3. Presentation by UWSP Athletics regarding first-year alcohol sales, and consideration of ongoing authorization for alcohol sales during Pointer home football and hockey games at Community Stadium and KB Willett Arena.

On June 4, 2025 the Board of Park Commissioners took the following action:

Motion to approve the sales of alcohol by UWSP at UWSP home games inside the KB Willett and Goerke Stadium on a 1-year trial basis by Glodosky, second by Sorenson, motion passed 9-0.

As agreed to at that time, UWSP Athletics is returning to the board to provide an overview of operations and outcomes from the first year of alcohol sales during UWSP home athletic contests in Goerke Park. Materials are included in the packet which provide information in advance of the meeting. In addition, UWSP Athletics is requesting ongoing authorization from the Parks Commission to continue alcohol sales in the same manner moving forward.

If approved, UWSP Athletics would no longer return annually to the Board of Park Commissioners for authorization, unless the “ongoing” authorization was revoked by future action of this board or the common council.

As a reminder, city ordinance continues to prohibit alcohol possession and consumption within Goerke Park. If this authorization is granted by the Board, it serves only as a limited exemption to allow UWSP Athletics to conduct alcohol sales during approved home athletic contests in Goerke Park.

City staff did not observe any facility-related issues associated with the alcohol sales during the first year of operations. Additionally, the enhanced security staffing and trash collection practices implemented by UWSP resulted in less post-event cleanup than was experienced prior to alcohol sales being permitted.

The Stevens Point Police Department has provided a letter with their requirements should this request be approved. Parks, Recreation and Forestry Department staff have no objections to this request but is asking the Park Commission to determine whether ongoing authorization is appropriate or if the board prefers to continue with annual requests and approval considerations for this request.

Summary of Operation

Community Stadium has 6-7 student worker security personnel, 2-3 police/university officers, and 3-4 Athletic Administrators.

KB Willett has 7-8 student worker security personnel, 2-3 police/university officers, and 2-3 Athletic Administrators.

UWSP's beer sales operation at athletic events is designed around controlled service, fan safety, and compliance with university and state alcohol policies. Alcohol sales are limited to designated locations within athletic venues, typically utilizing enclosed or monitored beer garden-style service areas when necessary. Sales are handled by certified bartenders responsible for ID checks and responsible alcohol service.
