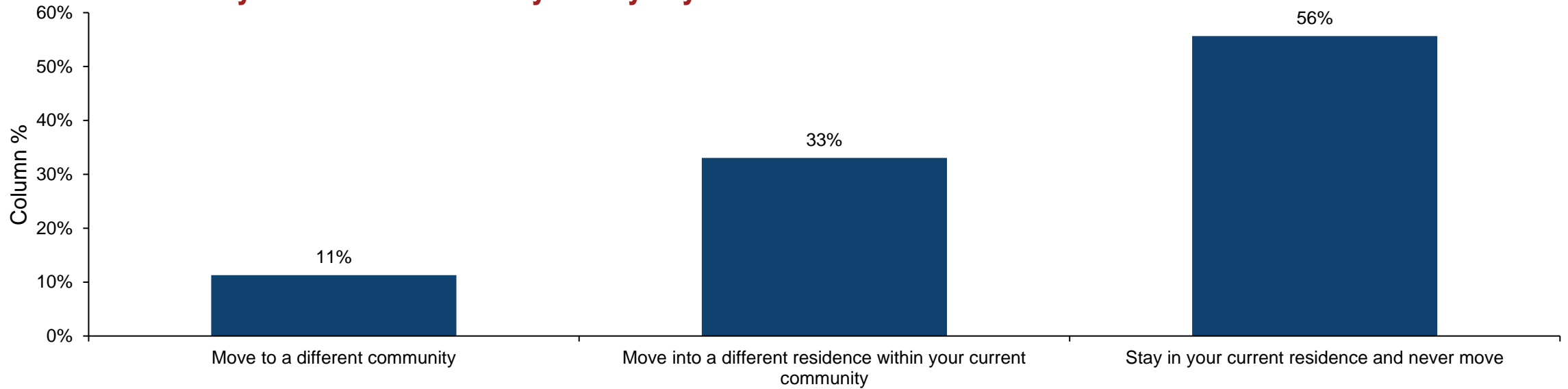

Q2x5 How would you rate your current community as a place for people to live as they age?



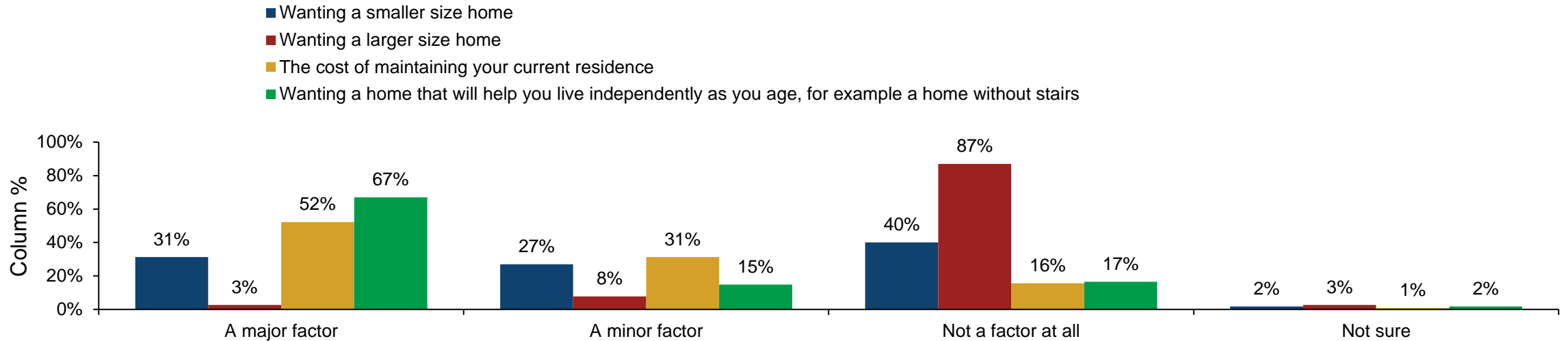

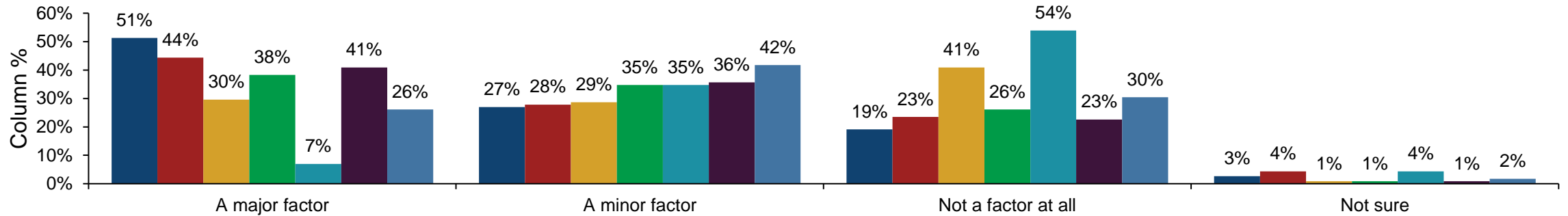

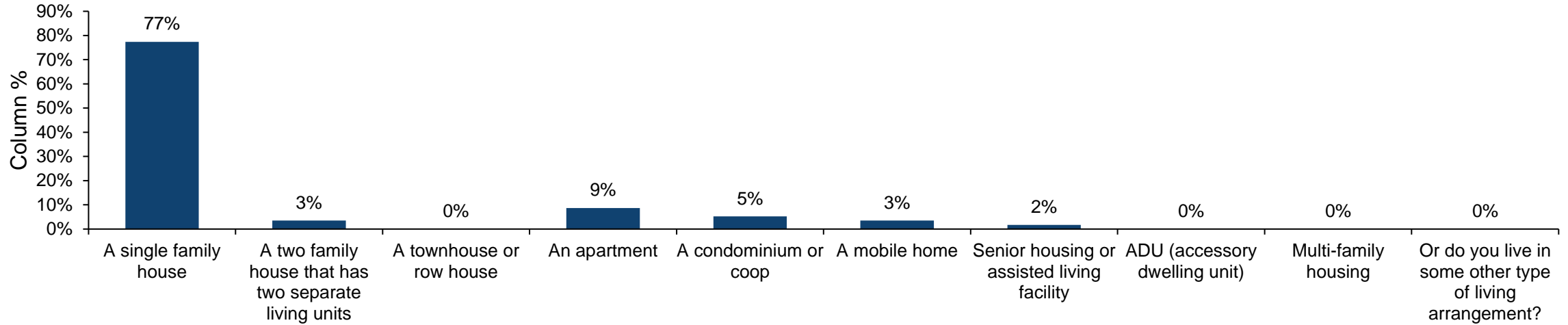

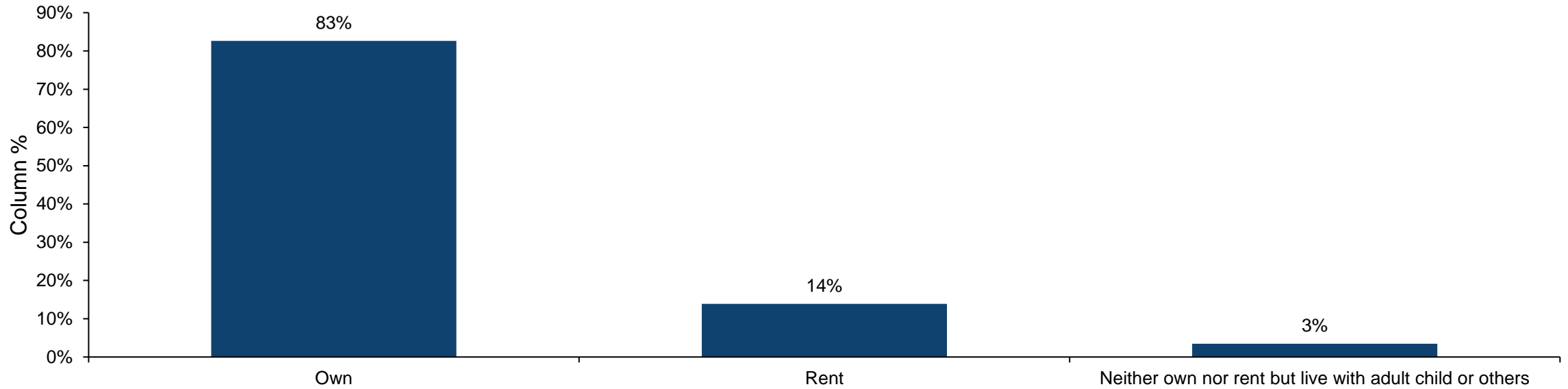

Q4x2 Which of the following types of homes best describes where you currently live?



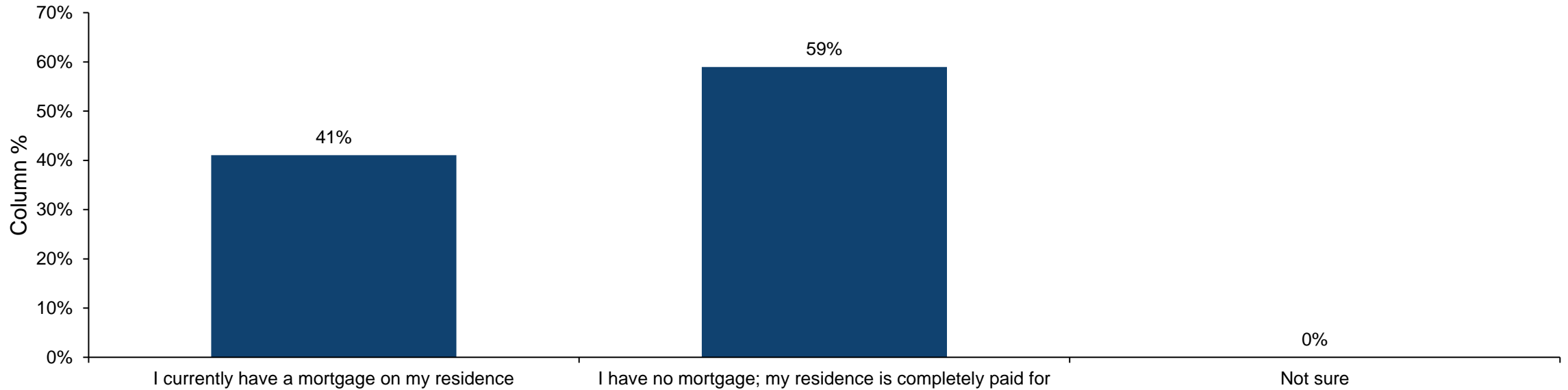

Q4x3 Do you own or rent your residence?



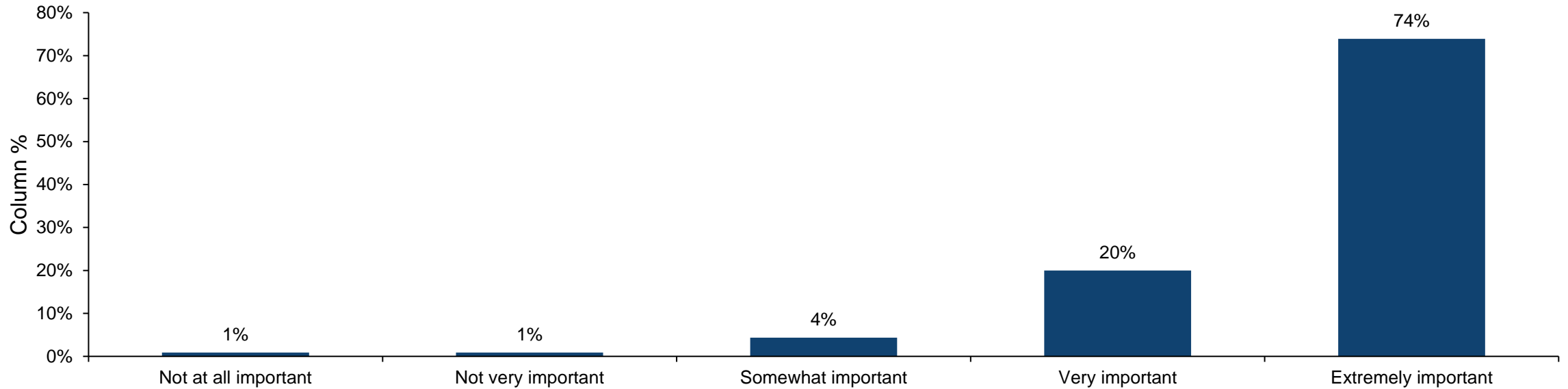

Q4x3_1 Do you currently have a mortgage on your residence or is your residence fully paid for?



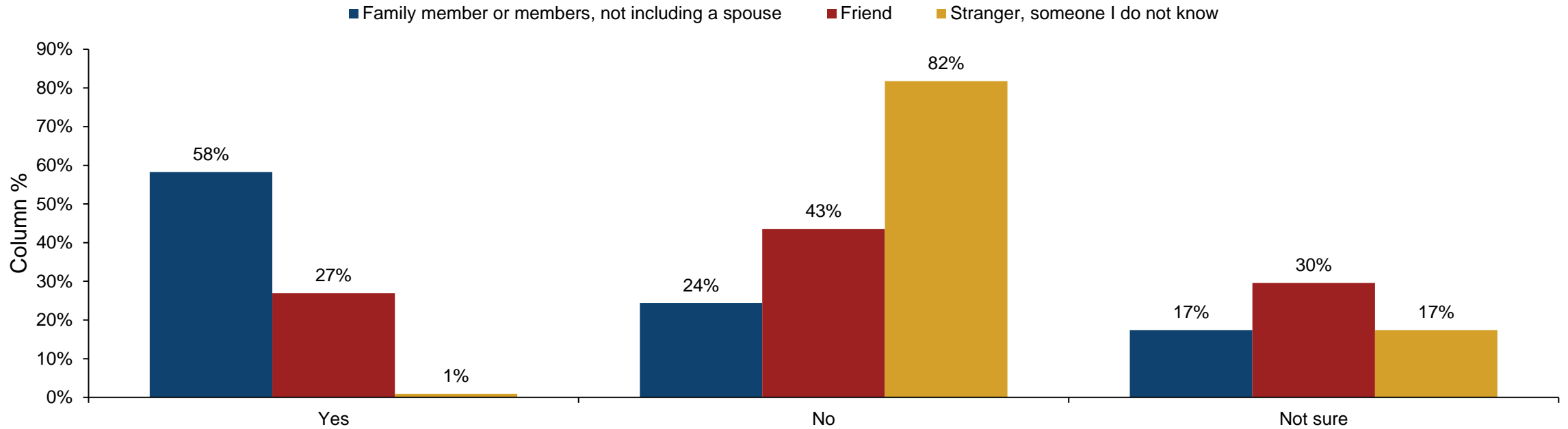

Q4x4 How important is it for you to be able to live independently in your own home as you age?



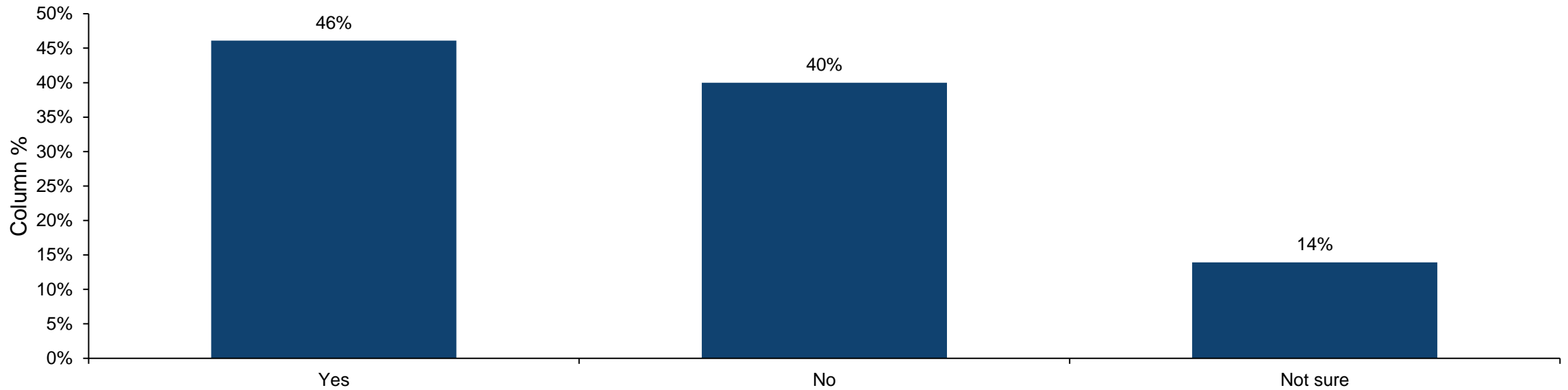

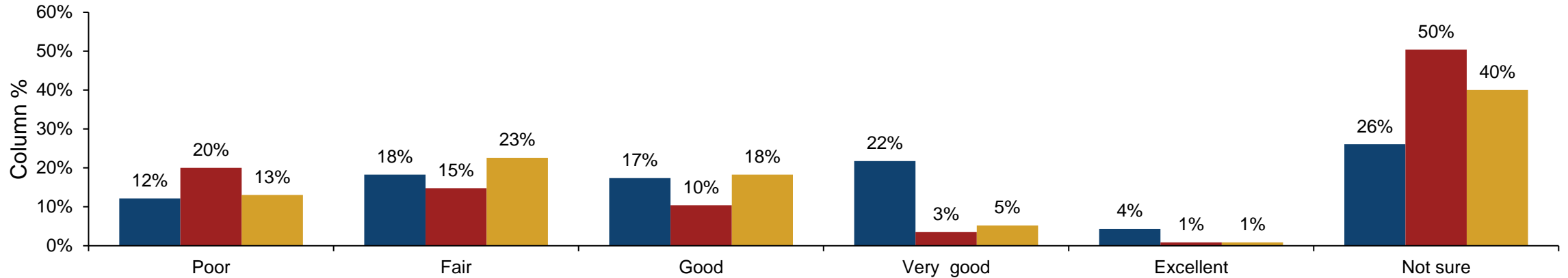

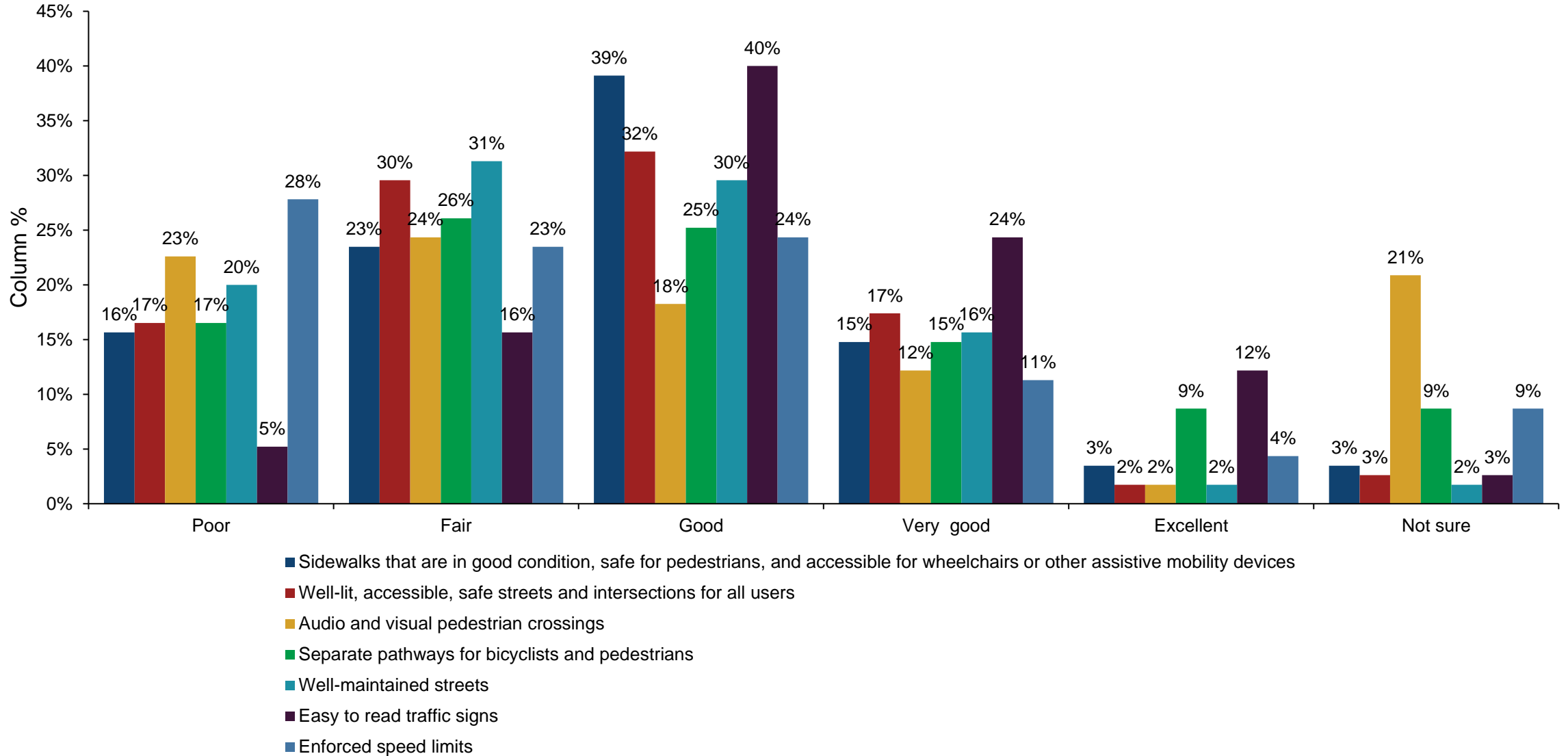

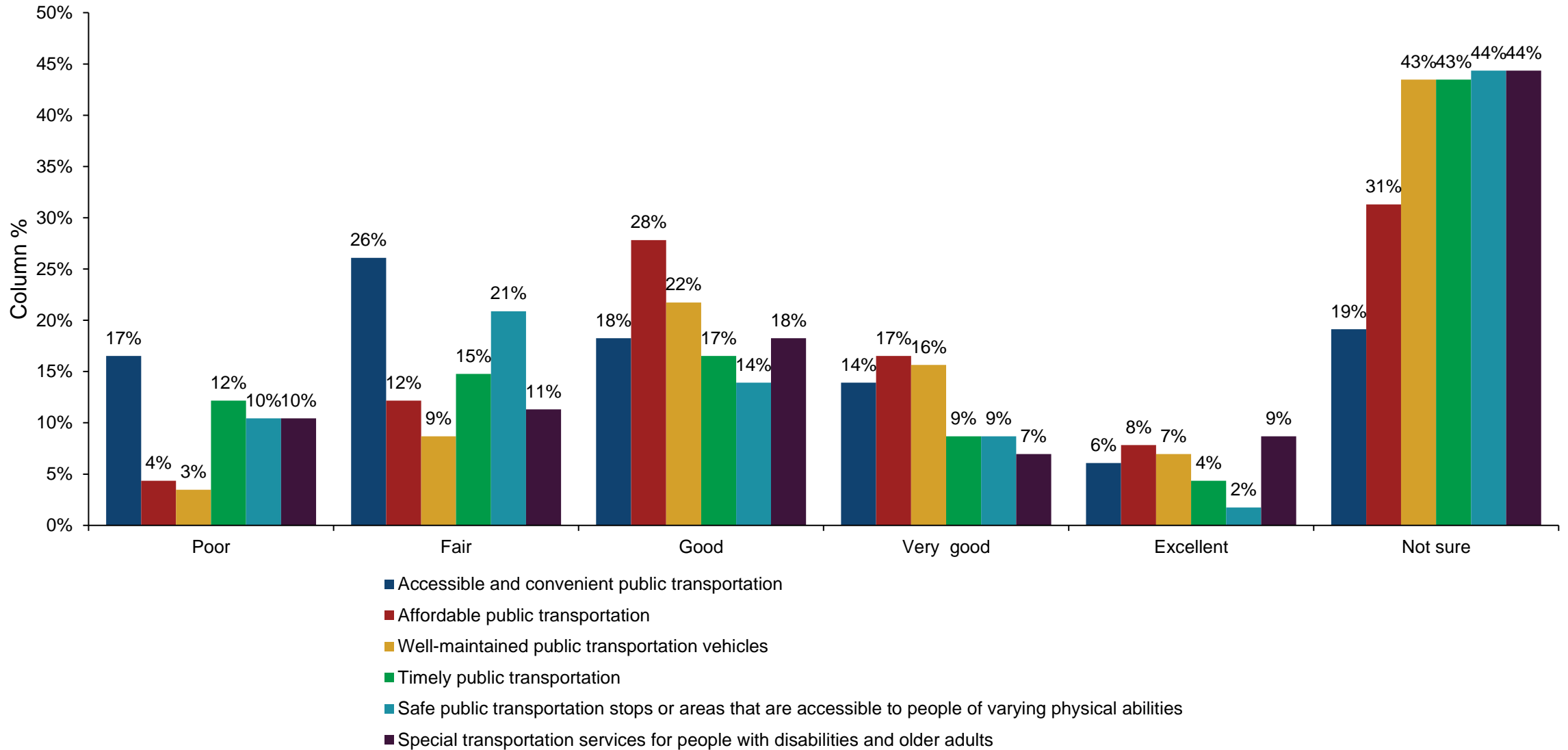
Q6x2 How do you usually get around your community for things like shopping, visiting the doctor, running errands, or other things?

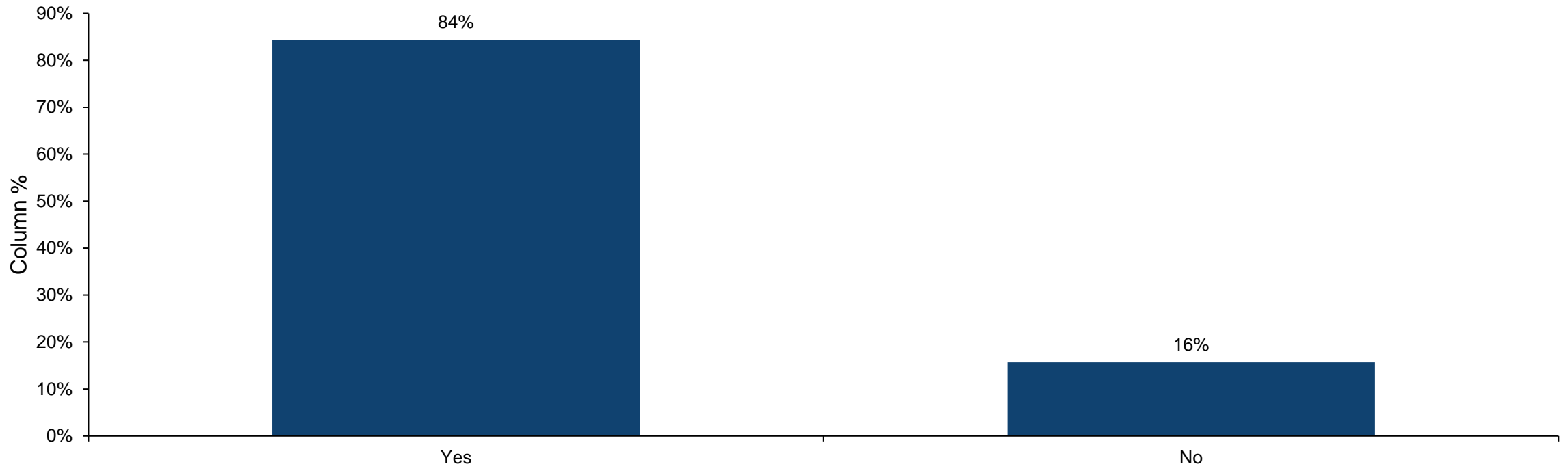
Q8x3 How often do you feel the following?

■ Lack companionship ■ Feel left out ■ Feel isolated from others



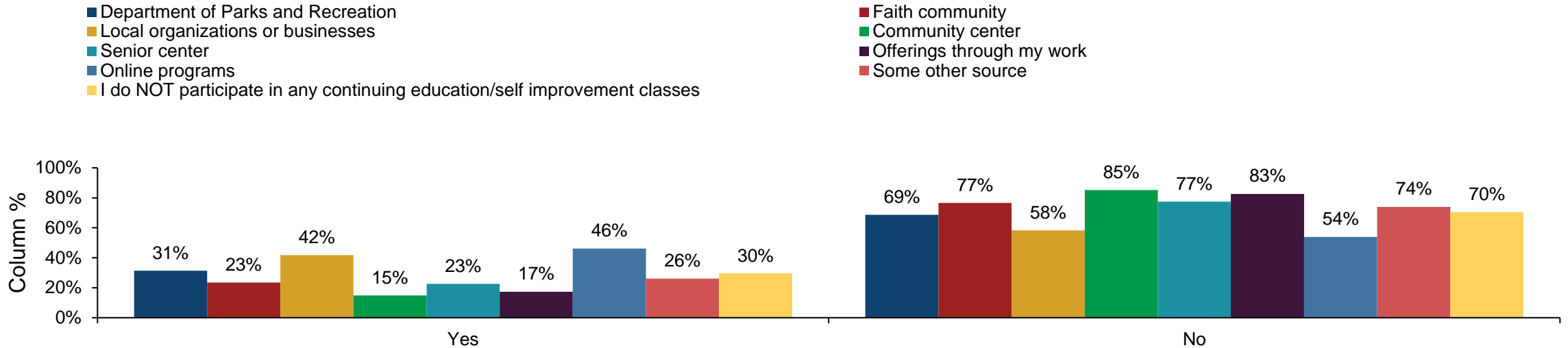

Q8x4 If you were in trouble, do you have friends or family who can help you at any time of the day or night?



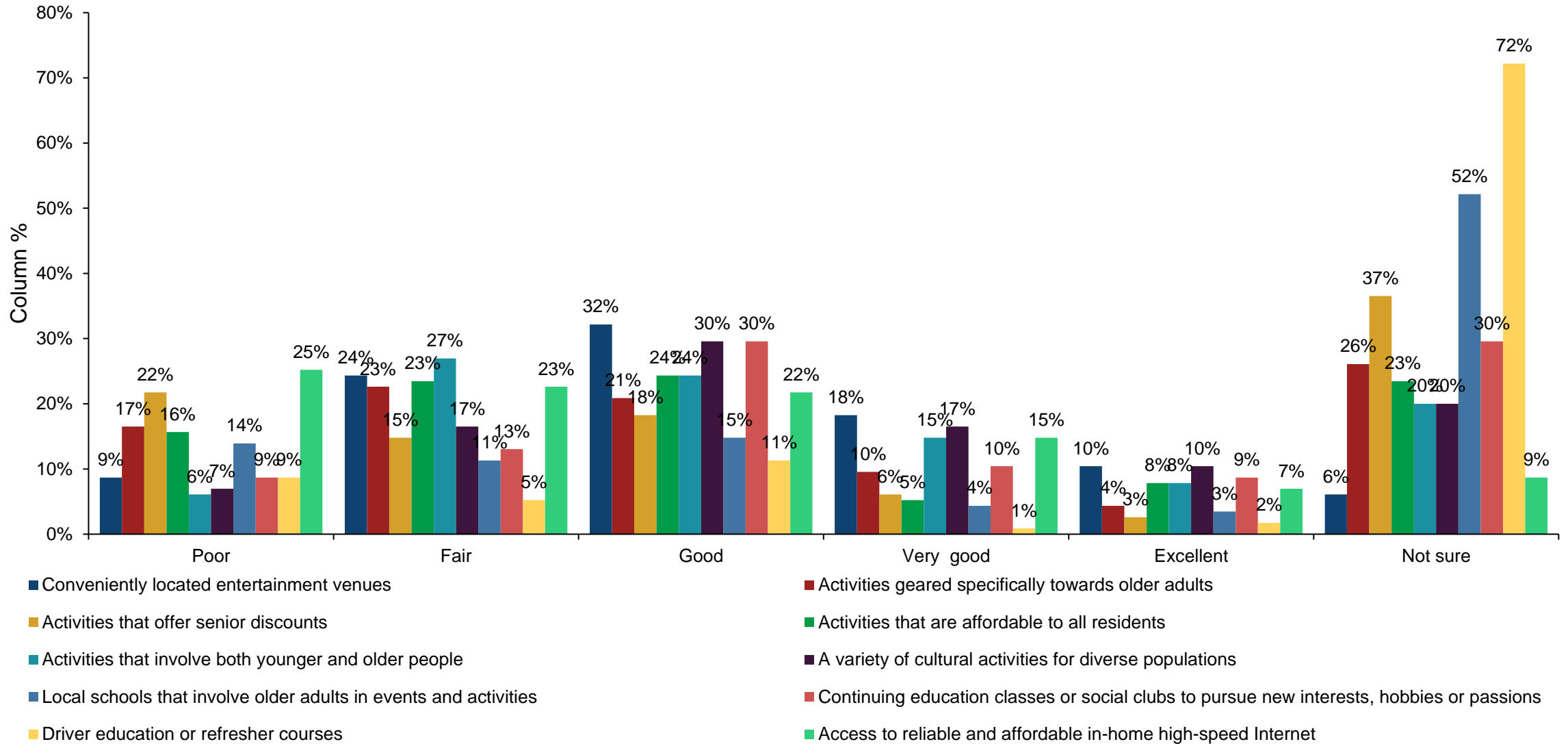

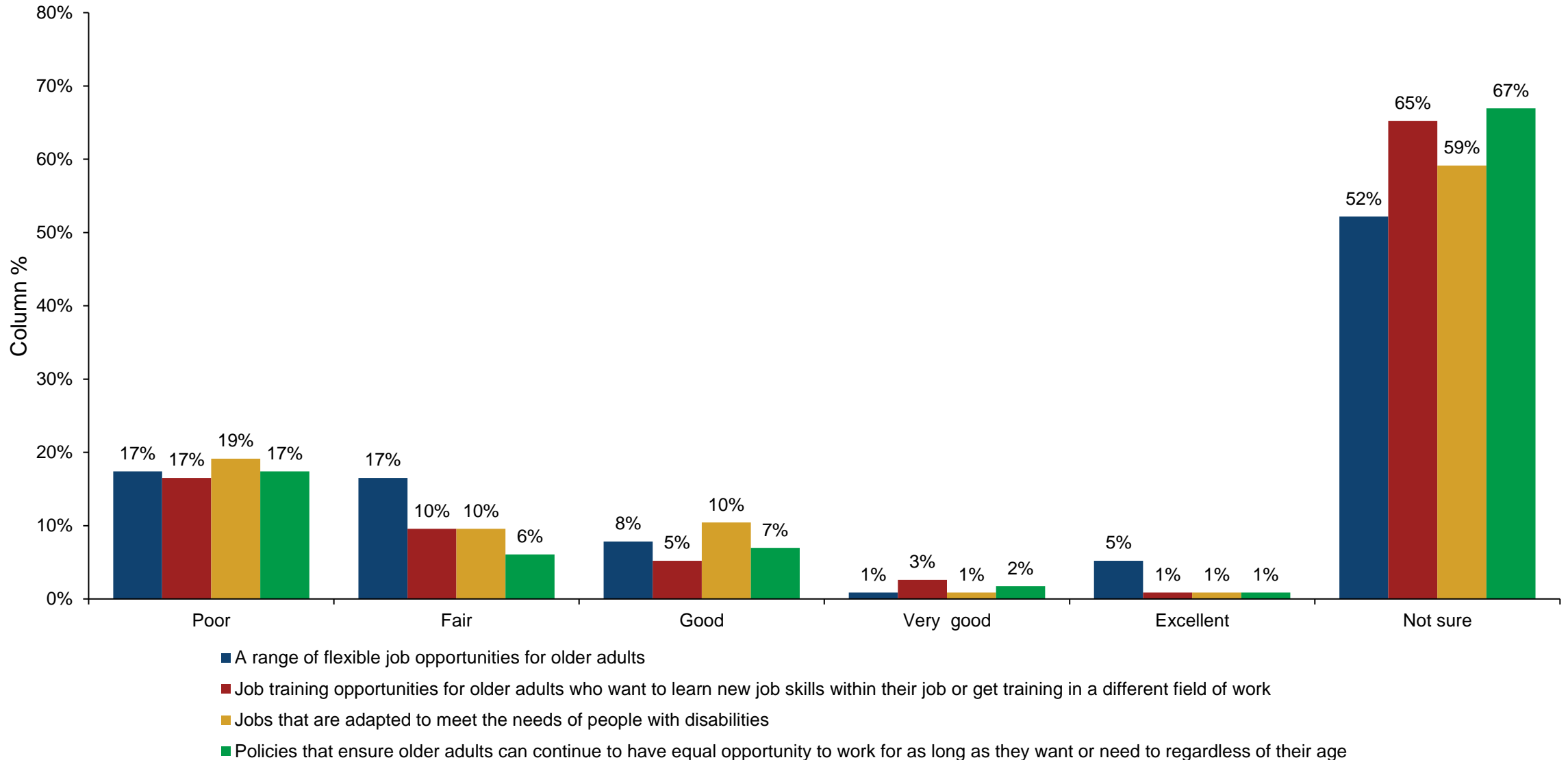

Q13x1 What is your current marital status?



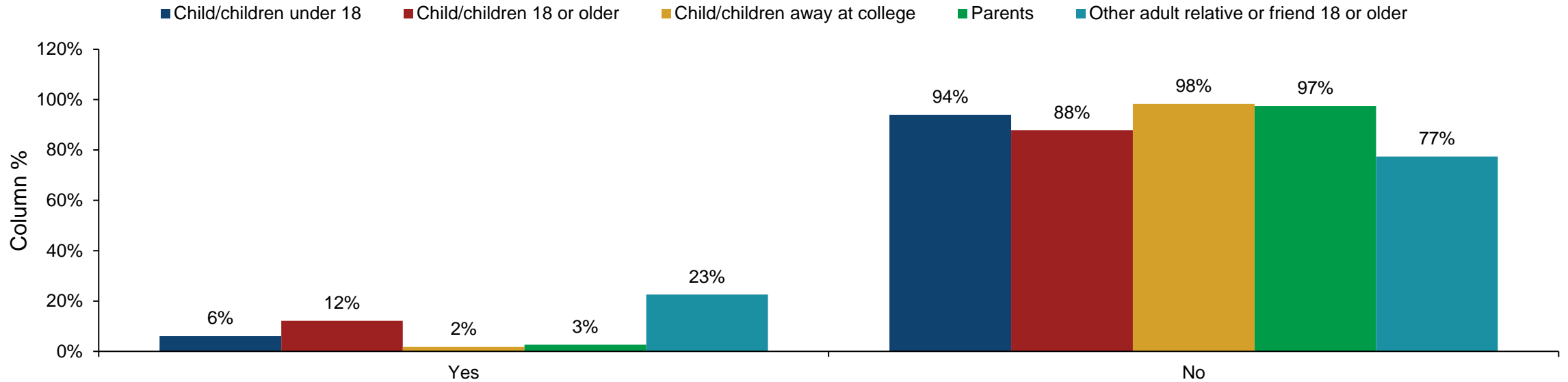

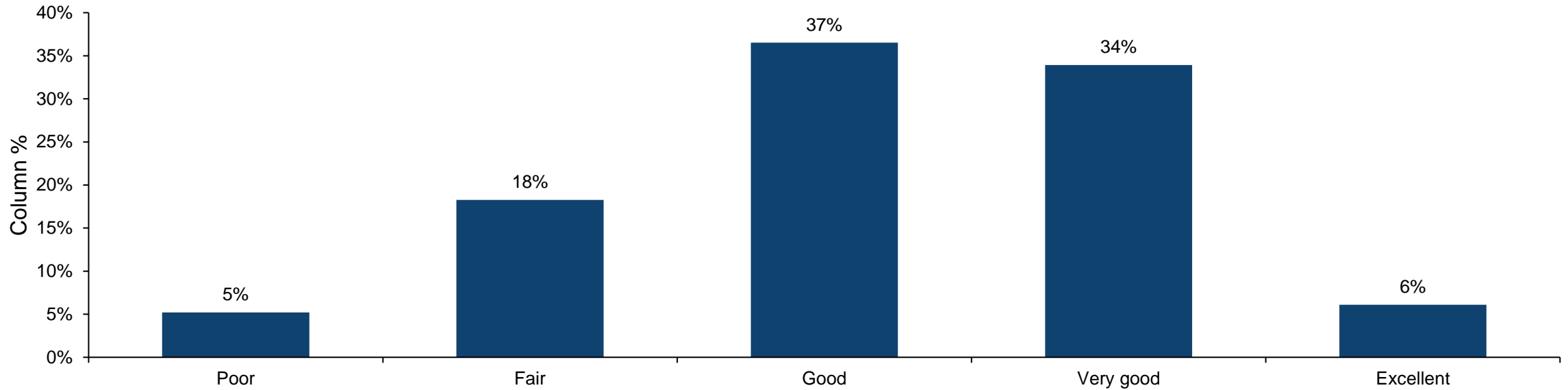

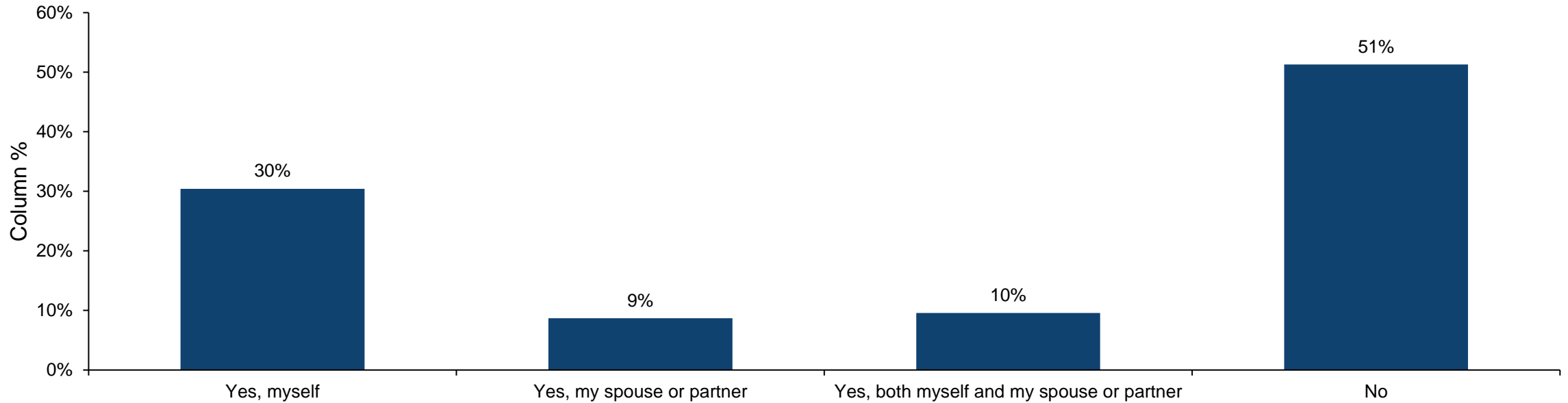

Q14x2 In general would you say your health is:?



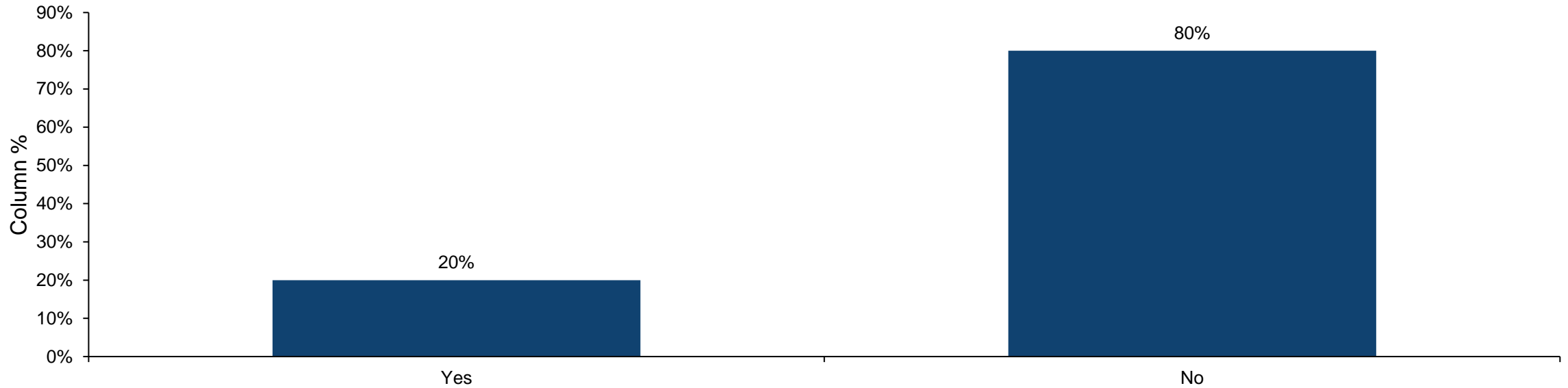

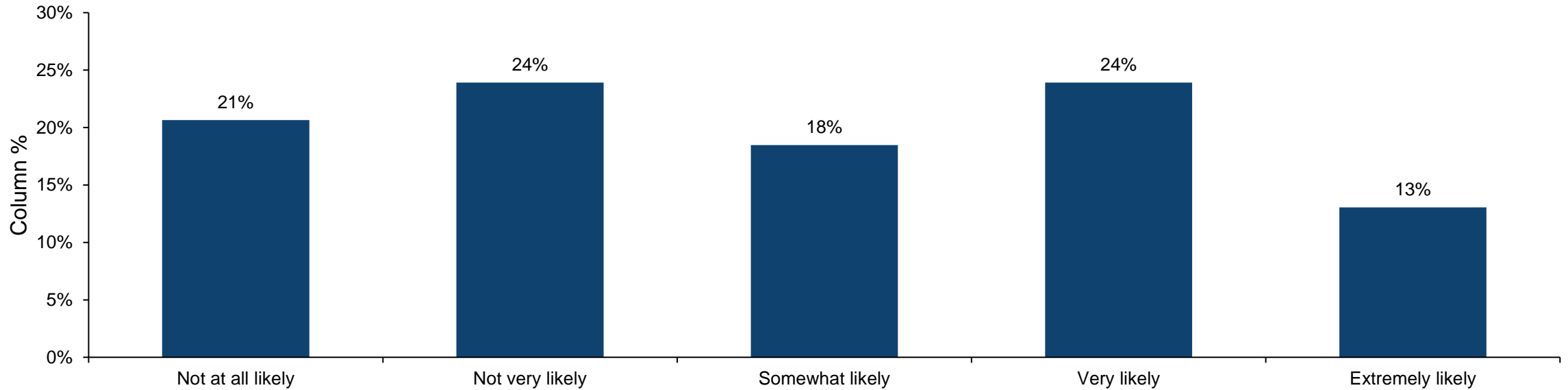

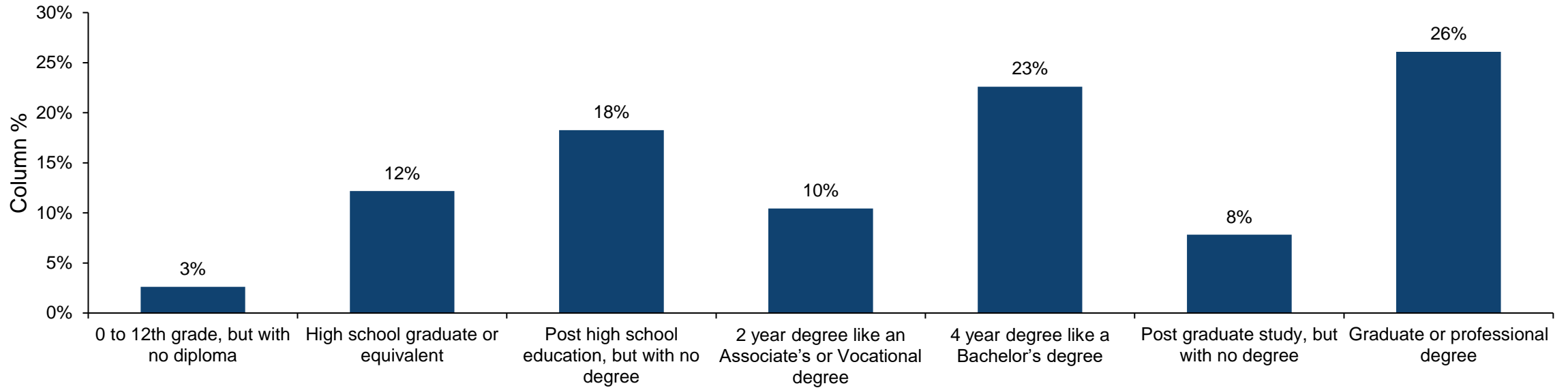

Q16x2 How likely is it that you will provide unpaid care to an adult loved one in the future?



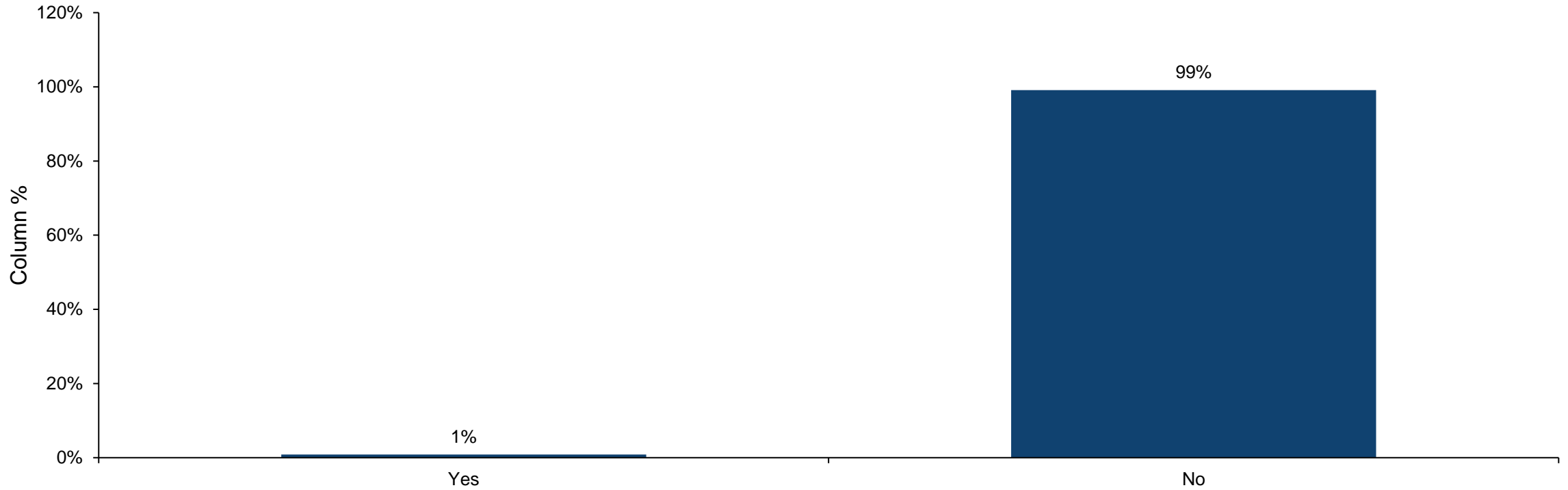

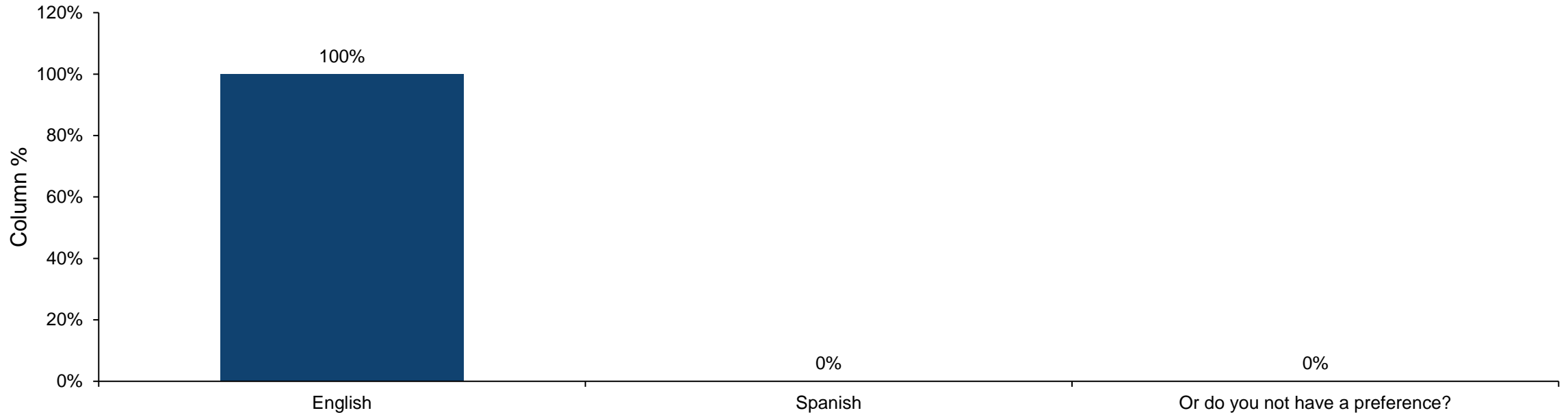

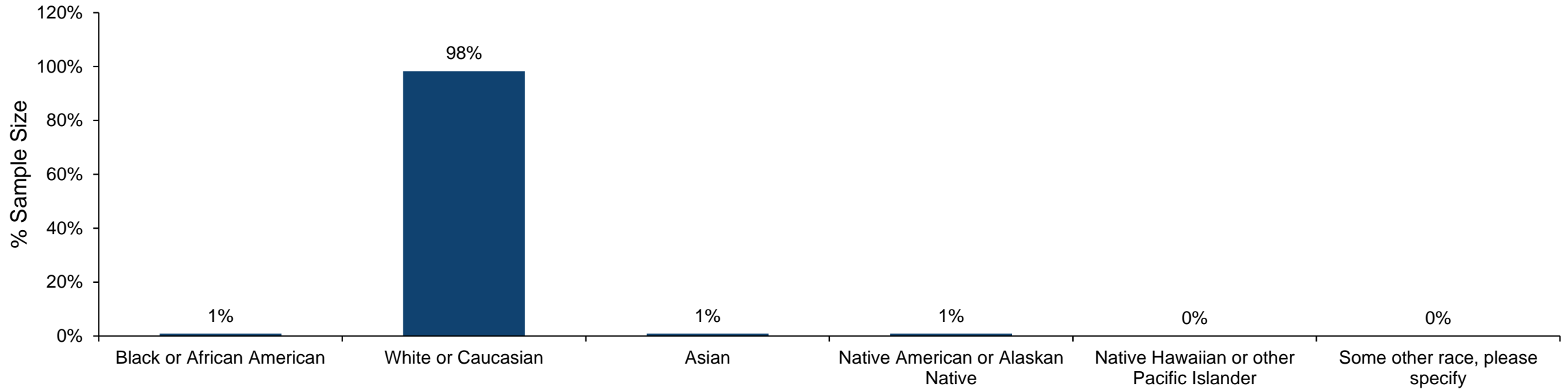

Q16x5 Which language do you prefer to speak?



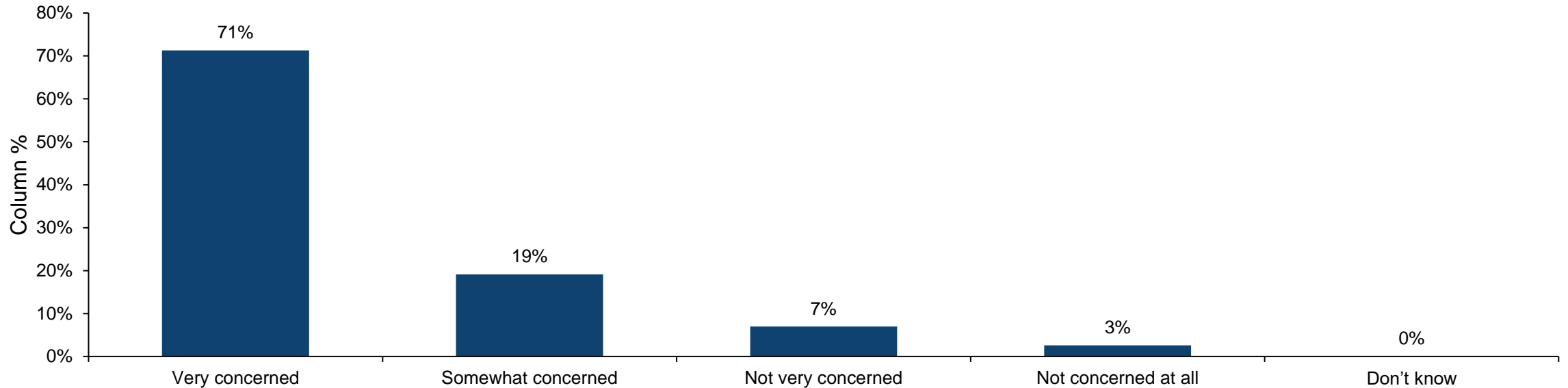

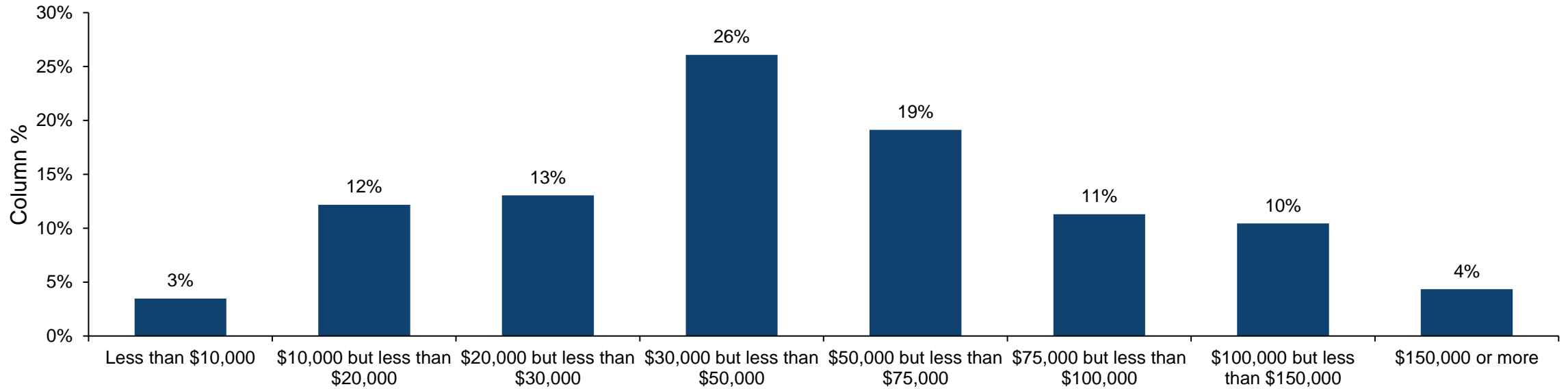
