



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
ARTICLE 5- PAY PERIOD & ARTICLE 6- WAGES
Between the City of Stevens Point
And
The Stevens Point Police Officers Organization
Wisconsin Professional Police Association

ARTICLE 5 – PAY PERIOD

All employees shall be paid bi-weekly, every other Friday. If Friday is designated as a legal holiday recognized by the City, then payday shall be on the preceding day. All overtime pay shall be paid bi-weekly on the usual payroll date upon the request of the officer.

By following the payday calendar, Friday, January 1, 2027 would be a payday. Per the language above, that payday should be on Thursday, December 31, 2026. The City of Stevens Point intends to pay that particular paycheck on Monday, January 4, 2027. The City also intends to adjust the 2026 pay calendar to include 26 pay periods, not 27 as initially planned. The Stevens Point Police Officers Organization recognizes that and is in agreement with it. The Stevens Point Police Officers Organization and the City of Stevens Point agree to make an exception to ARTICLE 5 for this occurrence. Any same or similar issues within the 2026-2028 collective bargaining agreement will be covered by this memorandum of understanding.


ARTICLE 6 – WAGES

Effective with the first payroll period following the effective date of this Agreement, namely January 1, 2026 to and including December 31, 2028, employees shall be paid the wages according to the schedule set forth in Appendix A to this Agreement.

There was an error in the "years" in the signed collective bargaining agreement for 2026-2028 for ARTICLE 6. This memorandum of understanding corrects that error.





The Department would like to make you aware of the following updates:

Personnel: 45/49

Note of Interest:

1-5-26 – Chief Kussow retired with over 27 years of service and AC Rottier retired with over 31 years of service.

1-5-26 – Ofc. Jadon Solis started as the CIT officer

1-6-26 – Promoted Lt. Ross Wierzba and Lt. Alex Beach and promoted Sgt. Jason Dienger and Sgt. Cole O'Neil

1-12-26 – Lt. Steve Spath retired with 22 years of service and Ofc. Mike Radsek retired with over 29 years of service.

1-12-26 – Lt. Roser started his new role as Administrative Lieutenant

1-15- and 1-16-26 – Ofc. Harper, Sgt. Dienger and Lt. Uitenbroek conducted interviews for new officers.

1-16 to 1-26-26 – Lt. Roser presented to poll workers on de-escalation

1-21-26 – Lt. Roser gave presentation at the ADRC on Falls Prevention

1-22-26 – Ofc. Biadasz designed an anniversary badge to celebrate the country's 250th anniversary. This is an optional badge for the officers to purchase and wear.

Calls of Interest:

1-28-26 – Road rage Fourth Ave and Union St. Male reported a driver got out of his vehicle, approached him and swung at him. Ofc. stopped suspect and was arrested for OWI.

1-27-26 – Welfare check 2800 block Minnesota Avenue. Tenant was possibly going to get evicted and subject became suicidal. Duplex occupants evacuated while contact with subject was attempted. Subject eventually acknowledged and stated he had a gun and refused to come out. Contact eventually made with subject and was taken for medical evaluation. Gun and alcohol located.

1-26-26 – Disturbance – 2100 block of Minnesota Avenue – Mother and stepchildren arguing over the way the stepmom was talking to the mom on the telephone. Physical altercation toward the stepmom. Kids left prior to police arrival – juvenile referrals.

1-25-26 – Disturbance 3400 block of Church St – male was confronted another patron and headbutted him. Was argumentative with dispatch and officers – taken to jail.

1-23-26 - Assisted Wausau PD with a stolen vehicle that was tracked to Culvers on Division St. Truck was running, but nobody was in it. Learned the suspect was at and then left McDonalds The male was located by Aspirus Hospital. Male transport to the county line and given to Wausau PD.

1-20-26 - Warrant service for male on Church St. by Walgreens. Subject tried to run while in handcuffs but was stopped by officers. Was then taken to jail and tried to run away from the jailers, he ended up getting tased by jail staff.

01-18-26 - 1800 blk Miller Ct. domestic disturbance, SPPD Officers responded to residence to investigate a disturbance between adult son and mother. The son who recently got out of treatment became intoxicated and threw objects at his mother. Male made threats to Officers as well. Male was arrested on Domestic related charges.

01-17-26 -Water and Wisconsin, traffic stop, SPPD Officer observed a vehicle traveling without headlights during hours of darkness at high rate of speeds. The suspect vehicle (possibly stolen) was located later after it crashed. Occupants of the vehicle fled on foot. A handgun was located near the driver's seat. Search of the area by officers following footprints in the snow located two suspects hiding in different areas. Both suspects were on probation and convicted felons. One of the suspects was transported for medical treatment. Multiple charges resulted for the two suspects to include OWI 2nd, Fleeing, Resisting, OAR PO hold, Felon in possession of firearm.

10-16-26 -Division and Academy, vehicle vs. pedestrian crash, SPPD Officers responded to investigate and learned the pedestrian was struck by suspect vehicle while crossing the street in the crosswalk. The pedestrian sought treatment for injuries. The driver of the suspect vehicle was arrested for OWI 1st causing injury.

01-14-26 -900 Blk Washington Av, disturbance/welfare check, SPPD Officers responded to location for a disturbance in which the female was reportedly making suicidal statements and placed something around her neck. Male caller was contacted by LE. The female left in a vehicle and was contacted during a traffic stop. The female was later arrested for OWI and domestic D.C.

01-14-26 Division and Centerpoint, Report of male dragged by a vehicle. SPPD Officers responded to investigate and learned a male victim was drug when trying to exit the vehicle. The female driver/suspect fled the scene on foot. The male had visible injuries from the

incident. Officers were not able to locate the suspect however P&P placed a warrant out for female suspect.

01-12-26 -2500 5th Av, disturbance, SPPD Officers responded to the residence to investigate a report of a female juvenile who may be suicidal armed with a knife in her locked bathroom. Sister of juvenile was able to convince her to give up the knife. The juvenile later sought treatment.

01-09-26 -ICON, physical disturbance, SPPD Officers responded to a fight which started over a female inside. During the investigation it was learned several males were involved and the fight carried on outside the bar. One male was struck and knocked out. Investigation pending with charges.

01-08-26 -400 Blk Washington, disturbance, SPPD Officers responded to residence for a male under the influence of drugs throwing items around. The male was arrested on bail jumping, DC and P&P.

January Use of Force Summaries

12/27/25 – Officers were working with a subject who was having a mental health issue and the subject was being very aggressive towards other people and also threatened to shoot the officers. At one point the subject reached out and grabbed the officer's face. Due to this the officer delivered a reaction punch to the subject's jaw to release their grip and then the subject was taken to the ground. The subject continued to resist and grab onto the officer's uniform, so another reaction strike was delivered to loosen the subject's grip. The strikes were effective and the subject was apprehended without any injury to the officer or subject.

1/6/26 – Officers were dispatched to a disturbance in Stevens Point. Upon arrival officers had to force open the front door to the residence and encountered several people in an active disturbance. One officer had out their firearm and it was pointed at one subject, while another officer had their taser out, pointed at the same subject. One officer issued commands while the other with the taser used the warning tones. The subject listened to officers as they approached, but then the subject tried to close the door on the officers. At this point the subject was taken to the ground and handcuffed. While on the ground the subject tried grabbing the officer's hands and one officer was forced to apply pressure to the subject's wrist to get them to stop resisting. The subject was later jailed, and no one was injured.

1/13/26 – Officers were called to a residence for a subject who was suicidal and had armed themselves with a knife, hiding in a bathroom. Upon arrival, officers retrieved their less than lethal shotgun and another officer drew their firearm as they made entry into the house, enroute to the bathroom. Upon arrival at the bathroom, the officers were able to open the door, contact the subject, who was no longer armed and de-escalate the situation. Both weapons were just displayed and never actually pointed at the subject.

1/17/26 – One SPPD officer tried to make a traffic stop on a vehicle, but the vehicle fled at a high rate of speed. The officer terminated the chase and later found the suspect vehicle had crashed. Officers searched for the suspects and located both, hiding. While the suspects were taken into custody the officers pointed their firearms at the suspects until they were handcuffed.

1/21/2026 – Officers were called to an elementary school in Stevens Point for a student who had in their possession a fake, toy, gun. The child was refusing to give up the item to the Principal and staff. When officers arrived the child still refused to follow the officer's directions, which resulted in the officers holding the child by the arms, off the ground, and placing the child in handcuffs. The toy gun was removed from the child's possession, and the child was released to their mother. No injuries.

Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) of Custodianship


