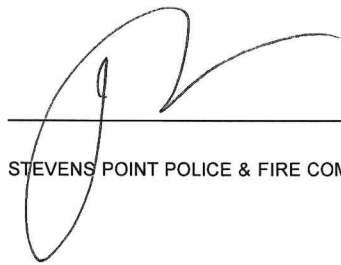

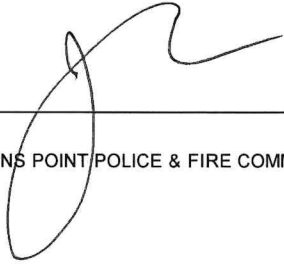

Calls of Interest:

07-04-26- River Front - a female reported to SPPD Officers she and a friend observed a male handling a handgun while on the River Front Grounds. The female showed a picture she took of the male with the gun. The picture and descriptors were broadcast to Law Enforcement on and near the River Front grounds. The male and associates were located on the riverfront grounds and detained. Upon further investigation, the juvenile males had been in possession of a CO2 pistol. According to nearby witnesses, one of the males threw a gun into the pond shortly before officer contact. Assistance by SPFD was able to retrieve a CO2 pistol from the pond. The juvenile males were issued citations to include UAL, DC and poss. of facsimile firearm and released to guardian.

07-07-26 – 2100 block Division - SPPD Officer investigated a report of a male flashing a gun out of a truck. Officers contacted driver of the truck who admitted to having a BB gun and water gun in his hands during the incident. Citation issued to driver.

07-10-26 - 3000 Blk of Vine St - SPPD Officers responded to report of an unknown/unwanted naked male inside the caller's house. The female caller ran out of her house to call 911. The male had since fled the residence. Officers searched the area, unable to locate the male. Further investigation found various personal items moved around and arranged in the caller's bedroom. Two hours later SPPD Officers responded to a different residence on Vine for a report of a naked male standing at the back door. Officers arrived and searched the area and were initially not able to locate the naked male suspect. A UWSP Officer observed the male running through Schmeeckle, a SPPD Officer conducted a short foot pursuit. The naked male initially started to walk towards the officer with a knife, however dropped the knife and was taken into custody. The male was arrested on multiple charges.

07-13-26 -300 Blk of Fifth- SPPD Officers responded to residence to investigate a report that a female who displayed a handgun during an argument. Upon further investigation, the male caller and possible meth user was no longer welcome at the female's house. The male's account of events changed and was not corroborated by female's account. The gun in question was determined to be in a case and locked. The male caller left the residence.

07-16-26 - 108 Minnesota - SPPD Officers responded to report of a naked male in the caller's apartment. Officers contacted the male who was very intoxicated. Officers assisted the male in clothing himself, and he was later transported to a medical facility for detox.

07-18-26 - Main and Smith- SPPD Officers conducted a traffic stop during which SPPD K-9 indicated. Subsequent search of the vehicle identified a male passenger who was on probation and in possession of a knife. The male passenger was arrested on probation hold.

07-18-26 - PD Lobby - SPPD Officers spoke with male complainant who reported he was possibly poisoned by his ex-wife. Male complainant provided video footage and other possible evidence. Investigation on-going/ arrest made.

07-19-26 - 1430 Torun - SPPD Officers responded to the location for report of verbal threats and physical violence between a male and two females who. Upon further investigation, officers spoke with a male victim and female. The female suspect had left the area on foot into a wooded area reportedly armed with a knife. Despite a search with drone officers were unable to locate the suspect, pending charges of domestic battery and disorderly conduct.

07-24-26 - Outside Buffy's - Report of two males left unconscious outside the bar. SPPD Officers responded and further investigation learned the two males were calling another male the 'N' word and tried to fight the male. The two males were struck and knocked unconscious. Investigation pending.

07-26-26 - 3801 Roberts PL - caller reported a known male in a manic state who armed himself with bear spray and knives. The male in a manic state made threats to kill another person. SPPD Officers were busy with other calls and PTSO contacted the manic male who was arrested on a P.O. Hold.

06-28-26 – Officers were downtown conducting foot patrol when they could hear a disturbance outside a local tavern. Officers recognized the suspect as an intoxicated person they had already written a ticket to earlier in the night, fighting with a staff member from the tavern on the sidewalk. Officers attempted to keep the suspect on the ground and handcuff them, however the suspect resisted, grabbing at officers' duty belts and feet, refusing to obey their commands. The officers were forced to deliver a knee strike to the suspect's rear, pushing the suspect forward, causing the suspect to strike their face on the pavement. The suspect was also trying to grab the foot of the staff member and refused to let go, so an officer delivered several strikes to the suspect before they released their grip. The suspect continued to resist officer's attempts at handcuffing, so a third officer delivered a short burst of OC spray to the suspect's eyes. The suspect was then handcuffed, however spit twice on officer's faces, so the suspect was placed in a wrap, and a spit hood was applied. The suspect was treated for injuries received and

then jailed. Two officers received bruised and scraped knees from dealing with the suspect on the pavement.

06-29-26 – Several Detectives executed a search warrant at an apartment in Stevens Point looking for narcotics. There were several people inside the apartment, and the Detectives pointed their weapons at the occupants until they were safely taken into custody without incident or injury.

07-04-26 – Officers were working an extra patrol detail at Riverfront Rendezvous when they received a report of some kids passing around a handgun. Officers observed the suspect group of kids, which dispersed when the officers attempted to contact them. While attempting to apprehend the juveniles, both officers drew their firearms at the juveniles suspected of being in possession of the firearm. All suspects were taken into custody without incident or injury. The gun was later located, determined to be only airsoft and destroyed.

07-06-26 – Officers had responded to a disturbance at a residence, where the suspect, known to the caller, had already left in a vehicle. An SPPD officer waited near the suspect's residence and soon after observed the suspect arrived at the residence. The officer got out and told the suspect they were under arrest, to turn around, and place their hands behind their back. The subject did not listen and when the officer grabbed the suspect, the suspect tensed up. The officer attempted to handcuff the subject, but due to the resistive tension and the fact the suspect was reaching the front of their person, the officer tripped the suspect, causing them to fall over onto the ground. The suspect hit their head when they fell and broke their glasses. The suspect was taken into custody and medically cleared, before being taken to jail. The officer was uninjured.

07-07-26 – Officers responded to the hospital for an out-of-control patient, who had bit security staff. Officers gained control of the subject, advising the subject they were under arrest and then, due to the resistive behavior of the subject, the officers placed the subject in the wrap restraint. While doing this the subject continued to resist, so one officer applied pressure to the subject's wrist to get the subject to comply, which was effective. The subject was later jailed, without injury.

07-10-26 – Officers were looking in a wooded area for a naked subject, who was possibly in possession of a knife. The subject was found trespassing in a person's apartment prior to police being called. One officer located the naked subject and ran towards the subject, issuing commands to get on the ground. The subject ignored the officer and came towards the officer. The officer drew their taser and then transitioned to their firearm after realizing the subject had a knife. The subject threw the knife towards the officer at this point. The officer was not struck with the knife and then transitioned to their taser instructing the subject to get on the ground. The subject listened after also throwing their phone at the officer. The subject was taken into custody without incident.

07-17-26 – SPPD officers were assisting PISO with clearing a residence of unwanted subjects. After several announcements were made for all the occupants to exit, the officers entered. One officer had their firearm drawn, while the other had their taser drawn. More people were contacted inside the residence, and the weapons were pointed at those subjects until they were taken into custody without incident or injury.

07-21-26 – SPPD officers were searching for a subject who was possibly armed and had been cutting themselves. The subject was also wanted for questioning in reference to a trespassing complaint. One officer located the subject hiding behind a shed and due to it being unknown if the subject was still

armed with a knife, the officer drew their firearm and pointed it at the subject, issuing commands. The subject listened to the officer and was taken into custody without incident or injury.

07-26-26 – SPPD Officers were investigating a disturbance. One of the subjects involved was intoxicated and violating their bond conditions. Officers tried to arrest the subject and the subject tensed up, refusing to put their hands behind their back. One officer removed their taser and advised the subject they were going to be tased. The subject was eventually handcuffed and jailed without injury.

Detectives Report for July:

Drug Detectives completed a narcotics investigation on the south side of the city, which culminated in a residential search warrant which turned up suspected fentanyl. One person was arrested and charged with 3 counts of delivery of meth, delivery of fentanyl, possession with intent to deliver meth and fentanyl, and maintaining a drug trafficking place. The suspect was issued a \$30,000 cash bond, is also being held on a PO hold and is likely going to be revoked.

Det. S. Poeschel was called in to work to investigate a sexual misconduct/grooming case involving an adult male and a juvenile female, with the assistance of Det. Lawrynck. All parties were interviewed, a search warrant was completed at the suspect's residence, the suspect was arrested and admitted to the offense and was jailed on a 4th degree sexual assault charge, grooming, and exposing genitals. The suspect was issued a \$100,000 cash bond for the offenses.

Patrol handled a case that was forwarded to a Detective, where a person was suspected of poisoning their ex-husband. Information was gathered, evidence was collected, along with video of the offense on two different days, and a search warrant was conducted on the suspect's residence. Evidence supporting the crime was collected at the suspect's residence, the suspect was arrested and is being held on a \$100,000 cash bond at the Portage County Jail.

Detective Brooks, Ofc. Marchel and Det. Lepinski completed background investigations on 3 potentially new police officers. Those investigations were turned over to command staff for their review and discussion.

Detective Brooks has spent much of his available time working on a case from outside our jurisdiction, investigating a matter for Waushara County. He is making progress, but the investigation is expected to be lengthy.

Detective S. Poeschel completed a 2-day jury trial in reference to a sexual assault investigation she completed. The jury quickly found the suspect guilty on all 3 charges.

Detective Gomez continues to investigate countless scams and frauds. He has also been tasked with assisting an outside agency with a theft investigation.

07-23-26 - Drug Detectives presented to Probation and Parole agents on current drug trends in our area.

07-25-26- Detectives Gomez and Lepinski were called in to take the lead on two different investigations. One was a possible scam where the suspect was supposed to meet with the victim but never showed, and the other was for a case where a male was found lying in the middle of the road with significant

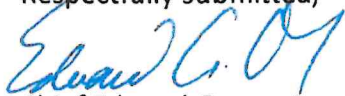
head trauma. The Detectives spent several hours interviewing and reviewing videos, ultimately concluding there was no criminal activity involved with the injuries and they were self-induced.

On 07/12/2026 at approximately 0031 hours I, Sergeant Jason Dienger, was requested to assist Deputy Schmoll on a traffic stop. I arrived on scene at approximately 0040 hours. Upon my arrival, Deputy Schmoll had the driver in custody. There was no other occupants of the vehicle.

K9 Coye and I were last certified on August 11th, 2025 by American Working Dog for; obedience, handler protection, building searches, tracking and field searches and for narcotic contraband detection in the following odors: Cocaine, Heroin, and Methamphetamine. This certification is valid for twelve months. Upon location of the odors of these narcotic contraband substances, K9 Coye's behavior will change. K9 Coye is trained to come to final canine response by sitting or lying or locking up and staring at the source odor. This is called a "passive" final canine response. This response may also indicate items recently contaminated with, or associated with, the odor of one or more of the narcotic contraband substances.

I directed K9 Coye to the rear driver side corner of the vehicle, and I commanded K9 Coye to sniff for the presence of any and all of the above listed narcotic contraband odors. I observed the following changes in K9 Coye's behavior; K9 Coye changed sniffing speed, sniffing pattern, and sniffing direction. I observed K9 Coye change his body axis, nose positioning, and ear set. K9 Coye slowed his pace down, stopped and went to a final passive response by sitting at the front passenger side door of the vehicle. K9 Coye was praised with a tennis ball. The vehicle and its contents were then searched.

Nothing of evidentiary value located. Interview of driver not able to be completed as driver was in custody.

Notes

On 07/30/2026 at approximately 0722 hours I, Sergeant Jason Dienger, was requested to assist Officer Sowa on a traffic stop. I arrived on scene at approximately 0727 hours. Upon my arrival, Officer Sowa was taking the driver into custody for a warrant. The passenger had been identified but we had not learned the driver's license status of the passenger yet.

K9 Coye and I were last certified on August 11th, 2025 by American Working Dog for; obedience, handler protection, building searches, tracking and field searches and for narcotic contraband detection in the following odors: Cocaine, Heroin, and Methamphetamine. This certification is valid for twelve months. Upon location of the odors of these narcotic contraband substances, K9 Coye's behavior will change. K9 Coye is trained to come to final canine response by sitting or lying or locking up and staring at the source odor. This is called a "passive" final canine response. This response may also indicate items recently contaminated with, or associated with, the odor of one or more of the narcotic contraband substances.

I directed K9 Coye to the front driver side corner of the vehicle, and I commanded K9 Coye to sniff for the presence of any and all of the above listed narcotic contraband odors. I observed the following changes in K9 Coye's behavior; K9 Coye changed sniffing speed, sniffing pattern, and sniffing direction. I observed K9 Coye change his body axis, nose positioning, and ear set. K9 Coye slowed his pace down, stopped and went to a final passive response by sitting at the driver side door of the vehicle. K9 Coye was praised with a tennis ball. The vehicle and its contents were then searched.

Search resulted in locating 4.54 grams of Methamphetamine and a pipe that had residue that tested positive for methamphetamine. Driver arrested for warrant and drug charges.
