5-1-26 – Chief Orgon, Assistant Chiefs Williams and Mueller attended the WiPEG Chief's meeting Sheboygan.

5-6-26 – The department received \$800 donation to the SP Police Auxiliary from Central WI Models Railroaders Limited.

5-6-26 – Lt. Roser put on a presentation at the High Rise for Housing Authority. They asked for a presentation regarding scams and general safety for their residents.

5-8-26 – Lt. Roser took 72 Top Safety Cadets to Wisconsin Dells for their reward in earning Top Cadet through their school.

5-8-26 – Lts. Wierzba and Beach graduated from Leadership in Police Organizations

5-18-26 - Ofc. Dylan Messacar started as the 297th officer

5-19-26 – Lt. Roser, AC. Mueller, and Chief Orgon attended a meeting with local Pastors regarding the current homeless issue, and how we can come together to help resolve the issue.

5-25-26 – Lt. Roser held a meeting with local resident regarding a book he is writing and wanting to know more about Law Enforcement.

5-26-26 Chief's interview with four applicants for the current hiring process

5-27-26 – Lt. Roser attended an RTF meeting as an instructor organizing roles and responsibilities for the upcoming training.

5-30-26 - Cruz with the Cops K9 fundraiser

All throughout the month there were meetings regarding homeless, abandoned property etc. that CSO Andrew Hensel and Lt. Roser attended. CSO Hensel has been big in collection property that is deemed abandoned. CSO Hensel has also come up with a system for donating bicycles and the system for how we will register and license bicycles that other businesses want to donate, so we can track it down to the person, and not the business.

Calls of Interest:

5-4-26 - 400 Blk of West Wilson- Structure Fire- SPPD Officers responded to assist SPFD with the fire scene. SPFD later requested a detective to assist with the fire investigation as well as the DCI K-9 unit.

5-4-26 - 200 blk Minnesota - Welfare Check- SPPD Officers respond to investigate a report of suicidal male who had contacted dispatch and his parents. The male then decided to run and hide in Schmeeckle Reserve. Eventually Officers were able to locate him and learned the male took pills with a clear plan to harm himself. The male was transported for treatment.

5-8-26 - Vehicle Pursuit- SPPD Officers observed a vehicle driving the wrong way. When Officers attempted a traffic stop the suspect vehicle fled. Officers were able to spike the tires of the suspect vehicle after which the suspect crashed. The driver fled on foot and was appended. The male suspect continued to be uncooperative requiring use of the WRAP to facilitate blood draw for OWI. The driver was transported to jail on P&P hold.

5-18-26 - 2800 Mary St. – Disturbance - SPPD Officers responded to the residence for a physical disturbance between a male and female. The female at one point brandished an AR-15 Rifle which was unloaded. The male took the firearm from the female. During the disturbance the male's shirt was torn and he was injured. The female was arrested for domestic DC and battery.

5-18-26 - 1000 Blk Whiting - Overdose- SPPD Officers responded to the location for a possible drug overdose. While dealing with the OD, further investigation located multiple firearms. The male suspect for the OD was currently out on bond with condition not to possess firearms. The male was transported and treated medically. The firearms were seized and charges referred to the DA's office.

5-20-26 - 1500 Blk of College - possible break in in progress - SPPD Officers responded to a residence to investigate a report of a male attempting to gain entry to the house by kicking the door. Upon further investigation, the suspect attempting to kick in the door in was an intoxicated resident who had locked himself out.

5-20-26 - 1500 Blk of Maria Dr - report of multiple shots fired - SPPD Officers responded to the location with information from the caller the male suspect was shooting at wildlife. Contact made with the suspect who informed. Officers he had been shooting his .22 at a squirrel on his bird feeders. Suspect recently moved to the city from a more rural location and was unaware of city ordinances. Male was cited for discharge of firearm in city.

5-20-26 - 1900 Blk Miller Ct. - Ambulance Assist - SPPD Officers responded to the residence for an unresponsive female with CPR InProgress. CPR efforts were unsuccessful and the female was determined to be deceased. Further investigation learned the death may have been an overdose. Medical Examiner and Detectives responded to the residence, Investigation pending.

5-22-26 - Third and Main – Disturbance - SPPD Officers responded to the intersection to investigate a physical disturbance. The investigation resulted in one of the males being arrested for Disorderly Conduct, Battery and P&P hold and obstructing for giving officer a false name.

5-22-26 - Parker John's Disturbance - SPPD Officers responded and investigated a physical fight between two patrons which started over not being served fast enough. Two females were arrested and jailed on disorderly conduct and battery charges.

SPASH K-9 Deployment of the Student Parking lot which resulted in several vehicles with K-9 hits and subsequent vehicle searches. The searches located nicotine and vapes and an unloaded encased shot gun. No drugs were located.

Monthly Use of Force Reporting (annual total in parenthesis):

Number of Use of Force Incidents: 5 (24)

5-7-26 – Officers were called to a residence multiple times because the resident had consumed methamphetamines and they were hallucinating and seeing things that did not exist. After several calls to dispatch the person began to become agitated and swear and yell at dispatchers. The final time SPPD went to the residence, the subject wanted to go to the hospital, so an ambulance was requested. Before the ambulance arrived, the subject clenched their fists and charged at the officer, yelling for him to leave. The officer removed their taser

and pointed it at the subject, instructing them to turn around and put their hands behind them. The subject complied and was arrested without incident.

5-9-26 – Officers attempted to stop a vehicle for a traffic offense and the vehicle fled from officers. After a lengthy pursuit, an officer was able to deploy stop sticks, damaging some of the tires on the vehicle. The vehicle crashed into a mailbox and the driver fled from the vehicle, running through an apartment building, back out onto the street. Officers quickly located the suspect, pointed their firearms at the suspect and ordered the suspect to the ground. K-9 Officers and K-9 were present, and the suspect was advised to stop or possibly be bitten by the K-9. The suspect stopped and was taken into custody at this time. No injuries.

5-12-26 – An officer was advised of a wanted subject driving in the City of Stevens Point. The officer located the wanted subject at a motel and contacted the subject. The subject pulled away from the officer and refused to cooperate. The officer tried to threaten force by displaying the taser and OC without the desired effect. Eventually another officer arrived and the two grabbed the subject by both arms and took the subject to the floor. While taking the subject to the floor, they hit their head. The subject was medically cleared with no visible injury and then jailed.

5-14-26 – SPPD Detectives were assisting another agency with a search warrant. The suspect was seen leaving the residence in a vehicle. SPPD Detectives activated their emergency lights in their vehicle and stopped the suspect vehicle in the parking lot. SPPD Detectives exited their vehicle and pointed their firearms at the suspect, taking the suspect into custody without incident.

5-23-26 – SPPD Officers were investigating a crash where the driver had fled from the scene. Officers were attempting to locate the now known suspect and went to the suspect's residence. Upon arrival, a male fled on foot from officers. Officers pursued the suspect and pointed their taser at the suspect with the warning tones activated several times. Eventually the suspect was located hiding under a vehicle and was once again held at taser point. The suspect was then taken into custody without incident or injury.

Detectives Report for May:
