MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This is a voluntary agreement between the City of Stevens Point and the Stevens Point Police Officers Organization/Wisconsin Professional Police Association/Law Enforcement Employee Relations Division. The City and the Association are parties to a collective bargaining agreement (“CBA”) expiring December 31, 2028.

WHEREAS the City of Stevens Point and the members of the Association are desirous of changing the regular schedule for Administrative Duty and Investigations Bureau Officers.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the parties do hereby agree to the following modifications to the articles within the collective bargaining agreement.

1. This agreement is non-precedential for any and all purposes.
2. This agreement shall be binding and effective as of March 30, 2026.
3. This agreement may be changed, modified, corrected, or terminated during the term by written agreement.
4. This agreement shall terminate December 31, 2026, unless the parties agree to an extension.

PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT

ARTICLE 3 – HOURS

- I. Administrative Duty. Police officers assigned to administrative functions shall work a cycle of five (5) days on duty (Monday through Friday) followed by two (2) days off duty; OR officers assigned to administrative functions shall work a ten (10) hour schedule four (4) days a week with schedules of Monday – Thursday or Tuesday – Friday. If working a cycle of a ten (10) hour schedule four (4) days a week, the day(s) off may be subject to change as needed at the discretion and agreement between an officer and their supervisor. Start times to vary as determined by the Chief of Police or their designee. The Chief of Police or their designee reserve the right to set a minimum staffing level as they see fit.
- J. School Resource Officers. Hours of police officers assigned as School Resource Officers (hereinafter referred to as SROs) are outlined in the Stevens Point Police Department Policy #803.5, Subject: School Resource Officer Program. When temporarily assigned to non-SRO duties, the SROs shall work a cycle of five (5) eight- (8) hour work days on duty, followed by two (2) days off duty, Monday through Friday between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. The monthly schedule shall be completed in advance. During the summer hours the SROs are assigned to either Patrol or IB as support personnel. If assigned to IB as support personnel, the SRO may choose to follow the

IB schedule. SROs are not assigned to the twelve-(12) hour schedule that the regular shift officers work and do not receive K-time credit. SRO assigned to summer hours shall be allowed to submit time off selections upon notification of summer duty assignment. SRO will have one week to complete scheduled time off selections. These scheduled time off selections shall have no impact on staffing levels or granting time off to officers regularly assigned to either Patrol or the Investigation Bureau. All other discretionary time off requests shall follow established policy in regard to manpower for the assigned workgroup. Summer hours shall be defined as the expected timeframe commonly referred to as “summer break” and unexpected events which no longer require the SRO to be assigned at a school.

- K. Investigators. Officers assigned to the Investigation Bureau shall work a cycle of five (5) eight (8) hour workdays on duty (Monday through Friday) followed by two (2) days off duty; OR Officers assigned to the Investigation Bureau shall work a cycle of ten (10) hour schedule four (4) days a week on a rotating basis with schedules of Monday – Thursday or Tuesday – Friday. If working a cycle of a ten (10) hour schedule four (4) days a week, the day(s) off may be subject to change as needed at the discretion and agreement between an officer and their supervisor. Start times to vary as determined by the Chief of Police or their designee. The Chief of Police or their designee reserve the right to set a minimum staffing level as they see fit.

The normal operational hours of the Investigative Bureau shall include the hours 6:00 a.m. through 10:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The monthly schedule shall be completed in advance. The Department is not obligated to staff the Investigative Bureau all hours listed but has the authority to staff the Bureau any time during those hours without officers being subject to overtime or call time, as long as those hours are normal duty hours assigned as scheduled in advance.

ARTICLE 4 – OVERTIME

B. Overtime:


2. Officers assigned to administrative and Investigation Bureau duties will be compensated at the rate of time and one-half based on their normal hourly rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of eight (8) or ten (10) hours per day, depending on their assigned work schedule as explained in Article 3, and for all hours worked in excess of their normal duty schedule (days off).

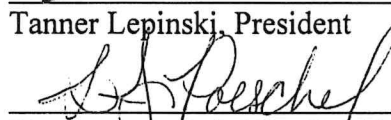

Note of Interest:

3-4-26 – Lt. Roser hosted a pizza party for the Safety Cadets at McKinley School for 24 Cadets.

3-5-26 – Lt. Roser and Lt. Johnson attended the Career Fair at UW Platteville. Numerous students were interested in the Stevens Point Police Dept., including one from Stevens Point and 6 students asked about internships.

3-5/6-26 – Ofc. Solis and CSO Hensel attended CIP training hosted at the Stevens Point Police Department.

3-6-26 – Lt. Roser hosted a pizza party for Safety Cadets at Bannach School for 27 Cadets.

3-9-26 – Ofc. Solis attended the Stevens Point Community Outreach meeting. Ofc. Solis has been asked to be part of the board in an advisory position.

3-11-26 – Lt. Roser attended the SPASH Career Day. Lots of questions from students on how to get into Law Enforcement and working for the Stevens Point Police Department. Lots of recruitment pamphlets were handed out.

I attended a virtual training course for SRO's working with Autism sponsored by the SPAPSD and attended a 2-day Peer Support & Wellness Conference in Wisconsin Dells as well. Other events included Spring Break and the Freshman trip to Washington DC for a week.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 5 (15)

3-3-26 – Officers were called to a welfare check in Stevens Point for a known subject. Upon officers' arrival, the subject shut the bedroom door on officers and refused to come out. The subject came out one time with a knife, pointing it at officers. One officer deployed their taser but was only able to get one probe deployed into the subject before the subject retreated into their bedroom. At this time K-9 Barry was deployed, and an active K-9 display was used. At this time the subject came out, without the knife and was apprehended by officers without incident.

3-9-26 – SPPD Detectives executed a search warrant at a residence, looking for narcotics. During the warrant execution, Detectives pointed their firearms at occupants inside the residence, until everyone was taken into custody without incident. No injuries.

3-9-26 – SPPD Detectives were assisting an agency with a search warrant for narcotics. During the execution a subject fled on foot, was tackled by officers and continued to resist. Officers were forced to use pressure points to try and handcuff the subject who had injured another officer. They had also had their weapons aimed at the occupants of the residence during the execution of the warrant. No SPPD officers were injured.

3-15-2026 – SPPD Officers were dispatched to a residence for a report of a burglary and a stabbing. While trying to locate the incident officers had their guns drawn at subject believed to be involved and one less lethal shotgun was displayed as well. Two subjects were taken into custody who were believed to be in possession of knives at one point. No officers were injured.

3-23-2026 – Officers were called to a residence for a disturbance. Upon arrival officers could hear people inside actively arguing, however no one would come to the door, so officers forced the door open. When they did this, one officer drew their firearm in a direction towards one of the people arguing. That person was removed from the near vicinity and then two officers addressed the second subject who were not listening to commands. One officer had their firearm out while the other had their taser out. The subject was eventually taken into custody without incident.

Detectives Report for March:

Several fraud cases have been investigated by the patrol division, and then forwarded to IB. Detectives Gomez and Drossel have taken the brunt of these cases and have worked diligently to investigate these matters.

Detective Brooks, Detective Poeschel, and Detective Drossel have stayed very busy with several new sensitive crime cases assigned to them in March. During these investigations, they have completed multiple CAC interviews in Wausau and completed several in-person interviews.

A search warrant was executed at a residence in Stevens Point by Detectives, led by Detective Lawrynk and Detective Lepinski. The focus was on illegal narcotics and items used to consume and/or sell those narcotics.

Several officers, including Detective Lawrynk and Detective Gomez attended the Winter WNOA conference in the Wisconsin Dells at the end of February.

Lieutenant Johnson, Lieutenant Roser, Detective Poeschel and Ofc. Kramer attended the Active Threat Integrated Response conference, hosted by the Wisconsin Active Threat Training Association in the Wisconsin Dells at the end of February.

On March 15th, Detectives Poeschel, Gomez, Brooks and Lt. Johnson were all called in to investigate a stabbing/burglary incident. The case involved several suspects/witnesses and took the Detectives most of the week to complete. In conclusion, over 20 reports were completed, 5 different people were charged and over 30 items of evidence were gathered.

Sgt. Lawrynk and Det. Lepinski have been very busy assisting local agencies with drug investigations as well as conducting several operations locally in Stevens Point as well.

Detective Poeschel has been working on a case assigned to her on March 10th, involving a suspicious male that was arrested near an apartment complex by the patrol division. Detective Poeschel has identified disturbing material on the suspect's phone and has positively identified multiple victims in this case. The case is not concluded at this time; however, Detective Poeschel anticipates over 30 charges to be forwarded to the DA's office for review when the case is completed.
