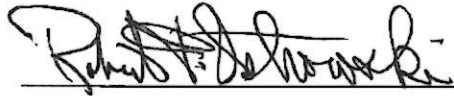

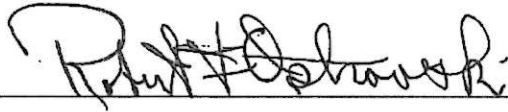

During Marcus' time in the military, he received several decorations such as Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Non-commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, Nato Medal, and Certificate of Achievement.

In 2022 Marcus attended the University of Trinidad State College where he took 5 classes and received a certificate on May 11, 2022, for Electrical Technology Certification and a Major in Power Line Electrical Technology.

Marcus currently works as an ariel lineman, but he has been thinking about law enforcement since getting out of the military because he wants to continue serving people.

Det. Lt. Jeremy Mueller was assigned Marcus' background investigation and spoke with Marcus' Army Supervisor, Joshua Southern. Joshua stated that Marcus would make a great officer and if becoming an officer is what he has decided to do then he most likely has it planned out and is committed to the idea. This seems to be accurate as both Lieutenant Steve Spath and Lieutenant Robert Roser stated Marcus was very well prepared for his ride along and he asked many questions not just about the department but also about how to balance homelife and shift work with a family. They documented that Marcus also showed well with the other officers on shift and they were impressed with how easily he was able to talk with all of them. Both Lieutenants thought Marcus would be a good fit for the Stevens Point Police Department.

References during the background describe Marcus as reliable, hardworking, trustworthy, dependable, light hearted with a good sense of humor.

We are asking for the Police and Fire Commission's approval to hire Marcus M. Sowa as a Patrol Officer, w/out recruit schooling, with the Stevens Point Police Department, upon successful completion of both the psychological and medical screening. With the understanding that Marcus will complete and pass the 720-hour Law Enforcement Academy which is scheduled to begin April 1, 2025, at Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton, WI and obtain 60 college credits within 5 years of his employment.

Note of Interest:

- Due to some sub-zero temperatures Ofc. Radsek took it upon himself to work with the Franciscans Center to open up early so the unhoused population had a warm place to go. Ofc. Radsek donated his time to run and oversee the center from 6am until other area businesses opened at 9am.
- 1-2-25 Lt. Roser, Sgt. Poeschel and Ofc. Stanislawski interviewing patrol officer candidates. Top 6 went to background stage.
- 1-6-25 Ofc. Schultz began working with Belco for our new squad change overs.
- 1-6-25 Admin attended Chief Michelle Haywood's swearing in as UWSP Police Chief.
- 1-9-25 Lt. Johnson completed two presentation at the GI Associates for approx.. 25 people regarding run, hide and fight. He also completed a security walk through.
- 1-9-25 Ofc. Stacey Morton and Lt. Johnson spent time at the Portage County Juvenile Detention Center, having conversations with youth offenders currently in custody at the center. The opportunity to work with the juveniles was made through Liz Gosse who is the Juvenile Justice Ministry Director for Wood and Portage Counties. The contacts allowed the officers to try and close the gap between the juveniles and law enforcement and gave the juveniles an opportunity to ask tough questions in a more comfortable setting without bias.
- 1-10-25 Lt. Johnson and Chief Kussow met with Parks Director, Dan Kremer, to begin planning the 2025 National Night Out Event. (August 5th from 3pm to 6pm at Seramur Park)
- 1-13-25 Ofc. Larsen Biadasz first day of 720 hr Law Enforcement Academy at Mid-State Technical College.

- 1-21-25 Ofc. Jarrett Lucht resigned his position with the Stevens Point Police Department. We wish him well with future endeavors.
- 1-23-25 Chiefs interview of patrol officer candidates. Three will be presented to the Police and Fire Commission for their approval.
- 1-29-25 Lt. Johnson presented to approx. 30 people at Stevens Point Orthopedics for run, fight and hide.
- Lt. Johnson and Det. Sgt Lawrynk have begun the planning process with the Portage County Sheriff's Office to plan a basic SWAT course in our region, hosted by our departments and Marathon County SO. The idea behind this is to train all of our own operators within our region over a 4-day, 40-hour course, taught by all of our own instructors. This will not only be extremely beneficial to our new operators, learning our own tactics, but it is also very cost effective. We expect 12-20 people at this year's training. Our SWAT region consists of Marathon County SWAT (Alert Unit), Portage County SRT, Stevens Point/Plover SWAT, Marshfield SWAT, Lincoln County SWAT, Wood County SWAT, Wisconsin Rapids SWAT, Clark County SWAT, and Taylor County SWAT.

Calls of Interest:

- 01-24-25 Possible Fight, ICON, SPPD Officers responded to a possible fight at ICON. During the investigation, one of the subjects associated with the call drove wrong way on one way from the area. The male was contacted and later arrested for 2nd offense OWI, Bail jumping. One of the vehicle occupants was issued citation for underage drinking.
- 01-17-25 Disturbance, 2700 blk Sunset Blvd. SPPD Officers responded to residence to investigate a domestic disturbance. Male subject caused harm to a female resident by dragging her by her hair, strangulating her and demanding money. The male was upset the female was communicating with her husband. The male suspect charged with strangulation and suffocation, disorderly conduct, misdemeanor battery and robbery with use of force.

Both subjects were located in the City at Days Inn. Male suspect attempt to flee on foot before he was tackled and tased. 164g meth, 6.5 fentanyl, .5g heroin, 59.3g cocaine and \$\$\$ were confiscated. Both subjects were taken to jail on warrants and fresh charges.

- Investigators Lawrynck, Lepak, Drossel, Lepinski, Brooks and Mueller completed background investigations for patrol officer candidates.
- Inv. Drossel wrapped up fraud and theft case after gathering video surveillance from several businesses and identifying the suspect. Charges have been requested.
- Inv. Poeschel attended a week long training getting certified Cellbrite as she enters a new phase of her career as one of the SPPD's forensic cell phone techs.

January Use of Force Summaries

- 12-31-24 -Officers were attempting to place a subject who would not stop kicking the inside door of the squad after they had been arrested into The Wrap. The Officers were trying to move the subject's hands to the front of their person to be secured on The Wrap and the subject became very tense and unwilling to move their arm. One officer applied a pressure point under the subject's jaw, which allowed the officers to get the subject safely into handcuffs in the front and secured in The Wrap.
- 1-1-25 – Officers were dealing with an intoxicated subject who could not pay their bar tab and wanted to go to jail. The subject was on probation and was not supposed to be drinking, however Probation and Parole did not wish to place the subject on a hold. Officers told the subject they needed to leave the bar and would be receiving a citation for the bar tab issue. The subject refused to listen to officers and tensed up when officers tried to remove the subject from the barstool. The subject was taken to the ground and secured their hands under their body. One officer was forced to apply a pressure point to the subject's ear, which caused the subject to release their hands to be handcuffed. Two officers were injured during the altercation, both officers received an unknown injury to their hips after taking the subject to the ground and trying to handcuff the subject. Neither officer needed medical attention. The subject was not injured.
- 1-5-25 – Officers looking for a subject who had been stealing packages from residences. One officer located a subject that matched the description of the suspect. While questioning the suspect, another officer arrived and they advised the subject, they were detained and attempted to handcuff the suspect. The suspect began to tense up and pull away, so the officers took the subject to the ground, where the subject tried to pull away from the officer's grip. Officers were able to get the suspect into handcuffs, but not before one officer injured their elbow and cut their hand and another officer scraped their knuckles on the ground. The suspect was not injured and the officers had minor injuries that did not require medical attention.
- 1-11-25 – Officers were attempting to arrest a wanted subject. The subject fled from officers and one officer was blocking the path of the fleeing suspect. The officer pointed their taser at the subject with the warning tones activated. The subject turned and ran the other way and was tased by officers from a different department. The subject continued to resist and try to get up, so the SPPD officer attempted to deploy their taser, but only deployed one probe, resulting in an ineffective deployment. No injuries.
- 1-12-25 – Officers had located and arrested a subject who fled the scene of a one-vehicle crash. The suspect was suspected of driving under the influence and refused to walk with officers back to the scene and their squad cars. One officer had to apply pressure on the suspect's wrist to get the suspect to comply. No injuries.

While the officer was trying to get the subject to leave, the subject fled down the hallway. Upon arrival, Officers observed the front door destroyed and the inside of the trailer with lots of damage and blood smeared all over. Large amount of property damage in addition to physical battery to the female and her friend took place. Intoxicated male was arrested on domestic battery and related charges.

Detectives

- Det. Lepak continues his investigations into his assigned Fraud/Scam cases. He has also compiled a large amount of information in regard to a new type of drug treatment program. He is getting the information put together for dissemination to various local organizations.
- Drug investigators are finalizing corrections on the 2024 CWDTF Grant, an extension was granted and the remaining money was used to purchase drug test kits which were then distributed between the groups members. They also continued to work several drug tips and assisted other agencies with investigations and search warrants.

- Det Brooks and Det. Poeshcel were assigned several screened-out CPS reports which required follow-up by law enforcement which led to the cases being completed. They both continued to work open investigations as well.
- Det. Drossel was assigned several new cases this month, one being a fraud/scam and another being an ongoing bail jumping complaint from a case he previously worked.
- Detectives were also displaced a bit as office areas were being updated and renovated, things are now going back together, and everyone is getting settled in to their updated offices.

February Use of Force Summaries

- 1-29-25 – One SPPD officer assisted another agency with a high-risk stop on a vehicle suspected of displaying stolen license plates. During the stop the officer pointed their firearm at the occupant in the vehicle. The subject was taken into custody without incident.
- 2-7-25 – Stevens Point/Plover SWAT was used to execute a search warrant on a residence in Plover. During the execution of the warrant SWAT operators pointed their firearms at the two occupants inside the residence until they were safely taken into custody. No injuries.
- 2-9-25 – Officers were trying to take a subject into custody after they subject had threatened to kill officers. The subject fell to the ground and pulled away from one officer. The subject then punched an officer in the lip with a closed fist. The officer returned a focus strike to the subject's head, due to the unknown location of the suspect's hand and potential for continued punches to the officer. This allowed the two officers to control the suspect until the other arriving officers could apply The Wrap to the suspect who continued to resist. Officers also needed to use wrist pressure while getting the suspect into The Wrap. The officer who got punched got a small cut to their lip and a swollen hand and the suspect had bruising to their head from the use of force. Neither needed medical attention.
- 2-10-25 – Officers were called to the Square for a report of a subject with a gun, causing a disturbance. Upon arrival, officers located the described subject and pointed their guns at the suspect, taking the suspect into custody without incident. No gun was located on the suspect. After further investigation, several stories changed and it appeared a random group of people made a report that the subject had a gun, but no one actually saw it. The suspect was arrested on other charges and jailed. No injuries.
- 2-17-25 – Officers were investigating a domestic situation, and the suspect was being verbally aggressive towards officers. The suspect resisted officers attempts to be taken into custody and refused to listen to their commands. Another arrived officer removed their taser and pointed it at the suspect until the suspect was safely taken into custody without any further incident.
