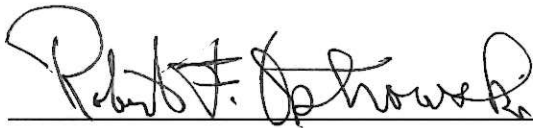

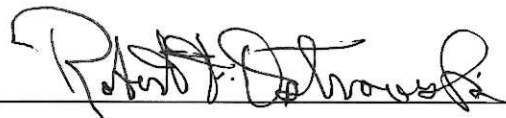

Commissioners:

The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 46/49

Note of Interest:

****On March 11th**, Lt. Roser, Lt. Long, Sgt. Lawrynk, Det. Brooks, Ofc. Gomez and Lt. Johnson accepted the Co-SWAT Team of the year award from the Association of SWAT Personnel in Brookfield, WI accompanied by Chief Kussow, AC Rottier and AC Williams. Portage County, Marathon County and Waupaca County also received the award, for the combined efforts during the 26-hour standoff/SWAT operation in Amherst in July of 2024.**

- 3-4-25 Lt. Johnson and other Stevens Point District Officials met at SPASH and conducted interviews with Channel 7, focusing on bullying and the programs the schools are working on, focusing on bullying and cyberbullying.
- 3-10-25 Lt. Johnson, Lt Meidl (PTSO) and Lt. Stuart (Marathon County SO) presented at the Association of SWAT Personnel Annual Conference as the opening presenters. The 3 Lt's completed a 3.5 hour debrief of the Amherst Standoff from July of 2024 in front of approximately 250 SWAT personnel from around the state.
- 3-12-25 Crossing Guard Agnes Kowalski retired after 21.5 years of service for our community. AC Williams and Lt. Johnson took Agnes back to Jefferson School where she worked for her entire career, to enjoy a sendoff from the students and staff at the school. Agnes was greeted by hundreds of kids who lined the sidewalks and the hallways, clapping and cheering for her as she made her way to the gym. At the gym Agnes was able to sit with the safety cadets and have lunch and got to open gifts and cards from the children and staff. Agnes was adored by the families at Jefferson School and will be greatly missed.
- 3-12-25 Ofc. Radsek and Ofc. Kramer had a table at the SPASH College and Career Fair, focusing on recruiting our youth to a potential career in law enforcement.

- 3-13-25 New fingerprint machine, scanner, printer and computer installed as the old one was at its end of life.
- 3-14-25 Chief Kusow and Chief Moddy signed an MOU for the implantation of TEMS (Tactical EMS) to join the Stevens Point/Plover SWAT Team. Division Chief Ewing proposed the implementation to his staff months ago and has been working with Lt. Johnson on getting things finalized. DC Ewing is set to start training with the SWAT team in April and will be attending our local basic SWAT training in May.
- 3-25-25 Lt. Johnson completed a security walk-through with Lands End staff, focusing on building security and employee safety.
- SPPD staff also participated in a walk through at Woodlands Church, focusing on reunification with the Stevens Point and Pacelli School Districts, in the event of a serious incident.

The complainant reported the female was currently burning the carcass in the firepit. Officers made contact with subjects and observed a dog carcass burning in a fire pit. Detectives called in to investigate further with Humane Society.

March Use of Force Summaries

- 3-5-25 – One SPPD Officer responded to a fight in a school between two students. The students would not listen to verbally direction to de-escalate and separate, so the officer was forced to remove one of the students by grabbing them around the waist and pulling them away from the incident, several feet, all the while the students were yelling profanities at each other. This was successful in stopping the altercation without injury.
- 3-11-25 – Officers were called to a residence to make contact with a subject who was wanted. Officers located the subject in a garage near a vehicle. When officers made contact, the subject refused to listen to commands and began to go under the vehicle. Officers pointed their tasers at the subject and initiated the warning tones. The subject was verbally resistive, but officers were able to take the subject into custody. Once the handcuffs were on, the subject refused to walk and needed to be pulled out of the garage and taken to the ground as he was physically resisting their efforts. Once on the ground an ankle strap was applied and the subject was carried to a squad, where the subject was taken to jail without injury.
