Note of Interest:

01-28-26 - Ofc. Solis attended Amherst High School and spoke to a Spanish class about law enforcement and the need for Spanish speaking law enforcement. Ofc. Solis is a graduate of Amherst High and was asked to do the presentation by a former teacher.

02-03-26 – Ofc. Solis was selected to be on the Stevens Point Community Outreach Board in an advisory role.

2-10-26 – Ofc. Kramer attended and participated in Sentry’s Active Threat training. This was live and online training with multiple speakers and representatives from all agencies.

2-16-26 – Officers played basketball at SPASH with the high school students during their lunch hours. Emergency services were invited to have lunch and play a friendly game of basketball.

2-17-26 – AC Mueller, IAC Johnson and IC Williams held final interviews with candidates for police officer. 3 conditional offers given.

2-20-26 – Congressman VanOrden was in town and officers provided security at a couple locations he visited.

2-23-26 – Chief Ed Orgon sworn in as the 31st Chief of Police

2-24-26 –Recognition Banquet at Holiday Inn – organized by Lt. Ben Uitenbroek. There were 6 coin recipients from the community that were recognized. Auxiliary Officers and the Chaplains were recognized as well for their volunteer service this past year.

02-25-26 – Lt. Roser gave a presentation to a group of homeschooled children and their parents regarding staying safe in the community and online, and how to recognize and avoid risky people.

2-26-26 – Vice President JD Vance made a visit to Plover – Pointe Precision. A large number of officers assisted with traffic control for his arrival/departure.

Calls of Interest:

02-21-26 1001 Amber Av, Accidental discharge of firearm. SPPD Officers investigated a reported accidental discharge of a firearm. Officers learned the firearm had been discharged while handling the firearm.

02-21-26 1000 blk Riverview Av. Accidental discharge of firearm. SPPD Officers responded to the location to investigate a bullet hole observed inside the house of the caller. Further investigation found the bullet came from a neighbor's residence. The neighbor at first denied anything happening then stated he had been cleaning his gun and it went off. No one was injured.

02-18-26 500 Blk Union, Death Investigation, SPPD Officers responded to investigate a report of know male who ended his life with a firearm. The male was initially located by a family member. Detectives contacted to assist with the investigation.

02-18-26 Main and Division, Traffic stop, SPPD Officer conducted a traffic stop during which a K-9 sniff was conducted with positive indication. Search of the vehicle resulted in locating Meth, prescription pills, 78 g of Marijuana & 147g of illegal mushrooms. Occupants of the vehicle were arrested on drug related charges and probation and parole violation.

02-15-26 Disturbance, 601 Main Chase Bank, SPPD Officers responded to the bank to investigate a report of a female yelling she had a bomb and was going to blow things up. The female was arrested and taken to jail.

02-25-26 Disturbance, 500 Blk of Bukolt Av, SPPD Officers responded to investigate a report of a known male in upstairs apartment destroying things. Prior to officers arrival, the male suspect jumped out the 2nd story window onto the cement below. The male refused medical treatment and was later arrested for domestic disturbance related charges.

02-09-26, 900 Illinois Av., accidental discharge of firearm, SPPD Officer responded to the ER to investigate an injury by accidental discharge of a firearm which took place in the 2400 blk of Patch St. The incident was initially reported to have taken place in another jurisdiction.

02-07-26, 2nd and Maria, Traffic stop, SPPD Officer stopped vehicle with new damage, the vehicle was leaving the downtown area. The driver exited the vehicle and tried to fight the officer. The male was taken into custody and found to be in possession of 4.1 g cocaine. The

male suspect was arrested for OWI 3rd, resisting and obstructing. The vehicle struck by the suspect vehicle was later located at Park and Elk.

02-02-26, Stanley and Green Av. Traffic Stop, SPPD Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop. The suspect vehicle did not initially comply and pull over, however eventually the suspect stopped and the driver bailed out on foot. The male driver was later located by Detectives who were assisting in the search for the suspect. The male was taken into custody on local charges and charges stemming from a Plover PD case.

02-01-26 1500 Blk Church St. Suspicious/Disturbance , SPPD Officers responded to residence as the caller stated she heard glass breaking and someone possibly inside. Upon arrival, Officer observed broken glass and later located a male inside who was arrested on Criminal charges.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 6 (10)

February Use of Force Summaries

1/27/26 – Officers were called to a residence for a welfare check on a suicidal subject who had threatened suicide with the use of a gun. Officers made entry into the duplex and evacuated the other occupants. One officer observed the victim's door to be ajar, so they drew their issued firearm and called the victim. The victim eventually came out without incident.

2/1/26 – Officers were called to a report of a breaking and entering call at a residence. The caller stated she heard someone inside her residence, when no one should be in there. Officers arrived on scene and drew their firearms, making entry. Officers quickly encountered a subject in the residence and pointed their weapons at the suspect. One officer switched from their firearm to their taser at this point, also pointing it at the suspect. The suspect listened to the officer's commands and was taken into custody without incident or injury.

2/3/26 – A SPPD Detective was assisting another agency with the execution of a narcotics warrant at a residence. During the execution of the warrant, the Detective had their firearm out and pointed it at suspects inside the residence, until everyone was safely taken into custody without incident.

2/3/26 – A suspect had fled from a traffic stop into the woods. The suspect was known to have a warrant for their arrest and there was also information that the suspect was suspected of having a gun in the past as well. Officers surrounded the area the suspect fled to, and other officers followed the suspect's tracks in the snow. The suspect eventually ran towards an officer on the perimeter. That officer had their weapon pointed at the suspect. The suspect surrendered without incident and was taken into custody.

2/7/26 – SPPD Officers were working on a harassment case and were attempting to arrest the suspect. While putting the suspect's hands behind their back, the suspect became tense and

tried to pull away from officers. The officers took the suspect to the ground at this point and handcuffed the suspect. One of the officers scratched their knee during the take down. The suspect was not injured.

2/8/26 – An SPPD Officer was attempting to handcuff a suspect who was acting intoxicated and potentially trying to leave the area of a traffic stop. The officer was alone, attempting to handcuff the suspect, when the suspect began to tense up and not allow the other handcuff to go on. The officer was able to get one handcuff secured on the suspect's left wrist but was forced to take the suspect to the ground in an attempt to apply the other cuff. Two other SPPD officers arrived on scene quickly and assisted, prying the suspect's right arm from under their body and holding the suspect's legs. Eventually the handcuffs got applied and the suspect was placed in a squad car. No injuries, however, the initial officer tore their pants during the scuffle on the ground.

Detectives Report for February:

Drug Detectives continue to work and build cases within our community, they have investigated and closed out numerous recent drug activity tips. Drug Detectives assisted task force with 5 controlled drug buys, one controlled gun buy, 6 search warrants including one in Stevens Point. Detective Lawrynk and Detective Gomez attended the WNOA (Wisconsin Narcotics Officer Association) 2026 Winter Conference.

Detective Drossel and Detective Lepinski assisted patrol and investigated a suicide.

Det. Drossel continues to work a variety of cases.

Detective Gomez continues to work a variety of fraud/scam cases which require many subpoenas/search warrants to obtain records.

Detectives all responded to the area of a traffic stop where driver fled on foot from patrol. Detective Drossel and Detective Gomez located and arrested the suspect without incident.

Det. Poeschel and Det. Brooks continue to work numerous active sexual assault cases along with assisting Portage County Health and Human Services. Both are working several active ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children) cases as well. Det. Poeschel attended a 2 day training in Waukesha titled "Supervising Criminal Investigations Unit" and a 3 day training titled "Active Threat Integrated Response Conference". Detective Poeschel was at the Marathon County Cell Phone/Computer Forensics Lab 2 days in February
