

06-08-26 – The Honor Guard presented at the Arson Investigator Conference at the Holiday Inn with the FD & Detective Tanner Lepinski celebrated 8 years with the department and Lt. Roser conducted a walkthrough of PJ Jacobs school for TRF training coming up. Lt. Roser attended a Crime Stoppers meeting. Crime Stoppers agreed to come to National Night Out.

Calls of Interest:

06-02-26 - Vehicle Pursuit/ Church and Shaurette - SPPD Officers attempted to initiate a traffic stop with a suspect vehicle for failure to stop at stop sign and speeding. The suspect vehicle fled and officers pursued the vehicle and terminated the pursuit. Officers waited for the suspect at his residence. When the suspect and his vehicle were close to his residence, he fled once again striking a PTSO squad car continuing to flee with two flat tires. Officers later conducted a high-risk stop when the suspect vehicle stopped. The suspect was taken into custody on multiple charges.

06-13-26 – Disturbance - Iverson Park - SPPD Officers responded to report of a suspect vehicle which almost struck pedestrians with a driver who possibly pointed a gun at people in the park. SPPD Officers located the vehicle in the area and made contact with the suspect vehicle and conducted a high risk stop. Upon further investigation the male admitted to shooting an orbee gun at people. The male was later arrested on Disorderly Conduct and Probation Hold and the female driver was cited for disorderly conduct and underage alcohol.

06-16-26 - Traffic Stop/ Vehicle Pursuit - Second and 4th Av. SPPD Officer attempted to conduct a traffic stop on a motorcycle without license Plates. The motorcycle and suspect failed to yield and or stop fleeing officers. Officers pursued the vehicle until it ran out of gas. Officers got a perimeter set up and a fast action response team with a PTSO's shield and LL if he started walking down the street with the gun. A Lt. started to get the MRAP due to the threat of the male walking towards PJ Middle School that was letting children out. The male claimed to be a veteran, and Negotiators assisted the Officers with a long negotiation where they were able to talk him into putting the gun inside and coming out with his hands up. The officers shut down Clark St. while we took him into custody. The male had body armor vest in his green blazer along with patches from different military branches along with a bunch of military gear. Detectives helped search his room and located a realistic looking airsoft Glock pistol in a gun case inside that the male later said he planned to point at officers knowing we would shoot him. His family member confirmed he was never in the military, just infatuated with it and had several mental disorders. The male agreed to voluntary commitment at the hospital.

06-19-26- Warrant Arrest/Bike Pursuit/Foot Pursuit- Officers started looking downtown for a male with five active warrants and found him riding his bike downtown. The male did not want to stop, and they pursued him until he rode the wrong way down Centerpoint and they lost him going around the apartments. A Sgt had a hunch he would be behind the Nordic Nights public sauna and PSOL and was correct. The male jumped out of the bushes and the Sgt. got into a foot pursuit with him, assisted by UW-SP Officer, until he was out of gas in the back yard of 1026 block of Smith St. The male was arrested and jailed for resisting, warrant arrest x5, felony bail jumping x3, misd. Bail jumping x2, and a PO hold.

On 06/09/2026 at approximately 1425 hours I, Sergeant Jason Dienger, was requested to assist Officer Jolin on a traffic stop. I arrived on scene at approximately 1439 hours. Upon arrival, Officer Jolin was seated in his car, I did not stop to speak with Officer Jolin. Officer Jolin requested a free air sniff of the vehicle prior to my arrival.

K9 Coye and I were last certified on August 11th, 2025 by American Working Dog for; obedience, handler protection, building searches, tracking and field searches and for narcotic contraband detection in the following odors: Cocaine, Heroin, and Methamphetamine. This certification is valid for twelve months. Upon location of the odors of these narcotic contraband substances, K9 Coye's behavior will change. K9 Coye is trained to come to final canine response by sitting or lying or locking up and staring at the source odor. This is called a "passive" final canine response. This response may also indicate items recently contaminated with, or associated with, the odor of one or more of the narcotic contraband substances.

I directed K9 Coye to the rear driver corner of the vehicle, and I commanded K9 Coye to sniff for the presence of any and all of the above listed narcotic contraband odors. I observed the following changes in K9 Coye's behavior; K9 Coye changed sniffing speed, sniffing pattern, and sniffing direction. I observed K9 Coye change his body axis, nose positioning, and ear set. K9 Coye slowed his pace down, stopped and went to a final passive response by sitting at the rear passenger side door of the vehicle. K9 Coye was praised with a tennis ball. The vehicle and its contents were then searched.

The search resulted in locating 10 pipes with methamphetamine residue, 1.9 grams of cocaine, 15.4 grams of psilocybin mushrooms, 21.5 grams of THC gummies, 46.8 grams of methamphetamine, 19.85 grams of marijuana, and approximately 200 amphetamine pills.

06-01-26 – Officers responded to a welfare check on a subject with a significant knee injury. The subject was upset law enforcement was called and tried to resist their efforts in receiving necessary medical attention; by grabbing a glass bottle and stating they were going to fight the officers. The officers grabbed the subject's arms and directed the subject to the bed, face first, allowing the subject to be handcuffed and medically treated, later being transported to the hospital. No injuries.

06-02-26 – SPPD narcotics officer assisted another agency with the execution of a search warrant at a residence. During the execution of the warrant the officer pointed their firearm at the occupants until they were safely taken into custody. No injuries.

06-02-26 – Several SPPD Officers were attempting to stop a fleeing vehicle in Stevens Point after multiple traffic violations. The vehicle eventually came to a stop after a crash and a high-risk stop was completed. During the stop, officers had their firearms out and pointed at the sole occupant of the vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody without incident or injury.

06-03-26 – SPPD Officers were attempting to locate a subject who was wanted on a fully extraditable warrant through another state. The subject was known to be inside of a hotel room on the city's north side. Officers attempted contact at the door of the room and had K9 Coye with for presence. The subject came out of the door and because of the nature of the warrant, one officer had their duty pistol drawn. Once the subject's hands were observed, clear of any weapons, the officer holstered their weapon, and the subject was placed into handcuffs without incident.

06-13-26 – SPPD officers received a report of an occupant in a vehicle who displayed a handgun towards another occupied vehicle. Officers located the suspected vehicle and conducted a high-risk traffic stop on the vehicle and its 2 occupants. During the stop all officers involved pointed their firearms at the vehicle and the occupants, until both suspects were taken into custody without incident. A toy gun was found in the backseat. No injuries.

06-16-26 – An SPPD officer was trying to make a traffic stop on a motorcycle with no license plate, however the motorcycle fled from the officer. After a short pursuit the motorcycle stopped and the officer, along with other officers, pointed their firearm at the driver, issuing commands. The driver was taken into custody without incident or injury.

06-18-26 – Officers were called to an area in Stevens Point for a suicidal subject. The subject had threatened to have law enforcement shoot them because they wanted suicide by cop and they had a gun. The subject was observed from a distance for a while, while negotiators spoke with the subject on the phone. The subject eventually surrendered to law enforcement without incident. During the contact several officers had their rifles pointed at the subject and one officer had their less lethal shotgun displayed as well. No injuries.

06-20-26- An SPPD officer located a stolen vehicle being operated in the city. The officer conducted a high-risk traffic stop on the vehicle and during the stop several officers pointed their firearms at the sole occupant in the vehicle. Commands were given to the driver by officers, and the subject was taken into custody without injury or incident.

06-23-26 – SPPD officers responded to a residence after the neighbor reported hearing a firearm being discharged one time by a known occupant with mental health issues. Officer proceeded with caution, weapons drawn, and eventually contacted the occupant of the residence. Detectives Report for June:

Det. Drossel has completed multiple investigations this month, one of which was closed was a Child SA case with a request for 2nd degree Sexual Assault of a child on a suspect after having to travel to Chippewa County and Sauk County to complete interviews with people involved in this case that occurred over 2 years ago.

Det. Gomez was assigned several scam/fraud cases in June and assisted patrol in handling a scam that had just occurred. The victim from Stevens Point was out \$50,000, however an officer in Minnesota had contacted our department because they had arrested the suspect, while investigating their own scam case and came across the Stevens Point victim's money. Det. Gomez was able to work with the MN agency, complete the necessary paperwork and get a detainer on the suspect, ensuring the suspect would not be released from jail in Minnesota before being transferred to our local jail.

Det. Brooks and Det. Poeschel have closed several cases this month, referring several of those cases for charges. They have both remained very busy with other investigations, with several of those being ICAC tips sent to them from the state.

Drug Detectives have remained busy assisting other agencies and working on local cases, with one case culminating with a planned warrant execution on June 29th.

Det. Drossel, Det. Gomez and Det. Lepinski were commended on their roles involving a suicidal male earlier in June, assisting patrol in bringing the situation to a safe conclusion.

Instruction While Off-duty:

Those members of the Department who are appointed by the Chief for instruction while off-duty for any amount of time will be compensated with overtime (Article 8, Section B. Overtime) for the hours of instruction. Instruction overtime shall be logged into the normal overtime tracker.

1. That the City and Union agree to strike language as noted below:

Instruction While Off-duty:

Those members of the Department who are appointed by the Chief for instruction while off-duty for any amount of time will be compensated with overtime (Article 8, Section B. Overtime) for the hours of instruction. ~~Instruction overtime shall be logged into the normal overtime tracker.~~


2. That the City and the Union agree, solely for the purpose of resolving the contact language change is to remain consistent with an agreement between both parties of Department Policies: 302 Overtime, 303 Overtime Hire Back, and 304 Overtime Mandation.
3. That the City and Union agree that for all future Instruction While Off-duty issues regarding language of Article 19- Salaries of the Agreement Between City of Stevens Point and International Association of Firefighters Local 484, AFL-CIO January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2027 (“Contract”) shall remain unchanged for the duration of the current bargaining agreement.
4. That this Agreement shall be applicable to language in any future labor agreements between the City and Union to the extent that those agreements contain language identical to Article 19 Salaries, Instruction While Off-duty of the Contract.




